# **COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS**

#### DAVID LEVINE SELECTED AS CHIEF OF STAFF

Acting Chairman Laura Unger has selected David M. Levine as Chief of Staff. Since May 1998, Mr. Levine has served as Senior Adviser to Richard Walker, Director of the Commission's Division of Enforcement. Prior to that time, Mr. Levine served as Special Assistant to the Commission's General Counsel and as an enforcement attorney in the Commission's Northeast Regional Office.

#### ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

### ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDING AGAINST ALLAN SCHAEFER

The following is a corrected version of an article entitled "IN THE MATTER OF ALLAN SCHAEFER" that appeared in yesterday's Digest.

On February 23, the Commission instituted, and simultaneously settled, a public administrative proceeding against Allan G. Schaefer. The proceeding was based on an injunction entered against Schaefer on December 5, 2000, in a Commission action filed in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York.

The Commission's complaint in the injunctive action alleged that in February 1997 Schaefer illegally tipped two associates to trade on material, non-public information regarding Scholastic Corporation's earnings shortfall for the third quarter of fiscal 1997, which Scholastic disclosed to the public the day after Schaefer's tip. The Commission also alleged that Schaefer had obtained the information from his sister, Leslye Schaefer, an officer of Scholastic Productions, a wholly-owned subsidiary of Scholastic, and that Schaefer's associates reaped illicit profits of approximately \$141,693 from Schaefer's tip. In the injunctive action, Schaefer consented, without admitting or denying the Commission's allegations, to a court order permanently enjoining him from future violations of Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5 thereunder. Schaefer also agreed to pay a \$50,000 civil money penalty Schaefer's sister and two associates also consented, without admitting or denying the Commission's

allegations, to permanent injunctions and to pay \$141,693.75 in disgorgement and \$137,343.75 in civil money penalties (See Litigation Release 16815, Dec. 4, 2000).

In the administrative proceeding based on the injunction, Schaefer consented, without admitting or denying the Commission's findings, to a Commission order barring him from association with any broker or dealer, with the right to reapply for association after one year. # ALLEGHENY ENERGY, INC., ET AL.
