NEW RULES AND RULE PROPOSALS

WITHDRAWAL OF PROPOSED RULES UNDER INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT. The SEC today announced the withdrawal of its proposal to adopt Rules 12d-2, 17f-3 (a different proposed Rule 17f-3 on the subject of petty cash accounts proposed December 6, 1971 (Rel. IC-6862) is not withdrawn), 26a-2, 27c-2 and the proposed amendment of Rule 0-1(e) (Rel. IC-6039). The reasons for such withdrawal are: (1) the Investment Company Amendments Act of 1970 made unnecessary Rule 12d-2 exempting certain insurance company separate accounts for variable amunities from a requirement that they be administered under trust indentures, (2) proposed Rule 17f-3, concerning custody of assets would individual applications for exemption, (3) the Commission's staff is studying levels of administrative charges of variable amunity separate accounts with which proposed Rule 26a-2 and 27c-2 are in part concerned, and (4) the amendment to definitional Rule 0-1(e) is not necessary if the other rules are not adopted (Rel. IC-6949)

COURT ENORCEMENT ACTIONS

BERTRAM LAZAR SENTENCED. The SEC Washington Regional Office announced January 13 that the Federal court in Pennsylvania had sentenced Bertram Lazar of Philadelphia, Pa. to two years imprisonment on the three counts of a 17-count indictment charging him with violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the Federal securities laws. Lazar was also placed on four years probation on three counts and received suspended sentence on the remaining counts on condition that he make restitution to all the people from whom he embezzled money and that he file with the U. S. Attorney's Office a schedule of repayment. On October 22, 1971, Lazar pleaded guilty to 13 counts of an indictment which involved the sale of bogus promissory notes purportedly issued by Blair & Co., Inc. and Fahnestock & Co. (IR-5284)

SIPC SEEKS TRUSTEE FOR ALAN F. HUGHES, INC. The SEC New York Regional Office announced on January 12 that the Securities Investor Protection Corp. has filed with the Federal court in Albamy, N. Y., to have a trustee appointed for the assets of Alan F. Hughes, Inc., a Schenectady, New York broker-dealer. SIPC's application alleges that Hughes, Inc., is in danger of failing to meet its obligations to its customers and that the customers are in need of the protection provided under the Securities Investors Protection Act. A court order was signed to show cause why a trustee should not be appointed. (LR-5286)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

BARON FUND. The SEC has issued an order declaring that Baron Fund, Inc., North Bergen, N. J., has ceased to be an investment company as defined in the Act. (Rel. IC-6943)

ISI INSTITUTIONAL FUNDS. The SEC has issued an order declaring that ISI Institutional Fund A, Inc., and ISI Institutional Fund B, Inc., have ceased to be investment companies as defined in the Act. (Rel. IC-6945)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

ARKANSAS-MISSOURI POWER. The SEC has issued an order authorizing Arkansas-Missouri Power Company, Blytheville, Ark. subsidiary of Middle South Utilities, Inc., to issue and sell up to \$4,100,000 of unsecured short-term promissory notes to Middle South. Net proceeds will be applied to the company's 1972 construction program estimated at \$5,573,000. (Rel. 35-17430)

WEST PENN POWER COMPANY. The SEC has issued a notice giving interested persons until February 15 to request a hearing upon an application of West Penn Power Company, <u>Greensburg</u>, <u>Pa</u>. subsidiary of Allegheny Power Systems, Inc., to issue and sell from time to time up to \$56 million of short-term notes to banks and dealers in commercial paper. Net proceeds of its financing will be used in connection with its construction program and for other corporate purposes. Construction expenditures are estimated at \$227,302,000 for the period 1972-1974. (Rel. 35-17431)

SECURITIES ACT REGISTRATIONS

DANIEL INTERNATIONAL CORPORATION, Daniel Bldg., Greenville, S. C. 29602, filed a registration statement on January 13 seeking registration of 534,451 outstanding shares of common stock, to be offered for public sale by the holders thereof. The offering is to be made (*at \$30 per share maximum) through underwriters headed by Equitable Securities, Morton & Co. Inc., 65 Broadway, and Paine, Webber, Jackson & Curtis, Inc., 140 Broadway, both of New York. The company is primarily a general building contractor engaged in industrial and utility, commercial and institutional construction. (File 2-42841)

