RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

ORDER GRANTING APPLICATION FILED BY CENTRAL TRANSPORT RENTAL GROUP PLC

The Commission has issued an order under Section 304(d) of the Trust Indenture Act of 1939 (Act) on an application by Central Transport Rental Group plc (Company) with respect to an indenture (Indenture) among the Company, its wholly-owned direct and indirect subsidiaries specified in the Indenture and State Street Bank and Trust Company, as trustee, conditionally exempting specified provisions of the Indenture from the requirements of Section 314(d) of the Act to the extent such requirements otherwise would apply. ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

NEW YORK STOCK EXCHANGE DISCIPLINARY ACTION AGAINST GARY ROTH SET ASIDE

The Commission has set aside New York Stock Exchange, Inc. (NYSE) disciplinary action taken against Gary Roth of New York, New York. The NYSE charged that Roth, formerly an Options Trading Rights Holder on the NYSE Options Trading Floor, offensively touched an employee of a member organization of the NYSE on two occasions while Roth and the employee worked on the Floor.

The Commission agreed with the NYSE that offensive touching on the NYSE Floor is chargeable as conduct both inconsistent with just and equitable principles and detrimental to the interest and welfare of the NYSE. The Commission determined, however, on its review of the record, that the NYSE hearing panel's decision, which had been overturned by the NYSE Board of Directors, should stand. The Commission explained that because the hearing panel had the opportunity to hear the witnesses' testimony firsthand and to judge their demeanor and credibility, the panel stood in the best position to evaluate Roth's contacts with the employee. The Commission accordingly set aside the findings of violation and sanctions imposed. (Rel. 34-37221)

COMMISSION INSTITUTES CEASE-AND-DESIST AND RULE 102(e) PROCEEDING AGAINST MERMELSTEIN AND STEPHAN, CPAS

The Commission entered an Order pursuant to Section 21C of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (Exchange Act) and Rule 102(e) of the Commission's Rules of Practice against Milton Mermelstein, CPA (Mermelstein) and Frank E. Stephan, Jr., CPA (Stephan), and accepted their offers of settlement consenting to the entry of the Order without admitting or denying the findings therein. Mermelstein is ordered to cease and desist from violating, or causing violations of, certain of the antifraud, reporting and record-keeping provisions of the Exchange Act and is denied the privilege of practicing before the Commission as an accountant with a right to apply to resume practicing after five years; and Stephan is denied the privilege of practicing before the Commission as an accountant with the right to apply to resume practicing after two years.

The Order finds that Mermelstein violated, or caused the violations of, the Exchange Act by instructing Everlast Filtration Corp. (Everlast) to overstate its assets for 1989 and 1990 in reports filed with the Commission and by issuing false audit reports. The Order further finds that Mermelstein and Stephan engaged in improper professional conduct in audits of Everlast's financial statements by failing to plan adequately their work, obtain sufficient evidence, exercise due professional care and issue accurate audit reports. PERMANENT INJUNCTION ENTERED IN \$54 MILLION PONZI SCHEME

The Commission announced that on May 3 an order of permanent injunction was entered in United States District Court in Dallas, Texas, against Melvin H. Cox (Cox) in connection with a \$54 million "Ponzi" scheme involving approximately 3500 investors residing in 34 states and Canada. The Commission's complaint alleged that Cox promised investors that their monies would be used to trade in first and second mortgages and would result in a return of 12.8% (later 13.4%) every 45 days, a compounded return of as much as 160% a year.

In fact, according to the complaint, investors' monies were loaned to 12 corporations, who are relief defendants in this matter, at interest rates of 6-8% per annum.

Without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's complaint, Cox consented to be enjoined from future violations of the securities registration and antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws. The order further provides for disgorgement of ill-gotten gains and a civil money penalty in amounts to be determined by agreement of the parties, or, in absence of such agreement, to be set by the Court. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

VALLEY FORGE LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY, ET AL.

An order has been issued to Valley Forge Life Insurance Company (VFLIC), Valley Forge Life Insurance Company Variable Annuity Separate Account (Separate Account), and CNA Investor Services, Inc. (collectively, Applicants) pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Investment Company Act granting exemptions from Sections 26(a)(2)(C) and 27(c)(2) of the Act. The order provides exemptions to the extent necessary to permit the deduction of a mortality and expense risk charge from the assets of the Separate Account or any other separate account (Other Accounts) established in the future by VFLIC to support certain flexible premium individual deferred variable annuity contracts (Contracts) as well as other variable annuity contracts issued in the future by VFLIC, through the Separate Account or Other Accounts, which are materially similar to the Contracts.
