SEC ADOPTS NEW DISCLOSURE REQUIREMENTS FOR FOREIGN COMPANIES

Yesterday, the Commission adopted rule changes that will reduce the barriers foreign companies face when raising capital or listing their securities in more than one country. The rule changes bring SEC disclosure requirements for foreign companies closer to the international standards endorsed late last year by the International Organization of Securities Commissions (IOSCO), the global association of securities regulators.

The IOSCO standards were negotiated over several years among securities regulators in the major developed capital markets. These standard items of disclosure cover basic topics such as the description of the company's business, results of operations and management and the securities it plans to offer or list. Companies could use these international standards to prepare a core disclosure document that, with a minimum of tailoring to fit national requirements, would be accepted in many countries.

The rule changes adopted today incorporate these standards into Form 20-F, the basic disclosure form for foreign private issuers. The new requirements become effective next year, beginning September 30, 2000. The rule changes do not affect any of the accounting requirements for financial statements. The SEC will continue to require disclosure on topics not covered by the IOSCO standards, such as market risk disclosure and disclosure for specialized industries such as banking and insurance. The SEC staff also will continue its normal review and comment procedures for filings under the new disclosure requirements.

In adopting the rule changes, the Commission noted its long-standing support for initiatives that reduce barriers to cross-border offerings and listings in the United States, if they are consistent with the SEC's investor protection mandate. The IOSCO standards represent a strong international consensus on fundamental disclosure topics, and the Commission believes they are comparable, in terms of investor protection, to the SEC's traditional disclosure requirements.

Corporation Finance Division Director Brian Lane today said, "We think the IOSCO disclosure standards are a good first step toward creating a framework for an "international passport" to the world's capital markets. We expect the IOSCO standards to gain global support, and we're pleased we can use these standards in our disclosure forms without compromising the quality of information investors receive." ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

ORDER INSTITUTING ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS, MAKING FINDINGS, AND IMPOSING REMEDIAL SANCTIONS ENTERED AGAINST MARIO IACOVIELLO

The Commission announced that on September 28 it simultaneously instituted and settled administrative proceedings against Mario Iacoviello. Iacoviello consented, without admitting or denying the Commission's findings, to an order barring him from association with any broker or dealer, with the right to reapply for association after three years. The order was based upon a final consent judgment entered against Iacoviello on September 10, 1999 in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York (SEC v. Paul J. Montle, et al., 98 Civ. 3446, MP).

The Commission's complaint in the civil action alleged as follows. In June 1993, while associated as a registered representative with the San Diego branch office of La Jolla Securities Corp., a registered broker-dealer, Iacoviello accepted two payments totaling \$30,325 from one of the other defendants. In return for these payments, Iacoviello and other La Jolla brokers sold RMS Titanic, Inc. (RMS Titanic) stock to their retail customers. Iacoviello never disclosed to his retail customers that he was receiving compensation in addition to his normal compensation for recommending and selling RMS Titanic stock to them.

The final consent judgment entered against Iacoviello permanently enjoined him from future violations of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 and Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, and Rule 10b-5 thereunder. Iacoviello also consented to pay disgorgement of \$30,325 plus prejudgment interest thereon of \$16,155.30, subject to a waiver of all but \$10,000 based upon Iacoviello's demonstrated inability to pay. SEC CHARGES CHELSEA ASSOCIATES AND RONDALL HARRIS WITH CONDUCTING FRAUDULENT INVESTMENT SCHEME

The Commission announced that on September 27 it filed a complaint in federal district court in Newark, New Jersey charging that Chelsea Associates, Inc. and Rondall Harris of Franklin Park, New Jersey engaged in a fraudulent scheme whereby they obtained at least \$2.8 million from more than 375 investors throughout the country.

