# NOTICE OF INTENTION TO CANCEL REGISTRATIONS OF CERTAIN TRANSFER AGENTS

The Commission has issued a release providing notice that it intends to issue an order, pursuant to Section 17A(c)(4)(B) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, cancelling the registrations of eight transfer agents. The Commission found that these transfer agents are no longer in existence or have ceased doing business as a transfer agent. (Rel. 34-42039)

SEC CHAIRMAN ARTHUR LEVITT, CONGRESSIONAL AND STATE OFFICIALS TO CONDUCT INVESTORS' TOWN MEETING IN ALBUQUERQUE

Chairman Arthur Levitt will conduct an Investors' Town Meeting in Albuquerque, NM, on Saturday, November 20, at the Radisson Hotel and Conference Center. Levitt will discuss how to make informed investment decisions, monitor investments, and avoid costly mistakes.

The free program of practical tips for saving and investing wisely will also feature New Mexico Congresswoman Heather Wilson, New Mexico Securities Division Acting Director William J. Verant, and the Chairman of the U.S. House of Representatives subcommittee that oversees securities regulation, Congressman Michael Oxley.

The Investors' Town Meeting in Albuquerque will be the 33rd of a national series launched five years ago to promote public understanding of the securities markets and awareness of the risks and rewards of investing.

"We have more investors and ways to invest than ever before, creating new opportunities for American families. But investing in the stock market will always entail risk," Levitt said. "The more you know about investments and how they're sold, the more likely you will achieve financial security."

Americans have become increasingly responsible for their own financial security in recent years, especially with the shift from traditional pensions to self-directed 401(k) plans and other retirement accounts. Today, nearly half of America's households own

stocks or bonds directly, through mutual funds, or through pension plans.

"I am very pleased that Chairman Levitt accepted my invitation to come to Albuquerque," Wilson said. "This is a great opportunity for investors and those thinking about investing to hear from the nation's financial leaders. I welcome the Chairman and my good friend Rep. Michael Oxley to the Land of Enchantment."

In addition to the town meeting, the program will include a series of one-hour investing seminars, with sessions on stocks, bonds, mutual funds, and online investing.

"Informative seminars and the chance to question key legislative and regulatory officials make this an opportunity not to be missed," said Verant, whose office will conduct a seminar on choosing an online broker. "The New Mexico Securities Division is proud to participate in this very important and unique opportunity for New Mexicans to get answers to some of the most pressing issues facing investors today."

The Investors' Town Meeting will take place at the Radisson Hotel and Conference Center, 2500 Carlisle Northeast, from 10:00 to 11:45 a.m., followed by investing seminars at 12:00 and 1:00 p.m. Doors will open at 9:00 a.m. so attendees can browse through investor education exhibits and pick up brochures.

# COMMISSION ADOPTS AMENDMENTS TO THE TENDER OFFER AND REGISTRATION RULES RELATING TO CROSS-BORDER TRANSACTIONS

At its open meeting on October 19, 1999, the Commission adopted amendments to the tender offer and registration rules relating to cross-border transactions. U.S. residents holding stock in foreign private issuers are often excluded from tender and exchange offers, business combinations, and rights offerings for the foreign issuers' securities because of conflicts between U.S. and foreign regulation of these offers. The Commission adopted rules that are intended to facilitate the inclusion of U.S. holders of foreign securities in these types of transactions. For further information, please contact Dennis O. # COMMISSION ADOPTS AMENDMENTS TO THE RULES RELATING TO TAKEOVERS AND SECURITY HOLDER COMMUNICATIONS

At its open meeting on October 19, 1999, the Commission adopted amendments to the registration, proxy and tender offer rules relating to business combination transactions and security holder communications. The amendments permit more communications with security holders, balance the treatment of cash and stock tender offers, and update, simplify and harmonize the rules and regulations governing business combination transactions. # ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

# BENJAMIN COOK ARRESTED AND DETAINED

On October 20, 1999, Benjamin Franklin Cook of Carefree, Arizona was located and arrested by U.S. Marshals in a Las Vegas, Nevada casino. A warrant had been issued for Cook's arrest on October 8, 1999, by Judge Jerry Buchmeyer of the United States District Court for the Northern District of Texas, Dallas Division, after finding that Benjamin Franklin Cook was in contempt of the Court.

On March 16, 1999, the Commission filed a proceeding against sixteen individuals and entities, including Cook and his related company, Dennel Finance Limited. The Commission alleges that Cook engaged in a fraudulent scheme to offer and sell unregistered "prime bank" securities throughout the United States. The Commission further alleges that Cook targeted religious groups and persons investing retirement funds, and that he cheated more than 100 investors nationwide of \$30 million in non-existent "prime bank" note

programs. In connection with the Commission's filing, the Court ordered Cook to promptly deliver assets in his control to a court appointed receiver, and ordered that Cook refrain in any way from disturbing those assets. Despite the Court's order, Cook failed or refused to deliver the assets, which included seven cashier's checks totaling \$694,850.

Subsequently, on April 2, 1999, the Court entered a preliminary injunction restraining Cook from making any payment or expenditure of funds and from making any false or untrue statements to investors. In addition, the Court further ordered Cook to repay those funds obtained from investors in his illegal "prime bank" scheme.

Because of Cook's failure to appear before the Court pursuant to an order to show cause, his failure to deliver the assets, and his failure to refrain from interfering with the Commission's subpoenas directed to other persons, Judge Buchmeyer ordered Cook jailed until such time that he complies with the Court's orders, including the return of assets. Judge Buchmeyer also ordered that Cook be fined an additional \$50,000 for each act of interference with the Commission's subpoenas directed to other persons. Additionally, the Court ordered that all pleadings filed by Cook denying the allegations of the Commission be stricken in their entirety.

Cook is being detained by federal authorities and is expected to be transported to Dallas, where he will be incarcerated. [SEC v. Benjamin Franklin Cook, et al., #3-99CV05701-R, USDC, NDTX, Dallas Division] (LR-16341)

# JNL VARIABLE FUND LLC

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until November 15, 1999, to request a hearing on an application filed by JNL Variable Fund LLC (Applicant) for an order under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act exempting Applicant and its series and any other open-end investment company or series thereof advised or managed by Jackson National Life Insurance Company (JNL), Jackson National Financial Services, LLC, or their affiliates, or any entities controlled by or under common control with JNL, and that follows an investment strategy that is the same as the JNL/First Trust Dow Target 5 Series (DJIA 5 Series), the JNL/First Trust Dow Target 10 Series (DJIA 10 Series), the JNL/First Trust Global Target 15 Series (Target 15 Series), or the JNL/First Trust S&P Target 10 Series (S&P Target 10 Series), from the provisions of Section 12(d)(3) of the Act to the extent necessary to permit them to establish and maintain series which may invest up to 10.5% of their total assets (the DJIA 10 Series) or up to 20.5% of their total assets (the DJIA 5 Series), or up to 7 1/6% of their total assets

(the Target 15 Series) or up to 10.5% of their total assets (the S&P Target 10 Series), in securities of issuers that derive more than 15% of their gross revenues from securities related activities. (Rel. IC-24106 - October 21)
