**SUMMARY:** Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined to grant requests by the presiding administrative law judge (ALJ) for judicial enforcement of subpoenas in this investigation and has authorized its Office of the General Counsel to seek such enforcement.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Commission instituted this investigation on October 13, 2011, based on a complaint filed by Openwave Systems Inc. of Redwood City, California. 76 Fed. Reg. 63657-58 (Oct. 13, 2011). The complaint alleged violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended 19 U.S.C. § 1337, in the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and the sale within the United States after importation of certain devices for mobile data communication by reason of infringement of certain claims of United

States Patent Nos. 6,233,608; 6,289,212; 6,405,037; 6,430,409; and 6,625,447. The notice of investigation named Research In Motion Ltd. of Ontario, Canada; Research In Motion Corp. of Irving, Texas (collectively, "RIM"); and Apple Inc. of Cupertino, California as respondents.

On February 10, 2012, RIM moved to obtain judicial enforcement of subpoenas ad testificandum and subpoenas duces tecum ("subpoenas") issued on December 6, 2012, to non-parties Messrs. Alain Rossman, Bruce V. Schwartz, Lawrence K. Stein, and Andrew L. Laursen. The ALJ granted RIM's motions on February 23, 2012 in Order Nos. 18, 19, 20, and 21, and certified a request to the Commission for judicial enforcement of the subpoenas. The Commission has granted the ALJ's request and has authorized its Office of the General Counsel to seek judicial enforcement of the subpoenas.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, (19 U.S.C. § 1337), and Commission Rule of Practice and Procedure 210.32(g), 19 C.F.R. § 210.32(g).
