COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

ANNETTE NAZARETH TO TESTIFY

Annette Nazareth, Director of the Commission's Division of Market Regulation, will testify on May 18 before the House Subcommittee on Risk Management, Research, and Specialty Crops concerning Reauthorization of the Commodity Futures Trading Commission. The hearing where this testimony will be presented will be held in Room 1300 of the Longworth House Office Building and will begin at 3:00 p.m.

ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

ROBERT BETTIGA BARRED

On May 13, the Commission announced that Robert G. Bettiga of Corpus Christi, Texas, consented to the entry of an administrative proceeding order finding that he willfully violated the antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws in the offer and sale of unregistered securities offered through Bluebonnet Securities, Inc. Bettiga offered and sold speculative and high-risk interests in BSI Participations Trust (BSI) to his clients. The proceeds of the offering were to be loaned to an entity in the business of originating or purchasing retail installment loans for used cars. Bettiga misrepresented the risks associated with purchasing interests in BSI by telling his customers that there was "no way you can lose," that BSI securities had "hardly any risk," that they were a "safe investment," and that they were "foolproof." Additionally, in order to sell interests to unqualified investors, Bettiga completed BSI subscription documents on behalf of at least 13 of his customers that falsified their net worth.

The order bars Bettiga from association with any broker, dealer, municipal securities dealer, investment adviser or investment company. Bettiga is also ordered to cease and desist from committing or causing any violations or future violations of Sections 5(a) and (c) and 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933, and Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, and Rule 10b-5 thereunder. The order also requires Bettiga to pay disgorgement in the amount of \$50,340, plus prejudgment interest. However, payment of all but \$5,000 of the disgorgement amount was waived and no civil penalty was imposed based on his demonstrated financial inability to pay. ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS SETTLED AGAINST DOMINION CAPITAL CORPORATION, DOUGLAS POWELL, CHARLES ELLIOTT, AND WILLIAM BERRY

On May 13, the Commission announced that it issued an Order settling public administrative proceedings against Dominion Capital Corporation, a broker-dealer registered with the Commission; Douglas Woodrow Powell, Dominion's Chief Executive Officer and Chief Supervisory Officer; Charles Dewey Elliott, Dominion's Options Principal and Assistant Supervisory Officer; and William Carl Berry, a registered representative of Dominion.

In its Order, the Commission found that Berry and two other Dominion registered representatives willfully violated the anti-fraud provisions of the federal securities laws. According to the Order, one of the schemes, organized and promoted by Berry and another Dominion representative as partners, involved offers and sales of limited partnership interests in two limited partnerships formed to engage in OEX index options trading. Another scheme, involving Dominion-sponsored offers and sales of unregistered interests in four limited liability companies, involved Berry's partner and a third representative. Separately, two other Dominion representatives willfully violated the anti-fraud provisions in a scheme involving offers and sales of unregistered interests in an unregistered "offshore" investment company. One of these representatives was also registered with the Commission as an investment adviser, and violated the books and recordkeeping provisions, and the anti-fraud provisions of the Investment Advisers Act in connection with this scheme. Further, the Commission found that Dominion, Powell and Elliott failed to supervise the registered representatives whose activities are described above.

The Commission's findings were made in accordance with the offers of settlement submitted, on a neither admit nor deny basis, by each respondent. The Commission ordered that Berry is barred from association with any broker, dealer, municipal securities dealer, investment adviser or investment company; cease and desist from committing or causing any violations of future violations of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act and Section 10(b) of the Exchange Act and Rule 10b-5 thereunder; and pay a civil money penalty of \$5000, and disgorgement of \$11,714.45 plus prejudgment interest of Further, the Commission ordered that Dominion's \$3,585.12. registration as a broker and dealer in securities is revoked and that it pay a civil money penalty of \$75,000. Finally, the Commission ordered that Powell and Elliott are each suspended from association with any broker or dealer for a period of three months, and thereafter, in any supervisory or proprietary capacity for a period of an additional six months, and that each pay a civil money penalty of \$35,000. PENNY STOCK BAR ORDER ENTERED AGAINST GILBERT ZWETSCH

On May 14, the Commission issued an Order Instituting Proceedings Pursuant to Section 15(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, Making Findings and Imposing Remedial Sanctions barring Gilbert A. Zwetsch (Zwetsch) from participating in any offering of penny stock. Zwetsch consented to the Order without admitting or denying the findings contained in it. The Order finds that Zwetsch was enjoined from violating Sections 5(a), 5(c) and 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933, Sections 10(b), 13(d), 13(g) and 16(a) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, and Rules 10-5, 10b-9, 13d-1, 13d-2 and 16a-3 thereunder, based upon his participation in the offerings of the common stock of Market America, Inc. (Market America), Masada Corporation (Masada) and Olympus Ventures, Inc. (Olympus), and other issuers [SEC v. Gilbert A. Zwetsch et al., D.D.C., Civil Action No. 99-1088]. The Order also finds that the common stock of Market America, Masada and Olympus were "penny stocks" within the meaning of Section 3(a)(51) of the Exchange Act and Rule 3a51-1 thereunder, and the distributions described in the Order each constituted "an offering of a penny stock" within the meaning of Section 15(b)(5) of the Exchange Act. PERMANENT INJUNCTIONS ENTERED AGAINST NATALE MONTOZZI, MAGNUM PETROLEUM ENTERPRISES, INC., AND MAGNUM OIL AND PETROLEUM, INC.

