ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

IN THE MATTER OF SKY SCIENTIFIC, INC., ET AL.

An administrative law judge today issued an Initial Decision in the above-referenced matter. The law judge concluded that Respondents Jerry L. Foster (Foster); Robert Schlien (Schlien); American Capital Network, Inc. (ACN); Melvin L. Levine (Levine); William David Jones (Jones); Philip M. Georgeson (Georgeson); Smith, Benton & Hughes, Inc. (SBH); Michael Zaman (Zaman); George T. Hellen (Hellen); Gilbert Marshall & Co. (GM); Michael A. Usher (Usher); and Daniel R. Lehl (Lehl) willfully violated Section 17(a) of the Securities Act and Section 10(b) of the Exchange Act and Rule 10b-5 thereunder (antifraud provisions) by perpetrating a scheme to defraud involving the sale of Sky Scientific, Inc (Sky) The law judge found that the Respondents had furthered the stock. scheme acting as promoters, broker-dealers, and, in the case of Foster, a Sky insider. The law judge further concluded that: Schlien, ACN, Jones, Levine, Georgeson, SBH, Zaman, Hellen, GM, Usher, and Lehl violated Sections 5(a) and 5(c) of the Securities Act by distributing unregistered stock to the public; GM, Usher, and Respondents Strategic Resource Management, Inc. (SRM) and William A. Moler (Moler) charged customers excessive markups in violation of the antifraud provisions; Respondents Schlien, ACN, Levine, and Jones violated Securities Act Section 17(b) by circulating tout sheets without disclosing that they had received and would receive consideration from Sky Scientific; and Sky chief financial officer Foster caused violations of certain filing and accounting records provisions of the Exchange Act.

The law judge ordered the following Respondents to disgorge the following amounts: Foster \$29,325; Schlien and ACN \$2,606,729; Levine \$79,350; Jones \$4,546,500; Georgeson \$273,572; SBH and Zaman \$536,921; Hellen \$12,962; GM and Usher \$5,435,183; Lehl \$269,759; SRM and Moler \$68,469. The law judge ordered the following Respondents to pay civil penalties in the following amounts: SBH \$250,000; Zaman \$175,000; Hellen \$150,000; Usher \$250,000; Lehl \$350,000; Moler \$50,000. Collateral bars were imposed against Zaman, Hellen, Usher, and Lehl; and Moler was barred from association with any broker or dealer with a right to reapply in 18 months. The law judge revoked GM's registration and suspended SRM's registration for 90 days. Cease and desist orders were issued as to all Respondents except GM. (Initial Decision No. 137; File No. 3-9201)

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDING SETTLED WITH DEAN WITTER REYNOLDS INC. BRANCH MANAGER

The Commission has settled a failure to supervise proceeding against Henry L. Auwinger (Auwinger), a branch manager at Dean Witter Reynolds Inc. (Dean Witter). Without admitting or denying the Commission's findings, Auwinger has agreed to a three-month suspension from association with any broker or dealer, an additional nine-month supervisory and proprietary suspension, and the payment of a \$10,000 civil penalty.

This settlement resulted from an action the Commission brought on August 26, 1998, against Dean Witter and two branch managers, Auwinger and Dennis W. Peterson (Peterson). The Commission alleged that Dean Witter, Auwinger, and Peterson failed reasonably to supervise Michael J. Oberholzer (Oberholzer), a former broker in the Hayward, California, branch of Dean Witter. From 1989 until September 1995, the Commission alleged, Oberholzer defrauded four Dean Witter customers and caused investor losses totaling \$320,000 by engaging in a pattern of fraudulent sales practices that included churning, unauthorized margin trading, unsuitable trading, and material misrepresentations and omissions.

Specifically, the Order finds that Auwinger failed to respond to significant warning signs about the broker's conduct from at least October 1992 until September 12, 1994, when Auwinger was transferred from the Hayward branch. Auwinger was aware of the active trading and extensive use of margin in the accounts of the four elderly women, and he received warnings about the way the broker was conducting his business. Even though the activity continued for several years, Auwinger's response was limited to "activity" letters and phone calls with three of the customers. For the most part, Auwinger simply obtained assurances from the broker that the customers were actively managing their accounts. This response was insufficient.

