Debra Herzog served as an Assistant United States Attorney from 1983 until 2000. While serving as an Assistant United States Attorney, Ms. Herzog held various supervisory positions within the Offices of the United States Attorney in St. Louis, Missouri and Fort Lauderdale, Florida, including Chief of the White Collar Crime/Public Corruption Section and Managing Assistant United States Attorney.

In 1998, Ms. Herzog served on the Department of Justice's Campaign Financing Task Force, investigating improprieties

in the 1996 election cycle. Ms. Herzog also conducted an investigation preliminary to the appointment of an Independent Counsel.

In 1999, she was detailed to the United States Customs Service (USCS) Office of Internal Affairs as Senior Advisor to the Assistant Commissioner. The following year, the USCS Commissioner appointed her to the position for a three-year term in the Senior Executive Service. Ms. Herzog was responsible for the supervision of criminal investigations conducted by over 120 agents in twenty offices throughout the country.

In 2004, Ms. Herzog was selected as the Deputy Assistant Inspector General for Investigations NASA Office of Inspector General (OIG). While at the NASA OIG she also served as the acting Assistant Inspector General for Investigations for six months. In her position as the Deputy Assistant Inspector General for Investigations she was responsible for the management and supervision of all employees of the NASA OIG Office of Investigations, as well as development and implementation of policy and procedure.

Ms. Herzog is currently a Senior Specialist in the Office of General Counsel, U.S. Postal Service OIG. She provides legal assistance to the Internal Affairs Division of the OIG Office of Investigations. This division is charged with the investigation of allegations of criminal and serious administrative misconduct of U.S. Postal Inspectors, Postal OIG employees and Postal Police Officers.

Ms. Herzog was also an Assistant Circuit (District) Attorney in St. Louis, Missouri for 2½ years after graduating from law school. She was an associate at the law firm of Armstrong, Teasdale LLP in St. Louis for a year before entering into federal service.

Ms. Herzog graduated cum laude from Washington University in St. Louis, Missouri in 1976 and received her juris doctor degree from the Washington University School of Law in 1979. She is licensed to practice law in Florida and Missouri.