The Commission's complaint charges that the defendants offered and sold unregistered securities, made numerous false promises to investors about their expected profits and level of investment risk, and that Chelsea Associates failed to register with the Commission as an investment company. The Commission's complaint further alleges that the defendants targeted their solicitations primarily to African-American investors by falsely claiming that the defendants offered an opportunity to participate in investment opportunities and substantial profits historically not available to African-American investors. The Commission's complaint alleges that, in reality, the defendants invested funds they raised in a series of speculative investments, and that Harris misappropriated part of the investor funds to pay his own personal expenses.

Without admitting or denying the Commission's allegations, Chelsea Associates and Harris have consented to the entry of a judgment which permanently enjoins each of them from violating Section 5(a), 5(c) and 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933, and Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5 thereunder. In addition, the judgment permanently enjoins Harris from violating Sections 206(1) and 206(2) of the Investment Advisers Act, and permanently enjoins Chelsea Associates from violating Section 7(a) of the Investment Company Act. The judgment reserves the issue of the amount of disgorgement to be paid by the defendants, as well as the amount of any civil penalty to be paid by Harris. The defendants also consented to the entry of an order freezing all of their assets to prevent the dissipation of funds that belong to Chelsea Associates investors. [SEC v. SEC SUES PSYCHIATRIST FOR INSIDER TRADING

On September 29, the Commission filed a complaint in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia against Dr. Alan Brody, a psychiatrist licensed to practice in Maryland, New York and the District of Columbia. The Commission's complaint alleges that Dr. Brody engaged in insider trading based on information he misappropriated from a patient, an officer of Penril DataComm Networks, Inc. who knew of an upcoming business combination involving Penril and Bay Networks Incorporated.

The complaint specifically alleges that on June 11, 1996, the patient had a 45-minute doctor's appointment with Dr. Brody starting at 1:00 p.m. During that appointment, the patient, who had recently been told by Penril's executive vice president of the proposed combination so that the patient could assist in performing certain due diligence tasks, told Dr. Brody about the upcoming acquisition. The complaint alleges that the patient believed that the information he confided to Dr. Brody during his professional treatment, including information regarding the proposed business combination involving Penril and Bay, would be held in confidence and would not be used by Dr. Brody for his own personal benefit. Nevertheless,

within 15 minutes after the appointment ended, Dr. Brody began to purchase Penril common stock. On that day and the next, Dr. Brody purchased a total of 15,000 shares of Penril stock through two different brokerage firms.

Several days later, on June 17, 1996, Penril and Bay publicly announced that Penril would spin off a business unit to its shareholders and sell the remainder of its business to Bay in a stock transaction valued at \$120 million. The announcement caused Penril's stock price to increase from \$10.00 to \$13.625 per share, or 36.25 percent. Dr. Brody reaped \$38,000 in profits when he sold his shares shortly after the public announcement.

Simultaneous with the filing of the complaint, Dr. Brody consented, without admitting or denying the allegations of the complaint, to the issuance of a final judgment permanently enjoining him from violating the antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws, Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5 promulgated thereunder, and ordering him to pay \$87,558.06, representing disgorgement of his illegal profits, prejudgment interest thereon, and a civil penalty under the Insider Trading Sanctions Act. SEC SUES JEFFREY EHRLICH, MICHAEL EHRLICH, HOWARD GROSSMAN, JOSEPH PALERMO AND ANTHONY VASSALLO FOR INSIDER TRADING

On September 28, the Commission filed a complaint in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York against Jeffrey P. Ehrlich, Michael E. Ehrlich, Howard S. Grossman, Joseph C. Palermo and Anthony P. Vassallo, alleging insider trading in the securities of Edison Brothers Stores Corporation (Edison Brothers) prior to a negative news announcement by Edison Brothers on August 29, 1995.

