COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

DENVER REGIONAL OFFICE - OFFICE OF COLORADO SECURITIES COMMISSIONER CO-HOST ANNUAL STATE-FEDERAL COOPERATIVE SECURITIES CONFERENCE - OCTOBER 5-6, 1978

COURT ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS

RANDALL W. KOELLING SENTENCED

The Denver Regional Office announced that on August 30 the Honorable Robert V. Denning, U.S. District Court Judge for the District of Nebraska, sentenced Randall W. Koelling of Omaha, Nebraska to pay a fine of \$2,500 and the costs of prosecution in the amount of \$32.50 following his plea of guilty to charges that he sold and offered for sale securities not registered with the Commission. (U.S. v. Stanley T. Kiespert, et al., USDC, Dist. of Nebraska, CR-78-0-34). (LR-8548)

FORMER FRANKLIN DIRECTOR ADMITS GUILT

The New York Regional Office announced that on September 5 Carlo Bordoni, former director of Franklin New York Corporation (FNYC), the holding company of Franklin National Bank (FNB), pleaded guilty to two counts of an indictment charging him (1) with misapplying funds of FNB in an amount exceeding \$30 million and (2) falsifying FNB's financial statements for the fiscal quarter ending March 31, 1974, to conceal losses exceeding \$30 million.

Bordoni was named as a defendant in a related civil injunctive action, alleging violations of the securities laws in the purchase and sale of shares of FNYC. (See SEC v. Harold V. Gleason, et al., 74 Civ. 4557 [DBB] S.D.N.Y.); (LR-6551). Bordoni consented to the entry of a final judgment of permanent injunction without admitting or denying the allegations of the Commission's complaint; judgment was entered against him on January 20, 1976. (U.S. v. Carlo Bordoni, et al., 75 Cr. 948, S.D.N.Y.). (LR-8549)

RICHARD L. SHIELDS PLEADS GUILTY

The Atlanta Regional Office announced that on September 18 Richard L. Shields of Springfield, Missouri, pleaded guilty in federal court in Atlanta to securities fraud. Shield's plea was to one count of a ten-count indictment charging him with securities and mail fraud in the offer and sale of the securities of Medical Professional Aids, a now defunct Atlanta corporation engaged in the distribution of first aid and baby care products. Federal Judge Charles A. Moye, Jr. ordered Shields to appear for sentencing on October 31, 1978. (U.S. v. Richard L. Shields, N.D. Ga., Criminal No. 78-194A). (LR-8550)

J. WAYNE HAWS PLEADS GUILTY

The Denver Regional Office announced that on September 18 J. Wayne Haws of Huntington Beach, California, pled guilty in Federal Court in Los Angeles to two counts of an indictment which charged him with criminal contempt violations of an order of permanent injunction issued by Judge Aldon J. Anderson of the U.S. District Court's Northern Division of Utah on June 26, 1973 against Haws and others. The counts to which Haws pled guilty charged that he violated the terms of the injunction by continuing to sell investment contracts and evidences of indebtedness without registration and by making false and misleading statements subsequent to the issuance of the injunction. Sentencing is scheduled on October 16 before the Honorable William Matthew Byrne, U.S. District Court Judge for the Central District of California. (U.S. v. J. Wayne Haws, USDC California Central District, CR-78-810). (LR-8551)
