# Get grad school assistance through the Paul D. Coverdell Fellows Program

Returned Peace Corps Volunteers can receive financial aid to pursue a master's degree or doctorate in a wide variety of subject areas at more than 70 universities through the Paul D. Coverdell Fellows Program. Returned Volunteers have lifetime eligibility for the program and may choose to participate immediately following service or any time thereafter.

Coverdell Fellows receive scholarships and stipends, and participate in professional internships in underserved American communities, where they are prepared for careers in a wide range of disciplines.

The Coverdell Fellows Program is an opportunity to combine academic and professional endeavors with a desire to work in underserved communities.

#### Benefits for Coverdell Fellows

#### Financial Assistance

Receive financial aid that may include tuition reduction, a full scholarship, or stipend.

#### **Professional Experience**

Apply what is learned in the classroom to a professional setting.

#### **Helping Others**

Provide much-needed assistance to underserved communities in the U.S.

# Federal Employment

Extend noncompetitive eligibility (NCE) status for federal employment (if applicable) for up to three years as a full-time student.

#### **Degree Programs**

- · International affairs, peace studies
- · Nursing, public health, social work
- Public policy, public administration, political science, urban planning