On April 14, 1999, the Honorable James Lawrence King, United States District Judge for the Southern District of Florida entered permanent injunctions by consent against defendants Natale L. Montozzi (Montozzi), Magnum Petroleum Enterprises, Inc. (Magnum Petroleum), and Magnum Oil and Petroleum Inc. (Magnum Oil) (Magnum Petroleum and Magnum Oil, collectively, "Magnum"). The orders permanently enjoin defendants Montozzi, Magnum Petroleum, and Magnum Oil from future violations of the antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws. Montozzi, Magnum Petroleum, and Magnum Oil did not admit or deny the Commission's allegations. Based upon their inability to pay, disgorgement and pre-judgment interest were waived for Montozzi, Magnum Petroleum, and Magnum Oil.

In its complaint, filed on May 19, 1998, and amended on June 7, 1998, the Commission alleged that Titan Petroleum Corp. (Titan), Magnum Petroleum, Magnum Oil, Montozzi, and Philip Leitner violated the antifraud provisions of the securities laws by offering and selling undivided, fractional working interests in oil and gas well drilling programs. The complaint alleged, among other things, that Titan failed to disclose to investors that the amount of money raised was far in excess of the costs it knew it would incur to drill and complete the wells and that the Titan and Magnum offering documents contained false or misleading statements concerning the success, experience, and history of the companies. Montozzi and Philip Leitner, Civil Action No. 98-1111-CIV-KING, S.D. Fla.] (LR-16144)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

ALLEGIANCE TELECOM, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 7, 1999 to request a hearing on an application filed by Allegiance Telecom, Inc. for an order under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act exempting it from all provisions of the Act until the earlier of one year from the date the requested order is issued or the date applicant no longer may be deemed to be an investment company. (Rel. IC-23837 - May 13)

AMERICAN AADVANTAGE FUNDS, ET AL.

An order has been issued on an application filed by American AAdvantage Funds, et al., for an exemption from Sections 12(d)(1) and 17(a) of the Investment Company Act, and under Section 17(d) of the Act and Rule 17d-1 under the Act to permit certain joint transactions. The order permits certain registered open-end investment companies to use their cash reserves to purchase shares of affiliated money market funds and to use cash collateral from securities lending transactions to purchase shares of affiliated money market funds or affiliated private investment funds. The order also permits certain registered investment companies to pay fees based on a share of the revenue generated from securities lending transactions to an affiliated from securities lending transactions to an affiliated from securities lending transactions to an affiliated from securities lending transactions to purchase to pay fees based on a share of the revenue generated from securities lending transactions to an affiliated lending agent. The order supersedes a prior order. (Rel. IC-23838 - May 14)

STI CLASSIC FUNDS, ET AL.

An order has been issued on an application filed by STI Classic Funds, et al. granting relief from Section 17(a) of the Investment Company Act. The order permits certain series of STI Classic Funds to acquire all of the assets and liabilities of certain series of CrestFunds, Inc. and The Arbor Fund. Because of certain affiliations, applicants may not rely on rule 17a-8 under the Act. (Rel. IC-23839 - May 14)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

CONSOLIDATED EDISON, INC.

An order has been issued on a proposal by Consolidated Edison, Inc. (CEI), a New York electric and gas public utility holding company exempt from registration under section 3(a)(1) of the Public Utility Holding Company Act under Rule 2, to acquire all of the issued and outstanding securities of Orange and Rockland Utilities, Inc. (O&R), a New York electric and gas public utility holding company currently exempt from registration by order under Section 3(a)(2) of the Act.

Following the consummation of the proposed transactions, O&R will remain exempt from registration under Section 3(a)(2) of the Act. (Rel. 35-27021)

NORTHEAST UTILITIES, ET AL.

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing Northeast Utilities (Northeast), a registered holding company, Northeast's public utility subsidiaries, The Connecticut Light and Power Company, Western Massachusetts Electric Company, Public Service Company of New Hampshire, Holyoke Water Power Company, and North Atlantic Energy Corporation, and Northeast's nonutility subsidiaries, NU Enterprises, Inc., Northeast Generation Service Company, Northeast Generation Company, Select Energy, Inc., and Mode 1 Communications, Inc. (collectively, Nonutility Subsidiaries) to allow the Nonutility Subsidiaries to participate in the Northeast Utilities System Money Pool. (Rel. 35-27022)
