

INDIAN COUNTRY AND SORNA IMPLEMENTATION: Regional SORNA Technical Assistance Workshops

The Office of Sex Offender Sentencing, Monitoring, and Apprehending, Registering, and Tracking (SMART) invites you to attend one in a series of workshops designed to assist tribes with developing and completing their substantial implementation packets for SORNA. The workshops will be held regionally and are intended to address questions and concerns specific to the needs of Indian Country regarding the requirements for SORNA Substantial Implementation.

Representatives from the SMART Office, consultants with subject matter expertise, and staff from Fox Valley Technical College, Criminal Justice Center for Innovation will be available during each of the five regional workshops to lead discussion and facilitate working group sessions to enhance your strategic plan for SORNA Implementation.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

Representatives from each tribal SORNA registration jurisdiction are invited to attend. All individuals responsible for assisting the tribe in completing any portion of their substantial implementation packet are encouraged to attend one of the five workshops.

The workshop format will include brief overview presentations on each of the agenda topics; some sessions will be followed by working group sessions where tribes can have one-on-one and group assistance and discussion on topics of relevance to substantial implementation. Agenda items will include:
