COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTION

TWELVE ENJOINED IN SALES OF INTERMOUNTAIN CHEMICAL SECURITIES. The SEC Denver Regional Office announced that on November 30, 1971, a Federal court in Salt Lake City enjoined the following from violating one or other of the registration and antifraud provisions of the Federal securities laws in the offer and sale of securities of International Chemical Development Corporation (ICDC), and the reporting provisions of Section 13(a) and 16(a) of the Exchange Act: ICDC, Nevada Corporation, Intermountain Rule Associates, a Utah non-profit corporation, Richard T. Cardall, Joseph A. Holman, James G. Macy, John A. Syphers, and John D. Smith, all of Salt Lake City, Ray L. Pruett of Topele, Utah, William L. Allen of Ogden, Utah, and Frank Lloyd Parks of West Babylon, N. Y. An order was also issued ordering ICDC and its controlling persons to correct and file the required reports to bring current a materially false and misleading trading registration filed with the SEC under the provisions of Section 12 of the Exchange Act and to file reports setting forth the required disclosure of trading in its stock by corporate insiders. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

COLUMBIA GAS SYSTEM. The Commission issued an order granting a post-effective amendment on behalf of Columbia Gas System, Inc., of Wilmington and its subsidiary companies involving intra-system financing, including the issue and sale of installment promissory notes by Columbia Gas of Maryland, Inc., and Columbia Gulf Transmission and the acquisition thereof by Columbia System. It is now proposed that said installment notes of Columbia of Maryland be increased from \$375,000 to \$775,000 and those of Columbia Gulf from \$15,500,000 to \$45,500,000; Columbia of Maryland requires the additional funds to complete its construction program and Columbia Gulf requires additional funds in order to construct the Blue Water pipeline, an offshore Louisiana project. SEC APPROVES NEW ENGLAND ELECTRIC SYSTEM PLAN. The Commission issued an order reciting that transactions, exchanges, sales and investments proposed in a Plan filed by New England Electric System, and its subsidiary, Massachusetts Gas System are necessary or appropriate to effectuate the provisions of Section 11(b)(1) of the Public Utility Holding Company Act, in accordance with the requirements of Sections 1081 through 1083 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended. The Plan proposes the sale, for cash, of the capital stocks of four subsidiary companies: Northampton Gas Light Company, 24,233 shares; Central Massachusetts Gas Company, 54,299 shares; Norwood Gas Company, 4,215 shares; and Wachusett Gas Company, 13,290 shares.

Mass. Gas will transfer to New England the capital stocks of the four subsidiaries and New England will effect the transfer and sale to the purchasers. The capital stock of Northampton will be sold for \$1,867,000 in cash to Springfield Gas Co, a nonassociate gas utility company, and the stocks of the three other companies will be sold for \$5,708,125 in cash to Eastern Gas & Fuel Associates, a nonassociate exempt holding company. New England will invest the proceeds of sale in one or more of their electric utility subsidiary companies as a contribution to capital pursuant to later filings under the Act. (Rel. 35-17419)

COLUMBIA GAS SYSTEM. The Commission issued an order authorizing open account advances by The Columbia Gas System, Inc., of Wilmington, to certain subsidiary companies in connection with intrasystem prepayment of promissory notes and proposed intrasystem issuance and acquisition of promissory notes. The notes prepaid will not exceed an aggregate of \$195,500,000 for all subsidiary companies and as any of such companies require funds for construction and other corporate purposes after prepayment, it is proposed that advances be made to them on open account by Columbia, provided that at no time will the amount of such advances to any subsidiary exceed the amount of indebtedness theretofore prepaid by it, less any current maturities applicable to prepaid notes which would have matured subsequent to the date of prepayment. SECURITIES ACT REGISTRATIONS

DIGI-LOG SYSTEMS, INC., 666 Davisville Rd., Willow Grove, Pa. 19090, filed a registration statement on December 28 seeking registration of 200,000 shares of common stock, to be offered for public sale (* at \$6 per share maximum) through underwriters headed by J. S. Love & Co., Inc., 80 Broad St., New York, N. Y. 10004. The company is primarily engaged in the design, manufacture and marketing of an electronic unit that transforms a standard television set into a computer terminal. The company designs, manufactures and sells marine sonar equipment and industrial ultrasonic level measuring devices and equipment. Net proceeds of its stock sale will be used to retire bank, equipment and other loams and for working capital and other corporate purposes. (File 2-42699)

Wolk and Company, 605 Third Avenue, New York, N.Y. 10016. The company was organized in October 1970 for the development, manufacture and marketing of commercial refrigeration equipment used on vessels. Of the net proceeds of the sale of the units, \$177,000 will be used as working capital, and the balance for specified corporate purposes. (File 2-42687)

The company is engaged in the remanufacture and sale of replacement automotive parts, which it rebuilds by assembly line methods. DELISTING GRANTED. The SEC has issued an order under the Securities Exchange Act granting an application of the Midwest Stock Exchange to strike from listing and registration the common stock of Amsted Industries, Inc., effective at the opening of business on January 3, 1972. The delisting was requested because of inactivity on the Exchange, no shares having traded since July 9, 1965. The company concurs with the application; the stock remains listed on the New York Stock Exchange. (Rel. 34-9440)
