The Order Execution Obligations Rules included proposed amendments to Rule 11Ac1-1 (Quote Rule), proposed Rule 11Ac1-4 (Limit Order Display Rule), and proposed Rule 11Ac1-5 (Price Improvement Rule). These proposed amendments and rules were designed to improve the handling and execution of customer

orders, and to publicize prices of customer limit orders and orders entered in electronic communications networks that allow exchange specialists and over-the-counter market makers to trade at prices that are superior to their public quotes. ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

INITIAL DECISION SUSPENDS JACOB WONSOVER FROM ASSOCIATION WITH A BROKER OR DEALER FOR SIX MONTHS AND ORDERS HIM TO CEASE AND DESIST FROM VIOLATIONS OF SECTIONS 5(a) AND 5(c) OF SECURITIES ACT

Administrative Law Judge Burton S. Kolko ordered in an initial decision released today that Respondent Jacob Wonsover be barred from association with a broker or dealer for six months and that he cease and desist from committing any violation or causing any future violation of Sections 5(a) and 5(c) of the Securities Act of 1933. Judge Kolko found that during the period August 1989 through October 1990, Respondent Wonsover sold a total of 924,000 shares of common stock of Gil-Med Industries, Inc., that were not registered pursuant to the securities laws. Accordingly, the judge found that Mr. Wonsover sold unregistered securities in violation of Sections 5(a) and 5(c) of the Securities Act. (Initial Decision Rel. 96)

ANTHONY ESCOBAR BARRED FROM PARTICIPATING IN ANY PENNY STOCK OFFERING

On August 19, the Commission issued an order instituting public administrative proceedings under the Securities Exchange 1st of 1934 against Authony Escapar (Escaper), and simultaneously accepted Escaper's Offer of Settlement.

Without admitting or denying the findings, Escobar consented to the issuance of the order which found that on July 31, 1996, Escobar was permanently enjoined in United States District Court for the Western District of Oklahoma, in an action SEC v. Royal American Management, Inc., et al. Escobar consented to the entry of the injunction

without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's complaint which charged Escobar with violating the registration and antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws based on his participation in the offering of the common stock of Omnet Corporation, a penny stock company.

The order provides that Escobar be barred from participating in any offering of penny stock. (Rel. 34-37584)

KARL DAHLSTROM AND THREE OTHERS INDICTED

The Commission and the United States Attorney for the Southern District of Texas announced that on August 14 a federal grand jury returned a 16-count indictment charging Karl L. Dahlstrom (Dahlstrom), Karla D. Dahlstrom, Hubert Leon Leopard, and Richard E. Lopez with conspiracy, violating the securities and broker-dealer registration provisions of the federal securities laws, securities fraud, and wire fraud for their involvement in a nationwide solicitation campaign for the purpose of selling unregistered shares of Inferno Snuffers, Inc., (ISI), and Inferno Engineering and Consulting, Inc. (IEC). If convicted, each of the four could receive up to 10 years in prison and a \$1 million fine.

The criminal charges are based on the same activities alleged in a civil injunctive action brought by the Commission on September 30, 1992. On October 6, 1993, Dahlstrom consented to the entry of a Final Judgment which enjoins him from future violations of the antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws. Previously, on July 9, 1993, the Court granted Partial Summary Judgment against Dahlstrom and entered an Order of Permanent Injunction enjoining him from future violations of the securities registration and brokerdealer registration provisions of federal securities laws.

The Commission's complaint alleged that ISI and IEC, operating under Dahlstrom's direction, were purportedly marketing "Uni-Snuff", a product claimed to be useful in extinguishing and suppressing fires, and the "Snuffer System", a method of dispensing Uni-Snuff. HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

CINERGY CORP., ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until September 9 to request a hearing on proposals by Cinergy Corp. (Cinergy), a registered holding company, and its wholly-owned public-utility subsidiary company, The Cincinnati Gas & Electric Company (CG&E). CG&E requests authorization to amend its Articles of Incorporation to remove a provision limiting the issuance of unsecured debt securities (Proposed Amendment) and to solicit proxies from the holders of its outstanding shares of preferred and common stock (Proxy Solicitation) for use at a special stockholders' meeting

(Special Meeting) to consider the Proposed Amendment, to be held on or about September 18, 1996. An order has been issued authorizing a Proxy Solicitation with respect to the Proposed Amendment. Concurrently with the commencement of the Proxy Solicitation by CG&E, Cinergy proposes to make a tender offer to the holders of each series of CG&E's preferred stock to acquire for cash, subject to specified terms and conditions, any and all shares of such stock. Cinergy requests authorization to acquire the tendered shares. (Rel. 35-26555)

GENERAL PUBLIC UTILITIES CORPORATION, ET AL.

An order has been issued authorizing General Public Utilities Corporation, a registered holding company, and its subsidiary companies, Jersey Central Power & Light Company, Metropolitan Edison Company, Pennsylvania Electric Company, Energy Initiatives, Inc., and GPU Service Corporation, to provide various engineering and consulting services; invest through December 31, 1998, up to an aggregate principal amount of \$25 million in such services; and provide such services beyond the boundaries of their existing utility service territories. APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change filed by the <u>Boston Stock Exchange</u> (SR-BSE-96-05) to modify its Specialist Performance Evaluation Program. (Rel. 34-37581)

PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The <u>National Securities Clearing Corporation</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-NSCC-96-14) seeking permanent approval on the amount of a members clearing fund required deposit that may be collateralized by letters of credit. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of August 26. (Rel. 34-37582)

The Commission received a proposed rule change filing (SR-NYSE-96-25) by the <u>New York Stock Exchange</u> to amend its listing standards for Equity-Linked Debt Securities (ELDS). These listing standards are contained in Para. 703.21 of its Listed Company Manual. Publication of the notice is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of August 26. (Rel. 34-3738).