JOHN ALLMAND BOATS, INC., 6969 W. 20th Ave., <u>Hisleah, Fla.</u> 33013, filed a registration statement on January 14 seeking registration of 90,000 shares of common stock, to be offered for public sale at \$9 per share through INT Investors, Inc., 42 Broadway, New York 10004. The company is engaged in designing, developing, manufacturing and selling power fiber glass boats ranging from 19 to 34 feet. Of the net proceeds of its stock sale, \$300,000 will be used in connection with the manufacture of larger yachts and the balance for working capital and other corporate purposes. (File 2-42848)

FIRST AMERICAN NATIONAL CORPORATION.

326 Union St., Nashville, Tenn. 37237, filed a registration statement on January 14 seeking registration of 178,467 shares of common stock. It is proposed to offer these shares in exchange for all of the outstanding shares of common stock of Union-Peoples Bank, Clinton, Tenn., and Farmers Exchange Bank, Union City, Tenn., at the rate of 4.537 shares for each Union-Peoples share and 1.52 shares for each Farmers Exchange share. The company is a bank holding company, owning all the outstanding common stock of First American National Bank of Nashville. (File 2-42849)

GENERAL TELEPHONE COMPANY OF WISCONSIN, 18 S. Thornton Ave., Madison, Wis. 53701, filed a registration statement on January 14 seeking registration of \$25 million of first mortgage bonds, due 2002, to be offered for public sale at competitive bidding. A subsidiary of General Telephone & Electronics Corp., the company will apply the net proceeds of its bond sale, together with the proceeds of the future sale of 200,000 shares of common stock at \$100 per share, toward the payment of short-term loans owing to banks and GTE and commercial paper (estimated not to exceed \$56 million at the time of application), obtained for the purpose of financing the company's construction program. PENNZOIL LOUISIANA AND TEXAS OFFSHORE, INC., and PENNZOIL UNITED, INC., both of 900 Southwest Tower, Housten, Tex. 77002, filed a registration statement on January 14 seeking registration of Pennzoil Louisiana securities, as follows: \$130 million of convertible subordinated debentures, due 1979, and 5,200,000 shares of Class B common stock, to be offered for public sale in units, each consisting of a \$1,000 debenture and 40 Class B shares. The offering is to be made (*at \$1,000 per unit maximum) through underwriters headed by White, Weld & Co., 20 Broad St., New York 10005, and Lehman Brothers Inc., One William St., New York. Pennzoil Louisiana was newly formed by Pennzoil United to participate with Pennzoil Offshore Gas Operators, Inc. (POGO), a partially owned subsidiary of Pennzoil United, in the competitive biddings for Federal oil and gas leases on acreage in the Gulf of Mexico in 1972 and to explose for natural gas and oil. Pennzoil will possess, directly and through POGO, more than 80% of the combined voting power of Pennzoil Louisiana's stock. Net proceeds of its financing, together with \$56,333,332 to be received from the sale of an aggregate of 28,166,666 of Class A common shares to Pennzoil United and Pogo, will be available for acquisition of oil and gas leases and related activities. CHRIS-CRAFT INDUSTRIES, INC., 600 Madison Ave., New York 10022, filed a registration statement on January 14 seeking registration of 575,000 shares of common stock, issuable pursuant to warrants being issued in settlement of litigation which arose out of the 1968 merger of Chris-Craft and Baldwin-Montrose Chemical Company, Inc. (File 2-42853)

APPALACHIAN POWER COMPANY, 40 Franklin Rd., Roanoke, Va. 24009, filed a registration statement on January 14 seeking registration of \$50 million of first mortgage bonds and 250,000 shares of cumulative preferred stock (\$100 par), to be offered for public sale at competitive bidding. A subsidiary of American Electric Power Company, Inc., the company will use the net proceeds of its securities sales, together with other funds, including a cash capital contribution of \$3 million from AEP, to pay, as it matures, unsecured short-term indebtedness outstanding on the date of the securities males; in connection with its construction program; for working capital and other corporate purposes. Construction expenditures are estimated at \$103,487,000 for 1972. (File 2-42854)
