NOTICE OF A COMMISSION DETERMINATION NOT TO REVIEW AN INITIAL DETERMINATION GRANTING, IN PART, COMPLAINANTS' MOTION FOR SUMMARY DETERMINATION THAT THE IMPORTATION ELEMENT UNDER SECTION 337(a)(1)(B) HAS BEEN SATISFIED

**SUMMARY**: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review an initial determination ("ID") (Order No. 60) of the presiding administrative law judge ("ALJ") granting complainants' motion for summary determination that the importation element under Section 337(a)(1)(B) has been satisfied as to respondents MVTech Software GmbH of Germany; MVTech LLC of Cambridge, Massachussets; Omron Corporation of Japan; Daiichi Jitsugyo Viswill Co., Ltd. of Japan; and Daiichi Jitsugyo (America), Inc. of Wood Dale, Illinois (collectively, "the subject respondents").

**SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION**: The Commission instituted this investigation on July 16, 2009, based on a complaint filed on May 28, 2009, by Cognex Corporation of Natick, Massachusetts and Cognex Technology & Investment Corporation of Mountain View, California (collectively "complainants"). 74 *Fed. Reg.* 34589-90 (July 16, 2009). The complaint, as amended, alleges violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. § 1337, in the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and the sale within the

United States after importation of certain machine vision software, machine vision systems, or products containing same by reason of infringement of certain claims of U.S. Patent Nos. 7,016,539 and 7,065,262. The complaint further alleges that an industry in the United States exists as required by subsection (a)(2) of section 337. The complaint names numerous respondents including the subject respondents and Resolution Technology, Inc. of Dublin, Ohio; Subtechnique, Inc. of Alexandria, Virginia; and Visics Corporation of Wellesley, Massachussets (collectively, "the RSV respondents").

On March 3, 2010, complainants moved for summary determination that the importation element under Section 337(a)(1)(B) has been satisfied as to the subject and RSV respondents.

The ALJ issued the subject ID on April 28, 2010, granting complainants' motion only as to the subject respondents. No party petitioned for review of the ID. The Commission has determined not to review the ID.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. § 1337, and in section 210.42(h) of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, 19 C.F.R. § 210.42(h).
