ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

COMMISSION ORDERS TRADING SUSPENSION IN SECURITIES OF THE HOME LINK CORPORATION

On June 10, the Commission announced that pursuant to Section 12(k) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 it issued an order suspending trading in the securities of The Home Link Corporation (Home Link), a Ft. Lauderdale-based company purportedly engaged in the business of providing long distance video telephone service. The order was issued based on what appeared to be a lack of current and accurate information concerning the securities of Home Link, and by others, in documents sent to and statements made to market-makers of the stock of Home Link, other broker-dealers, and to investors concerning, among other things, the number of shares of common stock

of the company currently outstanding, the current capitalization of the company, whether the company is in fact pursuing a NASDAQ listing, and the future business prospects of the company. Pursuant to the Commission's order, trading in the securities were ordered suspended for the period from 9:30 a.m. EDT, June 10, 1996, through 11:59 p.m. EDT, on June 21, 1996.

BENJAMIN MOSES BARRED IN INVESTMENT CLUB SCHEME

The Commission today issued an order instituting proceedings, making findings and imposing remedial sanctions against Benjamin Rex Moses (Moses), formerly a registered representative of H.D. Vest Investment Securities, Inc. (Vest). Moses consented to the entry of the Order without admitting or denying the Commission's findings, except the entry of a permanent injunction against him which he admits. The Order bars Moses from association with any broker, dealer, municipal securities dealer, investment adviser or investment company.

The Order finds that Moses, without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's complaint, consented to the entry of an injunction in United States District Court, Houston, Texas, permanently enjoining him from violations of the antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws. The Commission's complaint alleged that Moses organized an investment club over which he had discretionary authority and sought to open a trading account at Vest for the club; however, Vest rejected the application as being prohibited by firm policy and Moses then designated an investor to serve as attorney-in-fact on the account's documentation papers while he maintained control over the account's trading. Thereafter, Moses allegedly represented to investors that they would realize a 20% return on their investment and lied to investors by telling them the account was performing positively, when, in fact, it was not. The complaint further alleged that Moses created and mailed to some investors, false account statements with fictitious account balances and trading profits. (Rel. 34-37286)

DISTRICT COURT ORDERS INJUNCTION, DISGORGEMENT AND PENALTIES AGAINST JOSEPH PALMISANO

The Commission announced today that the United States District Court for the District of Vermont ordered former Barre, Vermont lawyer Joseph C. Palmisano (Palmisano) to pay a total of \$9.6 million comprising disgorgement, prejudgment interest, and a penalty, in connection with his violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws.

In a decision granting the Commission's motion for summary judgment, the District Court found that Palmisano had failed to demonstrate that there was a dispute of material fact to the evidence submitted by the Commission in support of its motion. The Commission's motion papers show that Palmisano made false and misleading statements to investors, including telling investors their money would be pooled in a fund and used to purchase property and inventory from bankrupt companies at a discount, which would then be resold at a profit. The Commission's papers show that these representations were false. Not only was there no evidence that Palmisano used any investor money to make purchases on behalf of investors, but also the evidence showed that Palmisano diverted investor money for his personal use, used investors' money to make payments to earlier investors, and commingled investor money with his own.

On September 5, 1995, Palmisano pleaded guilty to criminal charges in connection with the above and was sentenced to 188 months in prison. He is currently serving his sentence. [SEC v. Palmisano, 2: 94 CV 205, USDC, DVt] (LR-14938)

CIVIL ACTION AGAINST STANLEY FEMINELLA AND DAVID GRANSTON

The Commission announced that the Honorable Allen G. Schwartz of the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York has entered final judgment as to David W. Granston. On January 18, 1996, the Commission filed a complaint alleging as follows: Granston, the former chief financial officer of Consumers Union of United States, Inc. (CU), received kickbacks from Stanley J. Feminella, CU's former stockbroker, beginning no later than May 1985 and continuing for a period of years thereafter. These kickbacks were intended to ensure that Granston would continue to funnel to Feminella CU's lucrative securities investment business. engaging in this fraudulent kickback scheme Granston violated Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Exchange Rule 10b-5. Granston consented without admitting or denying the allegations of the complaint to the entry of the final judgment, which permanently enjoins him from future violations of Section 10(b) and Rule 10b-5 and orders him to pay a civil penalty of \$10,000.

The litigation continues as to Feminella, the remaining defendant. [SEC v. Stanley J. Feminella and David W. Granston, Civil Action No. 96 CIV 336, AGS, SDNY] (LR-14939)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission granted approval to a proposed rule change (SR-Amex-96-14) filed by the <u>American Stock Exchange</u> to amend Articles II, III and XII of the Exchange Constitution relating to the Board of Governors. The amendments permit the appointment of a second Vice-Chairman, allow for the inclusion of the second highest ranking Exchange executive officer on the Board, and permit certain Governors to be eligible for nomination to a third term. Publication of the order is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of June 10. (Rel. 34-37281)

PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The <u>National Association of Securities Dealers</u> filed a proposed rule change to amend the NASD's By-Laws. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of June 10. (Rel. 34-37282)
