1 Background

The current FY 2011 Continuing Resolution may expire without new budget authority, and while it is not anticipated that there will be a lapse in appropriations, the Department must be prepared for a potential lapse in funding that would necessitate a significant reduction in operations.

Prior to a potential lapse in funding, the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) requires the Department to submit a draft plan for agency operations in the absence of appropriations (a "shutdown plan"). The plan will likely be modified with additional guidance from the Office of Personnel Management and OMB, as the situation develops, and may be changed by the Department, as circumstances warrant.

This plan complies with the guidance provided by the Office of Management and Budget, the Department of Justice and the Department of Commerce.

All employees who are Presidentially Appointed, Senate Confirmed will remain on duty.

2 Authority

The Anti-Deficiency Act (The Act) restricts the conduct of business by agencies during a lapse of appropriations. The Act generally prohibits agency heads and their employees from:

- Making or authorizing expenditures or obligations in excess of appropriations;
- Making or authorizing expenditures or obligations of funds required to be sequestered under Section 252 of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985; and
- Accepting voluntary services for the United States or employing others to perform personal services in excess of that authorized by law, except in cases of emergency involving the safety of human life or the protection of property.

Certain functions may be continued even in the absence of an annual appropriations bill or continuing resolution. The principal guidance on the types of functions that may be continued during a lapse in appropriations is found in the Attorney General's opinion dated January 16, 1981, as updated by the Office of Legal Counsel in an August 16, 1995 Memorandum. Those opinions authorize continuation of agency functions which satisfy any of the following criteria (referred to "excepted" functions):

- Those that have a continuing source of funding;
- Those that are expressly authorized by Congress to continue even without funding;
- Those that are necessary to prevent an imminent and significant threat to the safety of human life or the protection of property;
- Those that are necessary for the discharge of the President's constitutional duties; and
- Activities necessary for a short period in order to ensure an orderly shutdown of operations.

Otherwise non-excepted personnel should report to work for a few hours on the first business day following a lapse in appropriations to perform short-term, administrative functions to prepare for an orderly transition (such as setting an out-of-office message, etc.).

3 OMB Circular No. A-11, Section 124.2 Requirements Met

This plan meets the requirements set out in OMB Circular Number A-11, Section 124.2. OMB Circular A-11 requires the following:

Agency heads must develop and maintain plans for an orderly shutdown in the event of the absence of appropriations. These plans must be submitted to OMB when they are either first prepared or revised. We have included these plans in detail for each of our bureaus. Additionally, we include the summary of excepted DOC employees by category as follows:

- Number of employees expected to be on-board before implementation of the plan: 46,761
- Total number of employees to be excepted under the plan: 16,742. This total number of employees is categorized as follows:
 - 1. They are engaged in military, law enforcement, or direct provision of health care activities: 258
 - 2. Their compensation is financed by a resource other than annual appropriations: 11,019
 - 3. Number of employees, not otherwise exempt, to be retained to protect life and property: 5,391
 - 4. Number of employees otherwise authorized by law: 74

Additionally, as per the requirements, we have submitted detailed bureau plans for any orderly shutdown activity that would take more than one half day. In total, DOC has 678 employees who would remain on duty for more than one half day but no more than three days in total to effect an orderly shutdown.

2.1.1.2 Employee Notification Procedures in Advance of a Shutdown

Required Offices

- Office of Chief Financial Officer and Assistant Secretary for Administration (CFO/ASA)
- Office of General Counsel (OGC)

Required Actions

- Issuance of Furlough Notices and
- Shutdown of operations.

Preparation:

- DOC bureaus and offices will send employee lists to OGC and OHRM to indicate the excepted employees and the reason for their excepted status.
- OGC and OHRM will compile the lists of employees assigned as Excepted or Non-Excepted and will confirm that Excepted status is appropriate for employees so designated.
- OHRM will draft furlough letter language and OGC will approve language.
- OHRM will distribute furlough letters to servicing HR offices (SHROs) for distribution along with processing instructions.

Notice Issuance:

• On the first business day following the lapse in appropriations, all employees will report to work.

- SHROs will establish a process to ensure non-excepted employees are properly notified (e.g., sign and date their notice of furlough letter to confirm receipt of notice or by other accepted method) and keep a record.
- Management will meet with employees within the employee's first hour of reporting to work to review the furlough process and issues notices. The supervisor will keep a record of employees notified.
- All managers will submit complete list of notified employees to SHRO for confirmation of completion.
- Employees will shut down their offices and must leave the workplace within four hours of their arrival on the effective date.

2.1.1.3 Contractor Notification Procedures in Advance of a Shutdown

The applicable Contracting Officer will issue Stop Work Orders on all contracts requiring work stoppages. For the excepted services performed under contract, assigned Contract Officer Technical Representatives (COTRs) will identify the portion of the contract covered by the exception and in collaboration with the Contracting Officer provide technical direction to the contractor for any required continued performance.

2.1.2 Reactivation of Functions

- Upon notification that employees may return to duty, the Department of Commerce hotline and main website will be updated and office phone lists will be activated.
- Employees will report back to work at their regularly scheduled time on the next scheduled work day.
- A return to duty notice will be issued shortly thereafter.

