NOTICE OF COMMISSION MEETINGS

Following is a schedule of Commission meetings which will be conducted under provisions of the Government in the Sunshine Act. OPEN MEETING - THURSDAY, JULY 14, 1988 - 10:00 a.m.

The subject matter of the July 14 open meeting will be:

(1) Consideration of whether to adopt amendments to Rule 204-2, the recordkeeping rule under the Investment Advisers Act of 1940. The amendments would require advisers to retain, for Commission inspection, all of their advertisements and supporting records for performance information in their advertisements. Advertisements and supporting records would be required to be kept for five years from the end of the fiscal year in which the advertisement was last published. (2) Consideration of whether to propose for public comment Forms N-17f-1 and N-17f-2 under the Investment Company Act of 1940 and Form ADV-3 under the Investment Advisers Act of 1940. The forms would serve as cover sheets for accountant examination certificates which are currently required to be filed with the Commission. The forms are designed to facilitate the proper filing of examination certificates and, thus, increase the accessibility of such information to both investors and the Commission's staff. RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

RULE 19c-4 ADOPTED

The Commission adopted Rule 19c-4 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, which has the effect of amending the rules of national securities exchanges and national securities associations regarding listing and authorization requirements concerning shareholder voting rights. Rule 19c-4 amends exchange and association rules to prohibit the common stock or other equity securities of a company from being or remaining listed on an exchange or from being or remaining authorized for quotation and/or transaction reporting through an automated inter-dealer quotation system operated by

an association (such as the National Association of Securities Dealers Automated Quotation [NASDAQ] System), if such company issues securities or takes other corporate action that would have the effect of nullifying, restricting, or disparately reducing the per share voting rights of existing common stock shareholders of the company. COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

SEC RELEASES PROPOSED LEGISLATION ON MARGIN REGULATION

The Securities and Exchange Commission today released a legislative proposal for regulation of margins on nonexempted securities and on stock index futures and options in those futures. The proposal gives margin-setting authority to the exchanges, "prudential" oversight authority to the Securities and Exchange Commission and the Commodity Futures Trading Commission, and residual authority to the Federal Reserve Board. "Prudential" margin is margin that is sufficient to protect securities and commodities firms and clearing corporations from margin defaults.

David S. Ruder, Chairman of the Securities and Exchange Commission, said, "I am pleased to note that, consistent with concerns of the Commission, the level of futures market equity index margins has been raised from approximately 5% to approximately 15% since October of 1987. With the higher futures margin levels now in place and with legislative proposals regarding a regulatory system for setting margins now transmitted to Congress, the Commission will in the future be concentrating on measures other than margin increases in its continuing efforts to meet problems raised by the October 1987 market break." ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

DECISION BARRING RUSSELL ANTHONY PHIPPS FINAL

The decision of an administrative law judge barring Russell Anthony Phipps, of Boron, California, from association with any broker or dealer has become final. Phipps was formerly a registered representative with two brokerage firms. According to the law judge's decision, in 1986 Phipps pled guilty and was convicted of securities and mail fraud. Over a period of about four years, he swindled clients who sought his investment services by misappropriating the money that he falsely claimed he was investing for them. He lulled clients' suspicions by, among other things, falsely stating that the money had been invested, and by delivering false account statements. (Rel. 34-25878)

DECISION BARRING CHARLES W. STREICHER FINAL

The decision of an administrative law judge barring Charles W. Streicher, of Montgomery, Alabama, from association with any broker or dealer has become final. Streicher was a vice president of E.S.M. Group, Inc., and a securities salesman for its subsidiary, E.S.M. Government Securities, Inc. According to the law judge's decision, in 1986 Streicher pled guilty and was convicted in three separate criminal actions of mail fraud, wire fraud, conspiracy, and grand theft, all arising from his activities at E.S.M. He was also permanently enjoined from further violations of antifraud provisions. (Rel. 34-25879)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

DEFAULT JUDGMENT AND PERMANENT INJUNCTION ENTERED AGAINST FINTECH, INC.

The Denver Regional Office announced that on June 23 the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia entered a Default Judgment and Permanent Injunction against Fintech, Inc. of Salt Lake City, Utah. The Judgment restrains and enjoins Fintech from failing to file timely periodic reports and Notifications of Late Filing, and requires it to file certain delinquent reports.

In its September 22, 1987 Complaint, the Commission alleged that Fintech, among other things, failed to file its Annual Reports on Form 10-K for its fiscal years ended September 30, 1985 and September 30, 1986 and its Quarterly Reports on Form 10-Q for its fiscal quarters ended March 31, 1986, June 30, 1986, December 31, 1986, March 31, 1987, and June 30, 1987. (SEC v. Fintech, Inc., USDC DC, Civil Action No. 87-2601 GAG). (LR-11788)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

J. THOMAS DOSTON INDICTED

The U.S. Attorney for the Northern District of Georgia and the Atlanta Regional Office announced that on June 28 J. Thomas Dotson, of Marietta, Georgia, was indicted on six counts of securities fraud and five counts of mail fraud.

The indictment alleges, among other things, that Dotson falsely represented to investors that: (1) investor funds would be used for brokers' sales commissions, organizational expenses which include legal, accounting, printing, and filing costs, fixed research and development fees, and the maintenance of a working capital fund; and (2) Dotson, the general partner of both Wesley I and Wesley II, would not receive any compensation from the partnerships except his specified share of partnership profits and distribution. The indictment further alleges that, as a further part of the scheme, Dotson failed to disclose to investors that he, as general partner, would and did commingle funds from the Wesley I and II offerings, and that he would and did take for his personal use \$354,957 of the investors' funds.

If convicted, Dotson faces a maximum jail term of 55 years, a \$500,000 fine, plus restitution of \$354,957. (U.S. v. J. Anthony Dotson, USDC NDGA, CR 88-298-A). (LR-11787)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

ALLIED CAPITAL CORPORATION

An order has been issued on an application filed by Allied Capital Corporation, a registered closed-end, investment company, and certain of its affiliates supplementing a previous Commission order [Rel. IC-15013, March 25, 1986] and conditionally permitting the affiliates to coinvest with Allied and its subsidiaries in joint transactions. (Rel. IC-16468 - July 5)

NATIONAL SECURITIES NEW YORK TAX EXEMPT BOND FUND

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 28 to request a hearing on an application filed by National Securities New York Tax Exempt Bond Fund for an order declaring that it has ceased to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-16469 - July 5)

PILGRIM ADJUSTABLE RATE FUND

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until July 28 to request a hearing on an application filed by Pilgrim Adjustable Rate Fund, et al. (Applicants) for an order exempting them from the provisions of Section 32(a)(1) of the Investment Company Act to permit Applicants to file financial statements signed or certified by an independent public accountant selected at a board of directors/trustees meeting held within 90 days before or after the beginning of such Applicant's fiscal year. NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

Proposed rule changes have been filed under Rule 19b-4 by: The Midwest Clearing Corporation (SR-MCC-88-2) to terminate its "demand street request" withdrawal service. (Rel. 34-25884); and The Options Clearing Corporation (SR-OCC-88-4) to authorize it to issue, clear, and settle yield-based options on U.S. Treasury securities. (Rel. 34-25885)

Publication of the proposals are expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of July 5.

EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Depository Trust Company filed a proposed rule change which became effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The proposal (SR-DTC-88-7) provides procedures that will help implement a receiver's authorized delivery function as part of DTC's Same-Day Funds Settlement Service. (Rel. 34-25886)
