

## CHANGE OF ADDRESS

# Political Committees

Treasurers of registered political committees automatically receive the <u>Record</u>. A change of address by a political committee (or any change to information disclosed on the Statement of Organization) must, by law, be made in writing on FEC Form 1 or by letter. The treasurer must sign the amendment and file it with the Secretary of the Senate, the Clerk of the House or the FEC (as appropriate) and with the appropriate state office.

# Other Subscribers

<u>Record</u> subscribers who are not registered political committees should include the following information when requesting a change of address:

o Subscription number (located on the upper left hand corner of the mailing label); o Name of the subscriber;

o Old address; and

o New address.

Subscribers (other than political committees) may correct their addresses by phone as well as by mail.