The administrative proceeding against the remaining respondents, Dean Witter and Peterson, is scheduled to begin on March 8, 1999, before Administrative Law Judge Robert G. Mahony in San Francisco, California. (Rel. 34-41145; File No. 3-9686)

FINAL JUDGMENT ENTERED AGAINST PATRICK ANTRIM AND LORETTA ANTRIM OF THE OSTRICH GROUP, INC. FOR FRAUD AND BROKER-DEALER REGISTRATION VIOLATIONS

The Commission announced that on February 19, 1999, the Honorable Gary L. Taylor of the United States District Court for the Central District of California entered a Final Judgment against defendants Patrick L. Antrim (P. Antrim) and Loretta Antrim (L. Antrim). The Final Judgment permanently enjoins P. Antrim and L. Antrim from future violations of the antifraud and broker-dealer registration provisions of the federal securities laws, and orders P. Antrim and L. Antrim to pay disgorgement in the amount of \$819,108.61, plus prejudgment interest.

The Complaint alleged that P. Antrim and L. Antrim, through The Ostrich Group, Inc. (Ostrich Group), raised approximately \$800,000 from the offer and sale of investment contracts for the sale and boarding of ostrich breeder birds to about 83 investors in several states. The principals of Ostrich Group, including the Antrims, misused investors' funds by transferring most of the funds to themselves and their family members instead of purchasing and boarding ostrich breeders. In addition, the Antrims misrepresented the ostrich services provided by Ostrich Group and acted as unregistered broker-dealers in offering and selling interests in the ostrich investment program. LASER PHOTONICS' PRINCIPAL FINANCIAL OFFICER ENJOINED AND BARRED; LASER PHOTONICS' VICE PRESIDENT ENJOINED AND PENALIZED

The Commission announced today that Andrew L. O'Connell of Orlando, Florida, the former principal financial and accounting officer of Laser Photonics, Inc., has been enjoined and barred from appearing before the Commission for his role in the financial fraud uncovered at Laser Photonics. The Commission also announced that Robert J. Anselmo of Longwood, Florida, a former vice president of Laser Photonics, has been enjoined and penalized \$17,500 for his role in the fraudulent scheme. Laser Photonics is an Orlando based manufacturer of medical and scientific lasers.

On February 26, 1999, Judge G. Kendall Sharp of the United States District Court for the Middle District of Florida entered Final Judgments Of Permanent Injunction against Anselmo and O'Connell in the lawsuit filed against them by the Commission in 1997. The Final Judgments enjoin O'Connell and Anselmo from future violations of the antifraud and the books and records provisions of the federal securities laws. The Final Judgment against Anselmo also requires that he pay a civil penalty in the amount of \$17,500. No civil penalty was imposed against O'Connell based upon his demonstrated financial inability to pay. O'Connell and Anselmo consented to the Final Judgments without admitting or denying the Commission's allegations. O'Connell, a certified public accountant licensed to practice in Florida, also consented to the Commission's issuance of an Order under Rule 102(e) of the Commission's Rules of Practice which denies him the privilege of practicing before the Commission as an accountant.

The Commission's civil complaint alleged that O'Connell, Anselmo and Mark T. Fukuhara, Laser Photonics' former president, engaged in a scheme to defraud the company's investors by materially inflating its publicly reported revenues and profits and by falsifying its books and records. O'Connell, Anselmo and Fukuhara ordered the booking of fictitious sales, failed to reduce recorded revenues for sales returns and billing errors, and prematurely recognized future revenues. The defendants hid the fraudulent scheme from the company's independent auditors by forging, altering and concealing corporate records, and by procuring false sales confirmations and other misleading statements from certain customers of the company in order to circumvent the auditors' verification procedures. While the scheme lasted, Laser Photonics filed with the Commission its 1992 annual report on Form 10-K, two 1993 quarterly reports on Form 10-Q, and a stock sale registration statement on Form S-1, all of which were materially false and misleading.

