SEC PUBLIC REFERENCE-PUBLICATIONS UNITS IN MOVE. The SEC Public Reference and Publication Units will

move into the Commission's new quarters at 500 North Capitol Street, commencing Friday, June 3, 1966. So as to permit the necessary packing in advance of the move, and unpacking after the move, the regular operations of the two Units will be suspended for the six-day period Wednesday, June 1, through Monday, June 6, 1966. Only limited telephone service will be available; and action on all requests for releases or photocopies of dockets will be deferred.

The public's cooperation will be appreciated.

ENTERPRISE SECURITIES RECEIVES ORDER. The SEC has issued an order under the Investment Company Act (Release IC-4611) declaring that Enterprise Securities Fund, Inc., <u>St. Louis, Mo</u>., has ceased to be an investment company as defined in the Act. The applicant states that its securities are owned beneficially by 53 persons, and that it is not making and does not presently propose to make a public offering of its securities.

<u>MET-ED RECEIVES ORDER</u>. The SEC has issued an order under the Holding Company Act (Release 35-15487) permitting Metropolitan Edison Co., <u>Berks County, Pa</u>., electric-utility subsidiary of General Public Utilities Corp., to sell an aggregate of \$22,600,000 of its promissory notes to banks by May 31, 1967. The company proposes to use the proceeds of the note sale in connection with its construction program, which is estimated at \$26,500,000 for 1966.

<u>W. S. MOSES PROPOSES OFFERING</u>. W. S. Moses, 1015 Pass Rd., <u>Gulfport, Miss</u>., filed a registration statement (File 2-25044) with the SEC on May 23 seeking registration of \$264,960 of working interests in oil and gas leases, to be offered for public sale in minimum units of \$5,520. Moses is a petroleum engineer. He will explore for oil and gas in Covington County, Miss., pursuant to an operating agreement, on behalf of the purchasers of the interests.

<u>PILOT FUND PROPOSES OFFERING</u>. Pilot Fund, Inc., 717 Travis St., <u>Houston, Tex</u>. 77002, filed a registration statement (File 2-25053) with the SEC on May 25 saeking registration of 50,000 shares of common stock. The stock is to be offered for public sale at net asset value plus a maximum sales charge of 8.5% (\$10.93 per share maximum*). Texas Fund Management Co., of the Houston address, is the firm's investment adviser and principal underwriter.

Organized under Texas law in 1966, the company is an open-end diversified management investment company, whose primary objective is "to attain for its shareholders maximum appreciation of capital through investments in securities of companies expected to benefit from significant new developments." Clive Runnells is president.

<u>HUNTINGTON BANCSHARES FILES EXCHANGE PROPOSAL</u>. Huntington Bancshares, Incorporated, 17 S. High St., <u>Columbus, Ohio</u> 43215, filed a registration statement (File 2-25057) with the SEC on May 26 seeking registration of 1,026,967 shares of common stock. The stock is to be offered in exchange for all of the outstanding capital stock of The Huntington National Bank of Columbus (Huntington National), at the rate of one company share for each Huntington National share. The exchange offer is conditioned upon the acceptance thereof by the holders of at least two-thirds of the outstanding stock of Huntington National.

Organized under Maryland law in April 1966, the company intends to become a bank holding company and will provide advice and specialized services to its subsidiary banks. Clair E. Fultz is president of the company and Huntington National.

<u>PUBLIC SERVICE ELECTRIC & GAS PROPOSES OFFERING</u>. Public Service Electric and Gas Company, 80 Park P1., <u>Newark, N, J.</u> 07101, filed a registration statement (File 2-25059) with the SEC on May 26 seeking registration of \$60,000,000 of debenture bonds (due 1991), to be offered for public sale at competitive bidding. Net proceeds of its debenture sale will be used for general corporate purposes, including the payment of a portion of the cost of the company's current construction program and the payment of some \$9,000,000 of unsecured short-term bank loans. The company's construction expenditures are estimated at \$140,000,000 for 1966 and \$170,000,000 for 1967.

<u>UNLISTED TRADING PRIVILEGES GRANTED</u>. The SEC has issued an order under the Securities Exchange Act granting applications of the Boston Stock Exchange, Cincinnati Stock Exchange, Detroit Stock Exchange, Philadelphia Baltimore-Washington Stock Exchange, and Pittsburgh Stock Exchange for unlisted trading privileges in the common stock of United States Steel Corp.

<u>DELISTING GRANTED</u>. The SEC has issued an order under the Securities Exchange Act granting an application of the Cincinnati Stock Exchange to strike from listing and registration the common stock of E. Kahn's Sons Co., effective at the opening of business on May 31. The application states that only 7,131 shares of common stock of the company remain outstanding in the hands of the public, exclusive of the concentrated holdings of Consolidated Foods Corp.

<u>CEORGIA POWER FILES FINANCING PROPOSAL</u>. Georgia Power Company, 270 Peachtree St., <u>Atlanta, Ga</u>. 30303, today filed a registration statement (File 2-25065) with the SEC seeking registration of \$50,000,000 of first mortgage bonds, due 1996, and 90,000 shares of cumulative preferred stock (without par value). The securities are to be offered for public sale at competitive bidding. A subsidiary of The Southern Company, the company will use the proceeds of this financing (together with \$14,000,000 received from the recent sale of common stock to the parent and other available funds) in connection with its construction program and for other corporate purposes. The company contemplates expenditures of \$359,533,000 during 1966, 1967 and 1968 for the construction or acquisition of property.
