COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

HARVEY GOLDSCHMID TO TESTIFY

On Wednesday, June 16, General Counsel Harvey J. Goldschmid will testify on behalf of the Commission before the House Banking Committee's Subcommittee on Financial Institutions and Consumer Credit concerning loan loss allowances. The hearing will begin at 10:00 am in Room 2128 of the Rayburn House Office Building.

AMICUS CURIAE BRIEF ADDRESSING LIABILITY OF CORPORATE OFFICIALS WHO SIGN REPORTS FILED WITH THE COMMISSION THAT CONTAIN MISREPRESENTATIONS

On June 9, the Commission filed an amicus curiae (or friend of the court) brief in the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit in Howard v. Everex Systems, Inc. The brief addresses the liability, in private lawsuits brought under the antifraud provisions of Section 10(b) of the Securities and Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5, of corporate officials who sign documents filed with the Commission that contain material misrepresentations. The brief takes the position that when an official signs a document that he knows (or is reckless in not knowing) contains misrepresentations, the official can be liable in a private antifraud action even if he was not involved in preparing the document. The brief stresses the importance of full and honest reporting to the proper functioning of the securities markets and the important role corporate officials play in assuring that reports filed with the Commission are complete and accurate. ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

COMMISSION ISSUES CEASE AND DESIST ORDERS AND IMPOSES PENALTY IN INTERNET TOUTING CASE

On June 11, the Commission entered an Order Making Findings, Issuing Cease and Desist Orders and Imposing a Civil Penalty (Order) against RCG Capital Markets Group, Inc. (RCG) and RCG's owner, Arthur Max Ramras (Ramras). The Commission accepted RCG's and Ramras' Offers of Settlement, in which they agreed to orders to cease and desist from committing or causing any violation and any future violation of the antitouting provisions of Section 17(b) of the Securities Act of 1933. Additionally, Ramras, who is associated with a broker-dealer, agreed to pay a \$20,000 civil penalty.

The Order finds that from November 1998 to January 1999, RCG and Ramras touted the stocks of nine issuers on RCG's website in exchange for compensation that included cash and performance-based stock options. The Order further finds that RCG and Ramras failed to disclose the nature and amount of consideration RCG received from the issuers. RCG and Ramras consented to the entry of the Order without admitting or denying its findings. (Rel. 33-7689; 34-41518; File No. 3-9836)

INGE MARILYN PERRY AND BAY STATE TRUST ENJOINED, ORDERED TO PAY \$25,000 IN TOTAL PENALTIES

On December 1, 1998, the Honorable J. G. Koeltl entered a final judgment on consent against Inge Marilyn Perry, 58, and on May 6, 1999, he entered a final judgment on consent against Bay State Trust in a Commission action involving alleged offers and attempts to sell a forged security. Perry and Bay State, without admitting or denying the Commission's allegations, consented to the final judgments prior to responding to the Commission's complaint. The Commission alleged in a June 5, 1998 complaint that Perry and Bay State were involved with seven other defendants in a scheme to obtain money for themselves using fraudulent "bank certificates", while invoking "humanitarian" goals and the names of "official" J. entities, such as the Federal Reserve and the United Nations Security Council. This settlement leaves as the only remaining defendants attorneys Daniel T. Todt, described by the Commission as the "architect" of the fraud, and his wife Rebecca L. Todt, against both of whom the Commission has pending a motion for summary judgment.

The final judgment on consent against Perry ordered her to pay a \$10,000 penalty, and permanently enjoined her from violating Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5 thereunder and Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933. The final judgment on consent against Bay State ordered that entity to pay a \$15,000 penalty, and permanently enjoined it from violating the same provisions. Perry and Bay State had previously consented to the entry of a preliminary injunction against them on June 29, 1998. [SEC v. Daniel T. Todt, et al., 98 Civ. 3980, JGK, SDNY] (LR-16184)

FIFTH DEFENDANT SETTLES SEC'S LOTUS INSIDER TRADING CHARGES BY AGREEING TO PAY MORE THAN \$130,000 IN DISGORGEMENT AND PENALTIES

The Commission today announced that a final judgment has been entered against Alvin Ira Davis of Staten Island, New York, in a settlement of the Commission's charges that he engaged in illegal insider trading before IBM's takeover of Lotus Development. Corporation. Under the final judgment, Davis is permanently enjoined from further violating the insider trading prohibitions of the federal securities laws and required to pay \$55,550 in disgorgement, \$24,614 in prejudgment interest and a civil penalty of \$55,550. Davis was enjoined from further violations of Section 14(e) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 14(e)-3 thereunder. In consenting to the entry of the final judgment, Davis neither admitted nor denied the allegations in the Commission's complaint.

The Commission filed this matter on May 26, 1999, charging a total of twenty-five individuals with insider trading in Lotus call options and common stock on the basis of inside information misappropriated from IBM by one of its secretaries. Davis is the fifth defendant to settle. The Commission is continuing to litigate against the remaining twenty defendants. [SEC v. Lorraine K. Cassano, Civil Action No. 99-CV-3822, SDNY] (LR-16185)

ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission granted accelerated approval to a proposed rule change (SR-CHX-99-04) filed by the <u>Chicago Stock Exchange</u> adding a new price improvement algorithm, SuperMax Plus. Publication of the proposal was expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of June 7. (Rel. 34-41480)

The Commission granted accelerated approval to a proposed rule change submitted by the <u>American Stock Exchange</u> (SR-Amex-99-10) to list for trading options on the Credit Suisse First Boston Technology Index. Publication of the order is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of June 14. (Rel. 34-41503)

IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

A proposed rule change (SR-CHX-99-3) filed by the <u>Chicago Stock</u> <u>Exchange</u> concerning an increase in the BEST Rule guarantee and the minimum order acceptance level in the MAX System has become effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Publication of the proposal was expected in the <u>Federal</u> <u>Register</u> during the week of June 7. (Rel. 34-41482)

<u>The Options Clearing Corporation</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-OCC-99-7), which became effective upon filing, amending OCC's By-Laws with regards to the expiration date of end-of-month foreign currency options. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of June 14. (Rel. 34-41506)

<u>The Depository Trust Company</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-DTC-99-07), which became effective upon filing, revising the fee schedule for DTC's services. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of June 14. (Rel. 34-41508)

The Commission approved a proposed rule change and Amendment No. 1 and issued notice of filing and granted accelerated approval to Amendment Nos. 2 and 3 submitted by the <u>New York Stock Exchange</u> (SR-NYSE-99-13) relating to original and continued listing criteria.