The Final Judgments entered by Judge Sharp permanently enjoin O'Connell and Anselmo from violating Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933, Sections 10(b) and 13(b)(5) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, and Commission Rules 10b-5, 13b2-1 and 13b2-2 promulgated thereunder, and further enjoin them from aiding and abetting violations of Sections 13(a), 13(b)(2)(A) and 13(b)(2)(B) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Commission Rules 12b-20, 13a-1 and 13a-13 promulgated thereunder.

These settlements conclude the Commission's enforcement actions with respect to the fraudulent accounting scheme at Laser Photonics. Previously, former president Mark T. Fukuhara consented, without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's complaint, to a permanent injunction from violations of the antifraud and the books and records provisions of the federal securities laws, to payment of a \$40,000 civil penalty, and to an order barring him from acting as an officer or director of a public company for five years. Alfson, the company's former director of manufacturing, previously consented to the issuance of Commission Orders ordering the company and Alfson to Cease and Desist from violations of the anti-fraud and the books and records provisions of the federal securities laws. 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GOLDEN EAGLE INTERNATIONAL, INC. ENJOINED BY CONSENT

The Commission announced that on March 4 the Honorable Zita L. Weinshienk, United States District Judge for the District of Colorado entered an order of permanent injunction against Golden Eagle International, Inc. (Golden Eagle) The order, which was entered pursuant to the company's consent, in which in which it neither admitted nor denied the allegations of the complaint, prohibits the company from further violations of various provisions of the federal securities laws, including the antifraud, periodic filings, and books and records provisions. Specifically the company is prohibited from further violations of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933, Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (Exchange Act) and Rule 10b-5 thereunder, Section 13(b)(2)(B) of the Exchange Act, Section 13(a) of the Exchange Act and Rules 13a-1, 13a-11, 13a-13, and 12b-20 thereunder.

The complaint, which was filed in May 1998 charged that Golden Eagle had issued a series of false public statements, including false filings with the Commission concerning ownership of mineral properties and reserves on those properties. The complaint also charged that Golden Eagle had been delinquent in filing periodic reports with the Commission. In November 1998 the Commission amended its complaint alleging that Terry Turner, Golden Eagle's president had issued a false press release in May 1998 that fraudulently claimed that Golden Eagle's Bolivian properties had substantial amounts of gold reserves.

Litigation is continuing against the remaining defendants who include, Terry Turner, Ronald Knittle, Mary Erickson, Greg Vernon Timberline Consulting Inc. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

ZWEIG/GLASER ADVISERS, ET AL.

An order has been issued on an application filed by Zweig/Glaser Advisers and Zweig Advisors Inc. under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act of 1940 for an exemption from Section 15(a) of the Act. The order permits the implementation, without prior shareholder approval, of certain new sub-advisory agreements (New Agreements) in connection with the acquisition of applicants by Phoenix Investment Partners, Ltd. (Acquisition). The order covers a period of up to 150 days following the later of: (i) the date on which the Acquisition is consummated, or (ii) the date on which the requested order is issued (but in no event later than July 23, 1999) (Interim Period). The order also permits applicants to receive all fees earned under the New Agreements during the Interim Period following shareholder approval. (Rel. IC-23727 -March 5)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

COLUMBIA ENERGY GROUP, ET AL.

An order has been issued authorizing Columbia Energy Group (Columbia), a registered holding company and its wholly owned subsidiary, Columbia Electric Corporation (Columbia Electric), to acquire a 50% partnership interest in a cogeneration facility, which, once operational, will be a "qualifying facility" as defined under the Public Utility Regulatory Policies Act of 1978, and to issue guarantees in an aggregate amount not to exceed \$200 million. (Rel. 35-26985)

NIAGARA MOHAWK HOLDINGS, INC.

An order has been issued authorizing Niagara Mohawk Holdings, Inc. (Holdings), a company not currently subject to the Act and a wholly owned subsidiary of Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation (Niagara Mohawk), a New York public utility holding exempt from registration under Section 3(a)(2) of the Act, to acquire all of the outstanding shares of common stock of Niagara Mohawk. Through the acquisition, Niagara Mohawk could acquire 86% of the outstanding common stock of Beebee Island Corporation, 67% of the outstanding common stock of Moreau Manufacturing Corporation, and 50% of Canadian Niagara Power Company Limited. The order also grants Holdings an exemption under Section 3(a)(1) of the Act. (Rel. 35-26986)
