Foreign Trade Division

The **Foreign Trade Division** is the *official* source for U.S. export and import statistics and is responsible for issuing regulations governing the reporting of all export shipments from the United States.





What are Trade Statistics?

* Exports

 Measure of goods grown, produced, or manufactured in the U.S. that are shipped to other countries.

* Imports

Measure the arrival of goods into the U.S. from other countries

Balance of Trade

Exports – Imports = Balance of Trade

Product Classification Systems

- North American Industry Classification System (NAICS)
- Standard International Trade Classification System (SITC)
- End-Use
- Advanced Technology Products (ATP)
- Harmonized System (HS)
 - Exports: Schedule B
 - Imports: Harmonized Tariff Schedule (HTS)
