SEC CHAIRMAN ARTHUR LEVITT, CONGRESSIONAL AND STATE OFFICIALS TO CONDUCT INVESTORS' TOWN MEETING IN NEW YORK CITY

The U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission invites New York City area residents who want to know more about investing in the stock market to attend an Investors' Town Meeting at Columbia University on Thursday, December 9, 1999. The free program will give everyday investors an opportunity to hear from the experts on how to invest wisely and achieve financial security.

SEC Chairman Arthur Levitt will offer practical investing tips and answer audience questions at the town meeting, which will also feature U.S. Senator Charles Schumer of New York and Eric Dinallo, New York's Assistant Attorney General in Charge of Investor Protection and Securities. The meeting is sponsored by Columbia Law School and is open to the public.

"We have more investors and ways to invest than ever before, creating new opportunities for American families. But investing in the stock market will always entail risk," Levitt said. "The more you know about investments and how they're sold, the more likely you will achieve financial security."

Americans have become increasingly responsible for their own financial security in recent years, especially with the shift from traditional pensions to self-directed 401(k) plans and other retirement accounts. According to a recent study by the Securities Industry Association and the Investment Company Institute, 48 percent of American families now own stock directly or indirectly through mutual funds.

The Investors' Town Meeting in New York will be the 34th of a national series launched by the SEC five years ago to promote public understanding of the securities markets and awareness of the risks and rewards of investing.

Schumer, a member of the U.S. Senate Subcommittee on Securities, will discuss the benefits and hazards of online investing.

"The Internet has forever changed the face of investing," Schumer said. "Online trading has opened up tremendous opportunities for millions of Americans to now invest for their future from their living rooms. But with 30 percent of retail trades now executed online, investors should understand the risks of investing over the Internet before they trust their money to the World Wide Web."

Dinallo will discuss how the New York Attorney General's Office can help investors protect their savings and outsmart scam artists.

"These days there are numerous boiler room operations being run by scam artists who are working every day to try to rip off investors," Dinallo said. "The best first line of defense for investors is education -- knowing the right questions to ask brokers to avoid scams and prevent yourself from becoming a victim."

In addition to the town meeting, the half-day program will include a series of one-hour investing seminars, with sessions on stocks, bonds, mutual funds, and online investing. The Investors' Town Meeting will take place at the Auditorium at Alfred Lerner Hall, Columbia University, 2920 Broadway (at West 115th Street) from 10:00 to 11:30 a.m., followed by investing seminars at 12:00 and 1:00 p.m. Doors will open at 9:00 a.m. so attendees can browse through investor education exhibits and pick up brochures.

ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

FORMER LAW FIRM EMPLOYEE AND STOCKBROKER CONVICTED OF INSIDER TRADING

The U.S. Attorney's Office for the District of Massachusetts announced on November 23 that, following separate trials in the United States District Court for the District of Massachusetts, James L. D'Angelo, a former stockbroker at PaineWebber, Inc. in Andover, Massachusetts, and John C. Larrabee, the former Director of Fiduciary Services for the Boston law firm of Bingham, Dana & Gould, were each convicted of nine counts of securities fraud for insider trading in the stock of BayBanks, Inc.

The indictment alleged that in early December 1995 Bank of Boston retained Bingham, Dana to represent it in connection with its confidential proposed merger with BayBanks. The indictment alleged that Larrabee learned of the pending deal, and on the afternoon of December 12, 1995, tipped D'Angelo. D'Angelo promptly purchased \$870,048 worth of Baybanks stock in eight accounts that he and his family controlled and a ninth account in the name of his girlfriend. Bank of Boston and BayBanks publicly announced the merger that evening. The next morning, D'Angelo sold all of the stock for an \$86,750 profit.

On March 25, 1997, the Securities and Exchange Commission filed an insider trading complaint against D'Angelo and Larrabee in the United States District Court for the District of Massachusetts. Simultaneously with the filing of the complaint, and without admitting or denying the Commission's allegations, D'Angelo consented to a permanent injunction against future violations of Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5 thereunder, and paid disgorgement of \$86,750, plus prejudgment interest in the amount of \$8,552 and a civil penalty of \$86,750, for a total of \$182,052. In addition, D'Angelo agreed to a Commission order barring him from association with any broker, dealer, municipal securities dealer, investment adviser or investment company. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

SCUDDER CALIFORNIA TAX FREE TRUST, ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 20, 1999 to request a hearing on an application filed by Scudder California Tax Free Trust, et al. for an order granting an exemption from Sections 12(d)(1), 17(a)(1), 17(a)(3), 18(f), and 21(b) of the Investment Company Act. Applicants also seek an order under Section 17(d) of the Act and Rule 17d-1 under the Act to permit certain joint arrangements. The order would permit certain registered investment companies to participate in a joint lending and borrowing facility. (Rel. IC-24174 - November 23)

MAS FUNDS, ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 20, 1999 to request a hearing on an application flied by MAS Funds, et al. for an order under Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act granting an exemption from Sections 18(f) and 21(b) of the Act; under Section 12(d)(1)(J) of the Act granting an exemption from Section 12(d)(1) of the Act; under Sections 6(c) and 17(b) of the Act granting an exemption from Sections 17(a)(1) and 17(a)(3) of the Act; and under Section 17(d) of the Act and Rule 17d-1 under the Act. The order would permit certain registered management investment companies to participate in a joint lending and borrowing facility. (Rel. IC-24175 - November 23)

INVESCO BOND FUNDS, INC., ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until December 20, 1999 to request a hearing on an application filed by INVESCO Bond Funds, Inc., et al. (Funds) for an order exempting applicants from Sections 12(d)(1), 17(a)(1) and (3), 18(f), and 21(b) of the Investment Company Act and under Section 17(d) of the Act and Rule 17d-1. The order would permit the Funds to participate in a joint lending and borrowing facility. (Rel. IC-24176 - November 24)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The <u>International Securities Clearing Corporation</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-ISCC-99-01) under Section 19(b)(1) of the Exchange Act. Under the proposed rule change, ISCC will withdraw from the clearance and settlement business and transfer its Global Clearance Network and International Link Service to the National Securities Clearing Corporation. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of November 29. (Rel. 34-42175)

The <u>National Securities Clearing Corporation</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-NSCC-99-12) under Section 19(b)(1) of the Exchange Act. The proposed rule change would allow NSCC to offer services previously offered by International Securities Clearing Corporation concurrent with ISCC's withdrawal from the clearance and settlement business. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of November 29. (Rel. 34-42176)

ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission granted approval of a proposed rule change (SR-MBSCC-99-06) filed by the MBS Clearing Corporation under Section 19(b) of the Securities Exchange Act. The proposed rule change will amend the formula MBSCC uses to calculate market margin differential deposits. Publication is expected in the Federal Register during the week of November 29. (Rel. 34-42173)

IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

A proposed rule change (SR-NYSE-99-45) filed by the <u>New York Stock Exchange</u> has become effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The rule change would add the failure to comply with the provisions of Rule 97(a) and the failure to comply with Expiration Day Auxiliary Opening Procedures to the List of Exchange Rule Violations and Fines. Publication of the notice in the <u>Federal Register</u> is expected during the week of November 29. (Rel. 34-42174)

A proposed rule change filed by the <u>Pacific Exchange</u> to increase the Market Maker Ticket Data Order Entry Fee (SR-PCX-99-47) has become effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.
