COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

COMMISSION VOTES TO END SELECTIVE DISCLOSURE; CHAIRMAN LEVITT HAILS LEVELING OF INFORMATION PLAYING FIELD

On August 10, the Commission approved a new rule that would end the practice of selective disclosure, whereby officials of public companies provide important information to Wall Street insiders prior to making the information available to the general public. The Commission also approved two new rules to clarify existing insider trading law.

SEC Chairman Arthur Levitt said, "High quality and timely information is the lifeblood of strong, vibrant markets. It is at the very core of investor confidence. Regulation FD will bring all investors, regardless of the size of their holdings, into the information loop -- where they belong."

Chairman Levitt said that the Commission received more than 6,000 comment letters from the public and that most were from individual investors concerned about fairness in the markets. The final rule reflects issues raised during the comment process. The changes are detailed on the attached fact sheet.

ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

JAMES COGLEY BARRED FROM ASSOCIATION WITH ANY BROKER, DEALER OR INVESTMENT ADVISER

On August 10, an Order Instituting Proceedings, Making Findings and Imposing Remedial Sanctions (Order) was entered, by consent, against James Michael Cogley

(Cogley) barring him from association with any broker, dealer or investment adviser. Cogley neither admitted nor denied the findings of this Order, except as to the entry of an Order of Permanent Injunction entered against him and The Ohio Estate Group (OEG) on November 29, 1999 in SEC v. James Michael Cogley and The Ohio Estate Group, Civil Action File No. C2-98-802, (S.D. OH). Cogley consented to the entry of the permanent injunction, without admitting or denying the allegations of the complaint. The bar order against Cogley is based on the injunction against him.

The complaint alleged that, from in or about August 1997 through in or about August 1998, Cogley used OEG as a vehicle to defraud 44 investors through the offer and sale of \$2.4 million in real estate promissory notes and the operation of a Ponzi scheme. These securities were not registered with the Commission. Throughout this time period, the complaint alleged that Cogley, in connection with the offer and sale of these promissory notes, made numerous misrepresentations and omitted to state material facts regarding, among other things: the safety and return of investments, the true use of proceeds, that the promissory notes were FDIC insured, that Cogley had filed for personal bankruptcy in 1990, that the State of Ohio, Division of Securities, issued a cease and desist Order against him for soliciting and selling unregistered securities, and that both he and OEG had negative net worths. In addition, the complaint alleged that Cogley acted as an unregistered broker or dealer. (Rel. 34-43135; IA-1892; File No. 3-10267)

ORDER INSTITUTING PUBLIC PROCEEDINGS, MAKING FINDINGS, AND IMPOSING REMEDIAL SANCTION ENTERED AGAINST BRIAN O'CONNOR

The Commission announced that on August 10 it instituted and settled administrative proceedings against Brian W. O'Connor, recently of Forest Hills, New York. O'Connor, the former principal of Brian W. O'Connor & Co., Inc. (BWOC), an investment adviser formerly registered with the Commission, consented, without admitting or denying the Commission's findings, to an order barring him from association with any investment adviser. The action was based on O'Connor's previous conviction for defrauding an advisory client and the client's bank.

The Commission found that on September 15, 1999, based on a plea of guilty by O'Connor, O'Connor was convicted in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of New York of one count of bank fraud and two counts of mail fraud. The indictment underlying the conviction charged, among other things, that, at various times between April 1997 and February 1998, while acting as an investment adviser, O'Connor, through unauthorized and forged letters purportedly from an advisory client, defrauded the client and the client's bank by ordering the bank to transfer funds from the client's bank account into BWOC's bank account. The misappropriations occurred while O'Connor was president and sole owner of BWOC, then an investment adviser registered with the Commission. O'Connor was sentenced to twenty-one months in prison and four years of supervised release. (Rel. IA-1893; File No. 3-10269)

ORDER INSTITUTING PUBLIC PROCEEDINGS, MAKING FINDINGS, AND ISSUING CEASE AND DESIST ORDER AGAINST F. XAVIER SAAVEDRA

The Commission announced that on August 10 it instituted and settled proceedings against F. Xavier Saavedra, of Islip, New York. Saavedra, the former executive vice president of Brian W. O'Connor & Co., Inc. (BWOC), an investment adviser formerly registered with the Commission, is now the president of Centurion Asset Management, an unregistered investment adviser located in New York, New York that succeeded to BWOC's business in 1998. Saavedra consented, without admitting or denying the Commission's findings, to an order making findings, requiring Saavedra to send the order to clients for a period of one year, and issuing a cease-and-desist order preventing Saavedra from committing or causing violations of certain antifraud and books and records provisions of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940 (Advisers Act) (specifically, Sections 204, 206(1) and 206(2) of the Advisers Act and Rule 204-2(a)(12) thereunder).