2.2.5 Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS)

BIS excepted personnel for national security operations during a funding lapse are defined to include the following:

- Export Enforcement: Personnel of the Office of the Assistant Secretary, Office of Enforcement Analysis, and Office of Anti-Boycott Compliance are not considered essential, with the exception of the Assistant Secretary and the Deputy Assistant Secretary. Personnel of the Office of Export Enforcement (OEE) are considered essential for national security operations. OEE special agents (all law enforcement-occupation code 1811), from the Director down, are essential to the ongoing conduct of criminal investigations, prosecutions, and other activities with DOD, DOJ, FBI, ICE, and other law enforcement and intelligence agencies in furtherance of our national security. The abrupt removal of OEE agents from participation in ongoing activities conducted by the Executive and Judicial Branches would jeopardize current criminal investigations (including undercover operations), prosecutions (including testimony in grand jury and trial proceedings), and other activities (including interdiction measures conducted both domestically and abroad by Special Agents).
- Export Administration: Proposing that certain minimal activities remain operational during a shutdown for national security reasons. These activities, serviced by engineers and technical staff, include: processing export licenses essential to protecting the national security of the United States; evaluating transactions involving U.S. controlled items to ensure they are exported in accordance with export control requirements; drafting amendments to the Export Administration Regulations to address emergency foreign policy issues that warrant changes to dual-use export control policies, including export control sanctions ordered by the President as part of the United States's response to ongoing and unanticipated international crisis such as the recent events in the Middle East; negotiating changes to international export control lists; hosting international inspectors pursuant to U.S. non-proliferation treaty obligations; and processing emergency priorities and allocation requests to ensure national security programs have access to necessary items.
- Leadership and Resource Support: Skeletal legal, systems, and support—for essential services such as Mainframe and Local Area Network support needed for emergency licensing and enforcement actions.

2.2.11.2 NOAA Excepted Positions

The following are the activities by organization that must continue during a lapse in appropriations. NOAA has made every effort to minimize the number of employees excepted (for reasons other than continuing source of funding and exempted by legislation) in supporting emergency operations that protect against a significant and imminent threat to the safety of human life and property. Given the critical nature of NOAA's research, science and operational missions to the protection of life and property as described below, NOAA believes the following levels of federal support of these missions are necessary. Detailed explanations are included in the table following this narrative.

Office of Oceanic and Atmospheric Research (80 employees) - employees required to maintain climate monitoring research to ensure continuity of crucial long-term historical climate records, and research to support ongoing weather and air quality prediction services; ongoing operations at several sites defined by the Department of Energy for support for safe operation at these sites; as well as NOAA's role in support of the United States' response and monitoring of the Japan tsunami and nuclear incident.

Environmental Satellite and Data Information Service (188 employees) – employees required to support secure command and control of NOAA and DOD operational environmental satellites and data/imagery. These activities include satellite tracking and control, ground systems, communications equipment, space-based alert systems, anomaly mitigation, data recovery, and critical incident response. These activities, operated on a 24-hour basis, ensure that critical satellite data for weather forecasts and events is not disrupted or degraded.

National Marine Fisheries Service (654 employees) – 313 employees are funded by other than annual appropriations. Of the remaining 341, 159 are law enforcement officers and the others are required to fulfill law enforcement activities to protect federal trust resources, including the protection of endangered species, critical habitat, and protected areas; fisheries management activities including quota monitoring and observer activities, and regulatory actions to prevent overfishing; and protection of Federal property, including aquaria, experimental cultures, facilities, and living marine resources (including endangered species).

Office of Marine and Aviation Operations (489 employees) – 315 are members of the NOAA corps and 16 are members of the US Health Service. These employees support observational data collection for ongoing weather forecasting and severe weather warnings, protection of national trust resources and protection of the fleet, as well as other activities across the agency required for protection of property. 38 others are funded by other than annual appropriations to support Deepwater Horizon. The other 120 employees are required to gather and support observational data for weather forecasting and severe weather warnings; and to protect the fleet.

National Ocean Service (250 employees) – 69 employees are funded by other than annual appropriations for Deepwater Horizon and other programs. The remaining 181 employees are required to protect against imminent and significant threats to life and property by supporting safe maritime commerce in U.S. waters, including real-time water level data for ships entering U.S. ports, critical nautical chart updates, and accurate position information. These activities also maintain Deepwater Horizon response activities that are essential for collecting critical and perishable data needed for damage assessment activities; as well as supporting harmful algal bloom forecasting, protecting living marine resources at national sanctuaries

and protecting key long-term research studies, the interruption of which would destroy the value of the Government data, and living marine animals; as well as NOAA's role in support of the United States' response and monitoring of the Japan tsunami and nuclear incident.

National Weather Service (4016 employees) – employees required to continue to provide the nation with weather, water, and air quality forecasts and warnings to imminent threats to protect life and property; as well as NOAA's role in support of the United States' response and monitoring of the Japan tsunami and nuclear incident.

All Other (32 employees) – employees required to provide support and protection of other excepted employees.

2.2.15.2 USPTO Excepted Positions

The USPTO has sufficient funds from other than FY11 appropriations to continue full operations for six days. Therefore, all 10,363 employees of the USPTO will be excepted for up to six days following a lapse in appropriations. After this six day period, the USPTO will execute the plan as described below.

The excepted employees will ensure the functionality of processes and systems minimally necessary for the preservation of patent rights, to allow compliance with statutory provisions that cannot be waived, and avoid disclosures of information that would be detrimental to the national security. Additionally, the excepted employees will ensure the functionality of processes and systems minimally necessary to preserve trademark rights. Preventing the public from accessing the USPTO's electronic filing and payments systems may result in the complete or partial loss of intellectual property. Therefore, in order to prevent the loss of valuable intellectual property, these systems should remain open during any closure of the USPTO.
