COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

SEC TRANSFERS MANAGEMENT RESPONSIBILITY FOR PUBLIC REFERENCE ROOM

Effective July 18, 1988, the Commission has temporarily transferred the management responsibility for the headquarters Public Reference Room to the Office of Applications and Reports Services. As a result of the management restructuring, there have been delays in releasing revised operating rules and procedures and in beginning the physical alterations in the Public Reference Room. The revised operating rules and procedures will be released shortly and the alteration work should begin during August 1988. (Press Release 88-62)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

PERMANENT INJUNCTIONS ENTERED AGAINST ELECTRO-CATHETER CORPORATION, OTHERS

The Commission announced that on July 12 U.S. District Judge Norma Holloway Johnson, District of Columbia, entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction against Electro-Catheter Corporation, Robert I. Bernstein, and John J. Ternyila, enjoining them variously from violating or aiding abetting violations of Sections 10(b), 13(a), and 13(b)(2) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rules 10b-5, 12b-20, 13a-1, 13a-13, and 13b2-2(b) [the antifraud, issuer reporting, and Foreign Corrupt Practices Act - omitting to state material facts to auditors - provisions]. Electro-Catheter was also ordered to restate the reporting of the revenue from six transactions set forth in the Complaint.

The February 4, 1987 Complaint alleged that Electro-Catheter's reported pretax-income was overstated in its financial statements for six consecutive quarterly periods from November 30, 1983 through February 25, 1985 due to the improper recognition of revenue for six bill-and-hold transactions, representing \$4.5 million in purported revenues when the revenue did not qualify for recognition under generally accepted accounting principles. (SEC v. Electro-Catheter Corporation, et al., USDC DC, Civil Action No. 87-0267, NHJ). (LR-11803)

MICHAEL W. STRAND HELD IN CIVIL CONTEMPT

The Atlanta Regional Office announced that on July 1 U.S. District Judge John T. Nixon, Middle District of Tennessee, held Michael W. Strand in civil contempt of the Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction entered against him and others on April 27, 1987. The Final Judgment enjoined Strand from violating the antifraud provisions of both the Securities Act of 1933 and the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, and ordered Strand to account for his profits realized from trading in the common stock of Classic Mining Corporation and to disgorge all profits realized from such trading. Strand has not submitted a satisfactory accounting or disgorged any profits as ordered. The contempt order requires Strand to submit a detailed accounting and fines him \$100 per day until such accounting is submitted.

Strand was convicted over a year ago for conspiracy and mail fraud generally involving the same transactions which precipitated the instant enforcement action and the resulting injunction. (SEC v. Classic Mining Corp., et al., Civil Action No. 3-85-1133, USDC MDTN). (LR-11804)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

EQUITABLE CAPITAL PARTNERS, L.P.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until August 8 to request a hearing on an application filed by Equitable Capital Partners, L.P., Equitable Capital Partners (Retirement Fund), L.P. (collectively, the Partnerships), Equitable Deal Flow Fund, L.P., and Equitable Capital Management Corporation (Equitable Management), for an order permitting the purchases of securities by the Partnerships in joint transactions with each other or in transactions in which an affiliate of Equitable Capital is a participant. (Rel. IC-16483 - July 15)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

PARTIAL APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission partially approved a proposed rule change filed by the Boston Stock Exchange (SR-BSE-87-1) that will permit it to proceed with the initial stages of the implementation of BEACON, an automated communication, order routing, and execution system for use by member organizations. The partial approval will permit BSE to operate the system under the procedures in the proposed BEACON rule for up to 20 stocks. (Rel. 34-25918)

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The National Association of Securities Dealers filed a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 (SR-NASD-88-27) that would amend Schedule C of its By-Laws. The proposal would permit qualification as a Limited Representative-Corporate Securities to serve as an alternative prerequisite for qualifying as a Registered Options Representative or a Registered Options Principal. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of July 18. (Rel. 34-25919)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by the Philadelphia Stock Exchange (SR-Phlx-88-5) that will codify existing policies and adopt new provisions concerning denial or conditions for membership. (Rel. 34-25920)