The Commission found that Saavedra, while an officer of BWOC, was a cause of certain antifraud violations by BWOC that BWOC committed through the actions of its president and principal, Brian W. O'Connor. From January 1997 through June 1998, O'Connor misappropriated funds from the accounts of two advisory clients and covered up the misappropriations with false account documents. On one occasion, Saavedra sent a false account statement to the representative of one of the two defrauded clients. This false account statement concealed previous misappropriations and enabled O'Connor to take additional client funds. Saavedra knew or should have known that the account information that he sent out was false. Saavedra was also a cause of a violation of the Advisers Act by BWOC arising from its maintenance of the false account statement as a record required by the Advisers Act. (Rel. COMMISSION SEEKS TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER AND ASSET FREEZE ENTERED AGAINST ELFINDEPAN, S.A. AND THREE OTHERS

On August 10, the Commission filed a fraud case in the United States District Court for the Middle District of North Carolina against Elfindopan, S.A., Southern Financial Group, Tracy Calvin Dunlap, Jr. and Barry Lowe (SEC V. ELFINDEPAN, S.A., SOUTHERN FINANCIAL GROUP, TRACY CALVIN DUNLAP, JR. AND BARRY LOWE, 1:00CV00742, August 10, 2000). The Commission's complaint alleges that from as early as March 1999 to the present, the defendants defrauded investors nationwide in an apparent Ponzi or pyramid scheme in connection with the unregistered offer and sale of the securities of Elfindopan, a supposed Costa Rican financial company with offices in Greensboro, North Carolina. Defendants allegedly raised at least \$13.5 million from the investing public in at least nine states. The Commission seeks a temporary restraining order that, among other things, would freeze the assets of defendants, including \$2.7 million in a South Carolina bank account and prohibit defendants from accepting or depositing additional funds from investors. The Commission also seeks to temporarily restrain defendants from violations of the antifraud and registration provisions of the federal securities laws.

The complaint alleges that in connection with these offerings, defendants knowingly and recklessly made, and caused others to make, numerous materially false and misleading statements to investors. Among other things, defendants promised investors highly favorable returns on investments (as much as 40-50% per month), without any reasonable basis for such claims, and falsely stated that the investments were secure, including false claims that Elfindepan investments were associated with the International Monetary Fund and the World Bank. Investors were told that Elfindepan had been in business for 23 years, when in fact the company was less than a year and a half old.

The complaint also alleges that defendants knowingly or recklessly failed to disclose certain material facts to investors regarding Elfindepan. Defendants have omitted to disclose that funds are in fact being disbursed inconsistent with Elfindepan's supposed business purpose. Investors have not been told that proceeds from later investors are being used to pay early investors and distributors, in classic Ponzi or pyramid scheme fashion. Investors have not been told that Dunlap has complete control of Elfindepan's finances, and has paid substantial amounts of investor money to his family members, and to support his personal living expenses. While defendants claim Elfindepan provides loans to businesses and individuals, and engages in factoring for companies with large receivables and cashflow problems, defendants failed to disclose any of the risks inherent in such activities and therefore in investing in Elfindepan. Defendants have failed to provide investors any detailed information about Elfindepan and its business, including any financial information.

The complaint further alleges that the defendants have publicly solicited investors through a website posted on the internet, through organized investor meetings, and through personal contacts by individuals acting as agents or "distributors" of Elfindepan. Investors were solicited and encouraged to invest moneys from their IRA and other retirement accounts. Defendants Southern Financial and Lowe, of Greensboro, North Carolina, and Dunlap facilitated these transfers, and failed to disclose to investors that monies were not held in IRA custodial accounts. EMERGENCY ACTION FILED AGAINST SIX DEFENDANTS IN A \$29 MILLION PONZI

On August 10, Judge Tinder of the United States District Court for the Southern District of Indiana entered a temporary restraining order against Defendants JMS Investment Group, LLC, Heartland Financial Services, Inc., Kenneth Payne, Johann Smith, Daniel Danker and Constance Brooks-Kiefer for defrauding 330 investors, many of whom were elderly, out of \$29.1 million. (SEC v. Kenneth Payne, et al., Case NO. IP00-1265C). The complaint alleged that from at least March 1999 to the present, the defendants offered and sold initial public offerings of financial institutions and Internet and technology companies, represented by a unit of JMS. In addition, the defendants sold shares of a bank located in Belize. The complaint further alleged that the defendants held Heartland out to the public as a brokerage firm and accepted money to purchase unit investment trusts, mutual funds and money markets. In reality, of the \$29.1 million

raised from investors, less than \$2 million was used for legitimate investment purposes, while \$2.2 million was paid to the defendants, \$1.3 million was withdrawn in cash, nearly \$1 million was used for travel and entertainment expenses and \$15 million was used to repay investors in the Ponzi scheme.

The Court granted the Commission's emergency motion and temporarily enjoined all of the defendants from violations of the antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws; temporarily enjoined Defendants JMS, Smith, Payne and Danker from violations of the registration provisions of the Securities Act; and Defendants Heartland, JMS, Smith, Payne and Danker from violations or aiding and abetting violations of the broker-dealer registration and antifraud provisions. Finally, the Court entered orders freezing the assets of all of the defendants and prohibiting the destruction of documents. [SEC v. Kenneth R. Payne, et al., SD IN, No. IP00-1265C] (LR-16650)
