SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Commission instituted this investigation on July 11, 2011, based on two complaints filed by OSRAM GmbH of Germany. 76 Fed. Reg. 40746-47. The complaints allege violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. § 1337, in the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and the sale within the United States after importation of certain light-emitting diodes and products containing same by reason of infringement of certain claims of the following patents: U.S. Patent No. 6,812,500; U.S. Patent No. 7,078,732; U.S. Patent No. 7,126,162; U.S. Patent No. 7,345,317; U.S. Patent No. 7,629,621; U.S. Patent No. 6,459,130; U.S. Patent No. 6,927,469; U.S. Patent No. 7,199,454; and U.S. Patent No. 7,427,806. The complaints further allege the existence of a domestic industry. The Commission's notice of investigation named the following respondents: Samsung Electronics Co., Ltd. and Samsung LED Co., Ltd. of Korea; Samsung Electronics America, Inc. of Ridgefield Park, New Jersey; Samsung LED America, Inc. of Atlanta, Georgia; LG Electronics, Inc. and LG Innotek Co., Ltd. of South Korea; LG Electronics

U.S.A., Inc. of Englewood Cliffs, New Jersey; and LG Innotek U.S.A., Inc. of San Diego, California.

On July 14, 2011, the ALJ issued the subject ID (Order No. 2) setting the target date for completion of the investigation as February 11, 2013, nineteen months from institution of the investigation. No party petitioned for review.

The Commission has determined not to review the subject ID.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. § 1337, and in section 210.42(h) of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, 19 C.F.R. § 210.42(h).
