SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION NEWS DIGEST

A brief summary of financial proposals filed with and actions by the S.E.C.

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(Issue No. 66-34)

<u>C. A. BENSON REVOCATION PROPOSED</u>. SEC Hearing Examiner Warren E. Blair has filed an initial decision with the Commission proposing the revocation of the broker-dealer registration of C. A. Benson & Company, Inc., of <u>Pittsburgh, Pa</u>., for violations of the Federal securities laws. He further proposed that Carl A. Benson, president of the firm, be barred from further association with any broker-dealer firm. The respondents may seek Commission review of the decision within fifteen days. The violations involved transactions by the firm and Benson during 1963 in securities of Home Makers Savings Corporation of which Benson was an officer and substantial stockholder. The Examiner ruled, among other things, that "the record reflects deliberate blatant fraud perpetrated upon trusting investors . . . that respondents' actions . . . were directed toward the single selfish purpose of generating profits without regard to even the minimum responsibility of fair dealing required in the securities industry, much less the greater fiduciary duty imposed upon them by their customers' trust and confidence."

ROY E. CRIST CHANGES PLEA. The SEC Denver Regional Office announced February 15 (LR-3429) that Roy E. Crist of Lincoln, Nebr., withdrew his plea of not guilty and entered a plea of guilty to an indictment charging him with violations of and conspiracy to violate the Securities Act anti-fraud provisions (USDC, Lincoln).

<u>NASSAU PHYSICIANS GUILD INVESTING RECEIVES ORDER</u>. The SEC has issued an exemption order under the Investment Company Act (Release IC-4518) permitting the survivor of a proposed merger involving the investment adviser to Nassau Physicians Guild Investing Co., Inc., Garden City, Long Island, <u>New York</u>, to serve as adviser until a new investment advisory agreement is submitted for shareholder approval on March 15, 1966. According to the application, the company's investment adviser, Standard & Poor's Corporation ("Old S&P") intends to merge with McGraw-Hill, Inc. The surviving corporation, McGraw-Hill, will transfer the business of Old S&P to a newly formed subsidiary, which will also bear the name of Standard & Poor's Corporation and will continue with that company's present management, personnel, policies and business.

MONONGAHELA POWER RECEIVES ORDER. The SEC has issued an order under the Holding Company Act (Release 35-15404) authorizing Monongahela Power Co., <u>Fairmont, W. Va.</u>, electric utility subsidiary of Allegheny Power System, Inc., to sell at competitive bidding \$18,000,000 of its first mortgage bonds (due 1996). The proceeds of the bond sale will be applied to its 1965-67 construction program, estimated at \$59,500,000.

<u>APPALACHIAN POWER SEEKS ORDER</u>. Appalachian Power Co., <u>Roanoke, Va.</u>, electric-utility subsidiary of American Electric Power Co., Inc., has applied to the SEC for an order under the Holding Company Act authorizing it to sell at competitive bidding \$30,000,000 of sinking fund debentures (due 1996); and the Commission has issued an order (Release 35-15407) giving interested persons until March 1 to request a hearing thereon. As reported in the February 2 News Digest, net proceeds of the company's debenture sale will be used in connection with its construction program, estimated at \$32,130,000 for 1966.

UNLISTED TRADING SOUGHT. The SEC has issued an order under the Securities Exchange Act (Release 34-7827) giving interested persons until March 3 to request a hearing on an application of the Cincinnati Stock Exchange for unlisted trading privileges in the common stocks of American Electric Power Co., Inc., Commonwealth Edison Co., Deere & Co., The Firestone Tire & Rubber Co., The International Nickel Co. of Canada, Ltd., E. J. Korvette, Inc., Litton Industries, Inc., and G. D. Searle & Co.

CONTINENTAL VENDING TRADING BAN CONTINUED. The SEC has issued an order suspending exchange and over-thecounter trading in securities of Continental Vending Machine Corporation for a further ten-day period, February 21-March 2, 1966, inclusive.

FAMILY FINANCE FILES STOCK PLAN. Family Finance Corporation, 201 W. Fourteenth St., <u>Wilmington, Del</u>. 19899, filed a registration statement (File 2-24504) with the SEC on February 17 seeking registration of 150,000 shares of common stock, to be offered under its Qualified Stock Option Plan.

EAGLE-PICHER FILES STOCK PLAN. The Eagle-Picher Company, 1100 The American Bldg., <u>Cincinnati, Ohio</u> 45201, filed a registration statement (File 2-24505) with the SEC on February 17 seeking registration of 35,000 shares of common capital stock, to be offered pursuant to its 1966 Employees' Stock Purchase Plan.

<u>CENTRAL AND SOUTH WEST CORP. RECEIVES ORDER.</u> The SEC has issued an order under the Holding Company Act (Release 35-15405) authorizing Central Power and Light Co., Public Service Co. of Oklahoma, Southwestern Electric Power Co., and West Texas Utilities Co., electric-utility subsidiaries of Central and South West Corp., <u>Wilmington, Del.</u>, to sell unsecured promissory notes to the parent company from time to time during 1966. According to the application, the aggregate principal amount of notes of the borrowing companies which may be outstanding at any one time will not exceed the following amounts: Central Power, \$4,000,000; Public Service of Oklahoma, \$5,000,000; Southwestern, \$4,000,000; and West Texas, \$7,000,000. The subsidiaries will apply the proceeds to their respective construction programs.

<u>PABLO RESTRAINED</u>. The SEC San Francisco Regional Office announced February 15 (LR-3430) the entry of a Federal court order (USDC, Hawaii) restraining Pastor A. Pablo, Rufina A. Pablo (individually and as trustee for Pastor A. Pablo and investors under certain trust indentures) and Pastor A. Pablo and Rufina A. Pablo (as managers for said investors and "members" under certain joint venture agreements) from further violations of the Securities Act registration provisions in the sale of interests in certain land situated in Los Angeles County, Calif. The defendants consented to the injunction and agreed to an arrangement to safeguard the equities of the various investors in the joint venture agreements by establishing trust accounts for their benefit.

LOS ANGELES LAND AND INVESTMENTS CITED. The SEC San Francisco Regional Office announced February 15 (LR-3431) the filing of a complaint (USDC, Hawaii) seeking to enjoin Los Angeles Land and Investments, Ltd., and James R. Light from violating the Securities Act registration provisions in the sale of interests in certain land situated in Los Angeles County, Calif.

<u>CELANESE CORP. PROPOSES RIGHTS OFFERING.</u> Celanese Corporation of America, 522 Fifth Ave., <u>New York</u> 10036, today filed a registration statement (File 2-24507) with the SEC seeking registration of 1,478,622 shares of common stock. The stock is to be offered for subscription by common stockholders at the rate of one new share for each eight shares held on March 10. Any unsubscribed shares are to be offered for public sale through underwriters headed by The First Boston Corp., 20 Exchange Pl., New York 10005. The offering price (\$85 per share maximum*) and underwriting terms are to be supplied by amendment.

The company manufactures and sells petrochemicals, petroleum products, pulps, fibers, paints and plastics. Net proceeds of its stock sale will be used for the company's capital expenditure and investment program designed to broaden its product line, to expand capacity of existing facilities, and to get established in new market areas through organization of new companies or acquisition of interests in existing businesses. Such program is estimated to cost \$750 million for the three-year period ending December 31, 1968. In addition to indebtedness and preferred stock, the company has outstanding 11,828,972 common shares, of which management officials own 0.8%. Harold Blancke is board chairman and John W. Brooks is president.
