SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: This investigation was instituted on April 21, 2010, based upon a complaint filed by Verizon Communications Inc. of New York, New York and Verizon Services Corp. of Arlington, Virginia (collectively, "Verizon"). 75 *Fed. Reg.* 20861-2 (Apr. 21, 2010). The complaint, as amended, alleged violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. § 1337) in the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and the sale within the United States after importation of certain digital set-top boxes and components thereof that infringe certain claims of U.S. Patent Nos. 5,666,293; 5,635,979; 6,381,748; 6,367,078; and 7,561,214.
