COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

DOUGLAS DAVISON TO LEAVE THE COMMISSION

Douglas Davison, Legal Counsel to former Chairman Arthur Levitt, will leave the Commission to join the Washington, D C law office of Wilmer, Cutler & Pickering as Counsel. As Legal Counsel since August 2000, Mr. Davison advised Chairman Levitt on all aspects of the Commission's enforcement program. Prior to that time, Mr. Davison served as a branch chief in the Division of Enforcement. He began his tenure at the Commission in 1997, serving first as a staff attorney and later as a senior counsel in the Division of Enforcement.

ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

JOHN BROWNSON, DARLAN GORDON AND DOUGLAS PARKS BARRED

John S. Brownson of Las Vegas, Nevada, and Darlan Gordon and Douglas Parks of Chicago, Illinois, have been barred from association with a broker-dealer. The sanctions were ordered in an administrative proceeding before an administrative law judge.

Brownson, Gordon, and Parks had been convicted in 1999 of conspiracy to commit securities and, mail fraud, and wire fraud and sentenced to prison Each was a stockbroker who took pay-offs from a stock promoter in return for inducing customers to buy certain stock.

ALLEGED PROMOTER OF FRAUDULENT TRADING SCHEME CRIMINALLY INDICTED ON 5 COUNTS OF MAIL FRAUD AND 2 COUNTS OF WIRE FRAUD

The Commission announced that, on February 28, 2001, Nancy J. Cheal (Cheal) was indicted in the District of Massachusetts on 7 criminal charges, including 5 counts of mail fraud and 2 counts of wire fraud. On March 2, 2001, Cheal was arrested and was released on a \$100,000 secured bond. The criminal charges allege that Cheal executed a false scheme e by which she defrauded thousands of people of more than \$2.1 million through her operation of a purported international bank debenture trading program. The criminal charges alleged that Cheal represented that she was the president of a business named "Relief Enterprise", which was operated from two of Cheal's trailer homes in Florida. Victims of the scheme were allegedly promised that they would receive a 100% return per week for twelve consecutive weeks.

On January 31, 2000, the Commission filed a Complaint against Cheal (d/b/a Relief Enterprise) and against Richard L. Birmingham (Birmingham), a relief defendant, alleging that Cheal violated the general antifraud and securities registration provisions of

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the federal securities laws (Sections 5(a) and (c) and 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 and Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rule 10b-5 thereunder. The Commission's allegations arose from the same underlying factual conduct described in the criminal allegations. On February 1, 2000, the United States District Court for the District of Massachusetts granted the Commission's motion for an *ex parte* order and, among other things, temporarily restrained the fraudulent activities, froze assets of Cheal and Birmingham and froze the proceeds of the offering. On February 15, 2000, after a hearing, the Court entered a Preliminary Injunction and Order for Other Equitable Relief against Cheal (d/b/a Relief Enterprise) and against Birmingham. Among other things, the Order continued the asset freeze.

On April 27, 2000, the United States District Court for the District of Massachusetts granted a motion brought by the United States Attorney's Office to stay the proceedings in the case brought by the Commission.

FEDERAL COURT FINDS 2 ARIZONA BROKERS LIABLE FOR SECURITIES FRAUD AND MANIPULATION AFTER 5-DAY COURT TRIAL

The Commission announced that on March 22 the United States District Court for the District c. Arizona, issued a judgment against two Arizona brokers whom the Commission charged with committing securities fraud and market manipulation. The two defendant brokers are Brett L. Bouchy (Bouchy), 33, and Richard C. Whelan (Whelan), 36, both now residing in Florida. The Court's judgment permanently enjoins the defendants from future violations of the federal securities laws and assesses a \$50,000 civil penalty against each of them.

The Commission's complaint alleged that Bouchy and Whelan: (1) received undisclosed side payments for their stock recommendations to their brokerage customers; (2) stole funds from one of their clients; (3) fraudulently sold this same client securities without disclosing that they (Bouchy and Whelan) owned the securities personally and that they would earn about a 200% profit from the transaction; and (4) used nominee accounts to profit from the false closing of a public securities offering.

The Complaint further alleged that Bouchy and Whelan failed to disclose material facts in connection with an initial public offering (IPO) they ran through a brokerage firm they controlled, namely: (1) that the IPO securities would be placed in a nominee account; and (2) that the brokerage firm would restrict retail sales of the IPO securities by instituting a no net sales policy. The Complaint also alleged that the brokerage firm solicited aftermarket orders before the IPO itself took place.

The Commission's enforcement action sought permanent injunctions from future violations of the antifraud and antimanipulation provisions of the federal securities laws, disgorgement and civil penalties against Bouchy and Whelan for their violations of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933, Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Rules 10b-5, 10b-6 and 10b-9 thereunder. [SEC v. Brett L. Bouchy and Richard C. Whelan, Case No. CIV-96-2629-PHX-SRB, D. Ariz.] (LR-16943)

CIVIL ACTION AGAINST GATEWAY TECHNOLOGIES, INC., ET AL.

