Call for Concept Notes - Open until 10 September 2012

- Institutions in developing countries (Universities, NGOs, think-tanks)
- Research grants between USD25k and USD\$75k
- Case studies examining the evolution of **on-going** open data initiatives in the South in key areas of development
- Proposed concept notes could include other activities that contribute to inform the open data initiative or specific policy reforms (e.g. technical assistance, policy dialogue)

Exploring the Impacts Of Open Data in the South



- Selected research projects will participate in activities inside a global research network
- The network will include mentorship from leading researchers in this emerging field and collaboration with other similar proposals in a range of issues
- Shortlisted projects to be announced in October and final decision in December
