ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

ORDER INSTITUTING PUBLIC ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS AND NOTICE OF HEARING PURSUANT TO SECTIONS 15(b) AND 19(h) OF THE SECURITIES EXCHANGE ACT OF 1934 AND SECTION 203(f) OF THE INVESTMENT ADVISERS ACT OF 1940

The Commission announced that on February 29 it instituted public administrative proceedings against Quest Capital Strategies, Inc. (Quest), a registered broker-dealer, and David Chen Yu (Yu), Quest's president. The Order alleges that Quest and Yu failed reasonably to supervise a former Quest registered representative, John T. Nakoski (Nakoski), with a view to preventing Nakoski's violations of the federal securities laws. From December 1991 to August 1993, Nakoski defrauded approximately thirty-five investors of approximately \$450,000 by means of a Fixed Income Loan Agreement" (Note), pursuant to which he guaranteed principal and interest on investments through his investment business. Among other things, Nakoski misrepresented the safety of the Notes and the use of investors' monies. Nakoski, in fact, used investors' money to invest in futures and futures options and for personal and business expenses.

A hearing will be scheduled to determine whether the allegations against Quest and Yu are true, and, if so, what remedial action, if any, is appropriate. (Rel. Nos. 34-36909; IA-1555)

COMMISSION SUSTAINS ADMINISTRATIVE SANCTION AGAINST ROBIN RUSHING AND HAROLD GALLISON, JR.

The Commission today announced that an Administrative Law Judge's initial decision involving Robin Rushing and Harold Gallison, Jr., has become the final decision of the Commission, the period within which the parties may have petitioned the Commission for review thereof having expired and no review petitions having been filed. The law judge directed Robin Rushing and Harold Gallison, Jr. to cease and desist from committing or causing any violation of Section 15(c)(2) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 15c2-11 promulgated under that provision, and from committing or causing any future violations of this provision and rule.

The law judge found that Rushing and Gallison aided and abetted their firm's, Burnett Gray Inc 's (Burnett), violations of Section 15(c)(2) of the Exchange Act and Rule 15c2-11 thereunder. The Commission had suspended trading in Astro Enterprises, Inc. (Astro) securities, noting that there was a lack of adequate information and that questions had been raised about the adequacy and accuracy of Astro's disclosure. Rushing and Gallison caused Burnett to make a market in Astro after the suspension was concluded without obtaining the required financial information. Although Burnett had Astro's pro forma financial statements for 1989, the law judge found Burnett had a "compelling basis" for doubting their veracity and accuracy. (Rel. 34-36910)

COMMISSION SUSTAINS ADMINISTRATIVE SANCTION AGAINST GARY SMITH

The Commission today announced that an Administrative Law Judge's initial decision involving Gary A. Smith of Ann Arbor, Michigan, has become the final decision of the Commission, the period within which the parties may have petitioned the Commission for review thereof having expired and no review petitions having been filed.

The sanction provided that Gary A. Smith be barred from association with any investment adviser. The law judge found that Smith had been permanently enjoined from continuing to operate in violation of the registration, disclosure, and recordkeeping provisions of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940, and the rules thereunder. In addition, he had failed to provide adequate safeguards for customer funds and to provide a nonassignability clause in his client contracts. The law judge further found that Smith had defaulted by failing to file an answer in the instant case and failing to appear at a hearing of which he had notice. As permitted under the Rules of Practice when a party defaults, the law judge deemed the allegations in the order instituting proceedings to be true.

In imposing the sanctions, the law judge found it was in the public interest to bar Smith from participating in the securities industry. His conduct had been blatant and continued over a seven-year period. In addition, the law judge found, Smith's irrational death threats against federal government employees indicate that Smith does not have the temperament and judgment required of a person who acts as a fiduciary in a position of trust and responsibility. A notice of application and a temporary order has been issued under Section 9(c) of the Investment Company Act that exempts McDonald & Company Securities, Inc. from Section 9(a) of the Act for sixty days solely with respect to a criminal conviction entered in the Common Pleas Court of Franklin County, Ohio, on February 29, 1996. Interested persons may request a hearing on the application for permanent exemption by submitting a request no later than the date specified in the <u>Federal Register</u>. (Rel. LEXINGTON SHORT-INTERMEDIATE GOVERNMENT SECURITIES FUND, INC.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until March 26 to request a hearing on an application filed by Lexington Short-Intermediate Government Securities Fund, Inc. for an order under Section 8(f) of the Investment Company Act declaring that applicant has ceased to be an investment company.
