AMERICAN ELECTRIC POWER. The SEC has issued an order under the Holding Company Act (Release 35-15036) ermitting American Electric Power Company, Inc., New York holding company, and its subsidiaries, to utilize method of allocation of the group's consolidated income tax liabilities which will give to each company ncluded in the consolidated tax returns of the parent and its subsidiaries, approximately the full investent credit each company contributes to the total investment credit allowed in the consolidated tax return.

UNLISTED TRADING GRANTED. The SEC has issued orders under the Securities Exchange Act granting an pplication of the Boston Stock Exchange for unlisted trading privileges in the common stocks of American hotocopy Equipment Company and Control Data Corporation (Release 34-7279).

BOOTH FISHERIES DELISTED. The SEC has issued an order under the Securities Exchange Act granting an pplication of the Midwest Stock Exchange to delist the common stock of Booth Fisheries Corporation, 95% of hich has been acquired by Consolidated Foods Corp. (Release 34-7279)

SEC DIRECTORY OF REPORTING COMPANIES. The "DIRECTORY of Companies Filing Annual Reports with the ecurities and Exchange Commission," listing 4,448 issuers of securities which as of July 1963 were required of file reports under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, is now available for purchase at \$1.25 per copy from the Superintendent of Documents, U. S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C. 20402. Copies are vailable for inspection at all offices of the Commission.

LONE STAR GAS FILES STOCK PLAN. Lone Star Gas Company, 301 S. Harwood St., Dallas, filed a registraion statement (File 2-22188) with the SEC on March 23 seeking registration of \$916,000 of interests in the imployee Stock Purchase Plan for the company, Lone Star Producing Company and Lone Star Gathering Company.

AUTOMATIC CANTEEN FILES STOCK PLAN. Automatic Canteen Company of America, Merchandise Mart Plaza, hicago, filed a registration statement (File 2-22197) with the SEC on March 25 seeking registration of 39,859 common shares, to be offered under the company's Employee Stock Purchase Plan and Restricted Stock ptions.

TWO REGISTRATIONS REVOKED. The SEC today announced a decision under the Securities Exchange Act (Re-ease 34-7277) revoking the broker-dealer registrations of Edward H. Stern & Co., Inc., and Chermil Capital orp., both of 32 Broadway, New York, N. Y. Both firms also were expelled from membership in the National ssociation of Securities Dealers, Inc; and Richard Litt, president and controlling stockholder of Stern and Chermil, was found to be a cause of the order. The two firms and Litt consented to the revocation and expulsion order.

According to the Commission's decision, during the period from December 1962 to April 1963, Stern & Co., together with or aided and abetted by Litt, willfully violated the registration and anti-fraud provisions of the Federal securities laws in the offer and sale of stock of Regal Factors, Inc. In connection with the offering of this stock by Stern Co., as underwriter, according to the decision, Stern and Litt failed to transmit promptly to the persons entitled thereto money and other consideration received in payment for ecurities, instead placing the proceeds in Litt's personal bank account. They also used an offering ircular which failed to disclose the value of Regal's assets, liabilities and capital shares as of October 1, 1962. Violations by Stern & Co. of the Commission's net capital and record-keeping rules also were found by the Commission.

Since Litt is an officer and controlling person of Chermil, his acts were the basis for the order revoking that firm's registration.

COLONIAL LIFE FILES FOR SECONDARY. Colonial Life & Accident Insurance Company, 1612 Marion St., Columbia, S. C., filed a registration statement (File 2-22199) with the SEC on March 25 seeking registration of 241,892 outstanding shares of class B non-voting common stock. The present holders thereof propose to make a public offering of these shares through an underwriting group headed by Equitable Securities Corp., Union St., Nashville, Tenn. The offering price (\$16 per share maximum*) and underwriting terms are to be supplied by amendment.

The company's principal business is that of providing personal accident insurance to individuals and groups; however, it has in force a small amount of individual life insurance and health insurance. It is resently selling policies in 20 states (primarily in the Southeast) and is licensed in 15 other states. The company has outstanding 168,000 shares of class A voting stock (of which E. F. Averyt, board chairman and president, owns 51.8% and J. C. Judy, vice president, 38.3%) and 1,072,400 shares of class B non-voting common stock. The prospectus lists 24 selling stockholders, including eight management officials. Among the selling stockholders are Averyt (offering 14,000 of 81,284 class B shares), Judy (offering 36,932 of 120,400 class B shares), Mrs. E. F. Averyt (offering 58,240 of 182,000 class B shares), and Frances Bell Judy

(offering 31,948 of 159,740 Class B shares). The other stockholders propose to sell shares ranging in amount from 112 to 14,560 shares. After this offering, management holdings of Class B shares will be reduced from 353,640 to 261,548 shares (24.4%) and the holdings of the wives and children of management officials from 578,480 to 439,852 shares (41%).
