1-CDC Study on Smoke-Free Multi-Unit Housing Policies, by Carol Kawecki, Study Project Manager, Healthy Housing Solutions, Inc. -- The CDC Study on Smoke-Free Multi-Unit Housing Policies is a 3-year project conducted in Los Angeles County, Maine, Minnesota and Florida. The purpose of the project is to: (a) study the adoption and implementation of voluntary and regulatory smoke-free policies in market-based (non-financed) and subsidized (publicly-financed) multi-unit housing, to understand how best to implement smoke-free policies to protect MUH residents from the adverse effects of secondhand smoke; and (b) assess the health benefits of smoke-free multi-unit housing policies in communities with a mix of regulatory and voluntary policies (30-40 minutes; followed by Q&A).