The Commission's complaint alleges that, on or about August 17, confidential basis, Edison Brothers а CIT/Business Credit to help restructure its debt. The complaint further alleges that, several days later, on August 21, 1995, Anthony P. Vassallo, then an Assistant Vice President and loan officer at The CIT Group/Business Credit, Inc., in violation of his fiduciary duty to his employer, tipped his long-time friend, Jeffrey Ehrlich, about Edison Brothers' deteriorating financial condition. According to the complaint, immediately after Vassallo's illegal tip, Jeffrey Ehrlich purchased short-term, out-of-the-money Edison Brothers put options, betting that the price of Edison Brothers stock would decrease significantly and quickly. complaint alleges that Jeffrey Ehrlich then passed the information on to his brother, Michael P. Ehrlich, who also bought short-term, out-of-the-money Edison Brothers put options. That same day, either or both of the Ehrlichs allegedly tipped their mutual friend, Joseph C. Palermo. Palermo allegedly then purchased Edison Brothers put options and tipped his brother. The complaint also alleges that Michael Ehrlich tipped Howard S. Grossman, who sold Edison Brothers

stock short. After Edison Brothers issued a series of negative announcements on August 29, 1995, Edison Brothers common stock declined by more than 40%. The traders then liquidated their positions, realizing total profits of approximately \$124,000. The complaint alleges that, shortly thereafter, Jeffrey Ehrlich gave \$8,000 of his trading profits to Vassallo.

The Commission's complaint seeks injunctions against Jeffrey Ehrlich, Michael Ehrlich, Howard Grossman, Joseph Palermo and Anthony Vassallo for violating Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (Exchange Act) and Rule 10b-5 thereunder, and against Grossman for violating Section 17(a) of the Securities Act The complaint seeks disgorgement of all profits earned. including prejudgment interest, and civil penalties. Simultaneous with the filing of the complaint, without admitting or denving the allegations of the complaint, Jeffrey Ehrlich, Michael Ehrlich and Vassallo consented to the entry of Final Judgments permanently enjoining them from violating Section 10(b) of the Exchange Act, and Rule 10b-5 thereunder. The Final Judgment as to Michael Ehrlich waives payment of disgorgement and does not impose a civil penalty based on his demonstrated inability to pay. Jeffrey Ehrlich consented to pay disgorgement of \$40,000, with additional amounts in disgorgement and penalty not assessed based on his inability to pay. Vassallo consented to pay \$8,000 in disgorgement, \$2,979.80 in prejudgment interest and an \$8,000 penalty for a total amount of \$18,979.80. [SEC v. Jeffrey P. Ehrlich, Michael E. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

LIBERTY FUNDS TRUST IX, ET AL.

An order has been issued on an application filed by Liberty Funds Trust IX, et al. for an exemption from Section 15(a) of the Investment Company Act and Rule 18f-2 under the Act. The order permits applicants to enter into and materially amend subadvisory agreements without obtaining shareholder approval. (Rel. IC-24056 - September 28)

MAXIM SERIES FUND, INC. ET AL.

An amended order has been issued pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act exempting Maxim Series Fund, Inc. (Maxim Fund) and GW Capital Management, LLC from the provisions of Sections 9(a), 13(a), 15(a) and 15(b) of the Act and Rules 6e-2(b)(15) and 6e-3(T)(b)(15) thereunder to the extent necessary to permit shares of any current or future series of the Maxim Fund to be sold to and held by (1) variable annuity and variable life insurance separate accounts of both affiliated and unaffiliated life insurance companies, and (2) qualified pension and retirement plans outside the separate account context. MASSACHUSETTS INVESTORS TRUST, ET AL.

An order has been issued on an application filed by Massachusetts Investors Trust, et al. under Section 17(d) of the Investment Company Act and Rule 17d-1 under the Act. The order amends a prior order which permits certain registered investment companies to pool cash balances in a joint account for the purpose of investing in short-term investments. The order permits additional entities to rely on the prior order. (Rel. IC-24058 - September 28)

THE GALAXY FUND, ET AL.

An order has been issued on an application filed by The Galaxy Fund, et al. under Section 17(d) of the Investment Company Act and Rule 17d-1 under the Act. The order permits certain registered management investment companies and private accounts to deposit their uninvested cash and cash collateral from securities lending transactions in joint accounts that invest in short-term investments.
