SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review the administrative law judge's ("ALJ") (Judge Essex) initial determination ("ID") (Order No. 29) granting the joint motion to terminate the above-captioned investigation as to Fuzhou F&V Photographic Equipment Co., Ltd. ("F&V") and Shantou Nanguang Photographic Equipment Co., Ltd. ("Nanguang") based on entry of a consent order. The Commission has issued the subject consent order.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Commission instituted this investigation on September 7, 2011, based on a complaint filed by Litepanels, Inc. and Litepanels, Ltd. (collectively, "Litepanels"). 76 Fed. Reg. 55416 (Sept. 7, 2011). The complaint alleges violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930 as amended (19 U.S.C. § 1337) by reason of infringement of certain claims of U.S. Patent Nos. 7,429,117; 7,510,290; 7,318,652; 6,948,823;

and 7,972,022. Supplements to the complaint were filed on August 23 and 25, 2011. The notice of investigation named fourteen respondents including F&V of Fuzhou City, China and Nanguang of Shantou City, China.

On June 18, 2012, complainants Litepanels and respondents F&V and Nanguang filed a joint motion to partially terminate the investigation as to F&V and Nanguang based upon the entry of a consent order. The motion included a Consent Order Stipulation and proposed Consent Order. On June 28, 2012, the Commission investigative attorney filed a response in support of the motion provided that F&V and Nanguang submit a revised proposed Consent Order and Consent Order Stipulation. On July 9, 2012, F&V and Nanguang filed a revised Consent Order and Consent Order Stipulation. No other responses were filed.

On July 10, 2012, the ALJ issued the subject ID, granting the motion pursuant to section 210.21(c) of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 C.F.R. §210.21(c)(3)). No petitions for review were filed.

The Commission has determined not to review the ID.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. § 1337), and in section 210.42 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 C.F.R. § 210.42).