The Commission announced today that the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Florida entered final judgments imposing permanent injunctive and other relief against all defendants in a case the Commission filed in May 1999 against Gateway Technologies, Inc. (Gateway), The Cheyenne Holding Corp. (Cheyenne), Randolph S. Ross and Timothy J Kavanagh. The Commission alleged that all defendants violated Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 (Securities Act) and Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (Exchange Act) and Rule 10b-5 thereunder by offering and selling investments in Gateway -- a company purportedly building an internet telephone system -- by way of false, misleading and incomplete information. It also alleged that defendants Cheyenne, Ross and Kavanagh violated Section 15(a) of the Exchange Act by acting as brokers while ... t registered with the Commission.

The Court entered a default final judgment against Gateway on June 30, 2000, permanently enjoining Gateway from violating Securities Act Section 17(a) and Exchange Act Section 10(b) and Rule 10b-5, and ordering payment of \$3.3 million in disgorgement, over \$300,000 in prejudgment interest, and a civil penalty of \$110,000. The Court entered final judgments against Cheyenne, Ross and Kavanagh by consent on August 7, 2000, permanently enjoining these defendants from violating Section 17(a) of the Securities Act and Sections 10(b) and 15(a) of the Exchange Act and Rule 10b-5. The judgments against Cheyenne and Ross further order that these defendants are jointly and sever...ly liable for disgorgement of \$1,373,378.21 plus prejudgment interest, but payment of all but \$70,805 47 of that amount was waived as to Cheyenne, and payment of the entire amount was waived as to Ross, and no civil penalties were imposed based upon the demonstrated inability of Cheyenne and Ross to pay. The judgment against Kavanagh orders that Kavanagh is liable for disgorgement of \$20,000 plus prejudgment interest, but payment of the disgorgement was waived and no civil penalties were imposed based upon Kavanagh's demonstrated inability to pay.

The Commission filed its complaint in the United States District Court for the Southern District of Florida, since Cheyenne was located in Delray Beach, Florida and Ross and Kavanagh lived in the Delray Beach area Gateway was based in Santa Monica, California The Court entered temporary restraining orders and preliminary injunctions against all defendants in May and June of 1999. COMMISSION SEEKS EMERGENCY RELIEF IN CONNECTION WITH \$276 MILLION OFFERING FRAUD

On March 21, the Honorable Marilyn L. Huff, United States District Judge for the Southern District of California, issued a temporary restraining order regarding an ongoing \$276 million securities fraud by Michael J. Fanghella (Fanghella), James L. Hillman (Hillman), PinnFund USA, Inc. (PinnFund) and entities controlled by Fanghella and Hillman (Funding Entities). The Court: (1) ordered the defendants to cease immediately their fraudulent activities, (2) placed a freeze on the assets of Fanghella and PinnFund; (3) appointed Charles G. La Bella as a temporary receiver over PinnFund pending a hearing to determine the full extent of the f-audulent conduct; and (4) granted other relief. The March 23, 2001 order follows the issuance of an order by the Court on March 21, 2001, which prohibited the transfer of assets or property by the defendants to a foreign location, prohibited the destruction of documents by the defendants and granted other relief pending a hearing that was held on march 22 and 23. A hearing on whether a preliminary injunction should be issued against the defendants is scheduled for April 2, 2001.

The Commission's complaint alleges that since 1993, Fanghella, Hillman, PinnFund and the Funding Entities have raised at least \$276 million from at least 166 investors, purportedl, for the purpose of funding PinnFund's business of writing residential home mortgages In fact, Fanghella, Hillman, PinnFund and the Funding Entities are misappropriating the funds raised by the Funding Entities and using the funds to finance Fanghella's lavish lifestyle. In addition, Fanghella, -Iillman, PinnFund and the Funding Entities have circulated altered financial statements of PinnFund and forged auditors' reports, which contain numerous fraudulent misrepresentations and omissions, conceal more than \$95 million in losses incurred b; PinnFund since 1997 and conceal the transfer of more than \$107 million to Fanghella since 1997

The Commission obtained an order temporarily restraining Fanghella, Hillman, PinnFund and the Funding Entities from committing securities fraud in violation of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 (Securities Act), Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (Exchange Act) and Rule 10b-5 thereunder. The Court's order also temporarily restrains Hillman and the Funding Entities from committing violations of the securities registration provisions of Sections 5(a) and 5(c) of the Securities Act. In addition to the interim relief granted today, the Commission seeks a final judgment against Fanghella, Hillman, FinnFund and the Funding Entities enjoining them from future violations of the foregoing registration and antifraud provisions, ordering them to disgorge all ill-gotten gains, and assessing civil penalties against them.

The order obtained by the Commission also forbids relief defendants Reliance Holdings, LLC (Reliance) and Kelly Cook aka Kell; 'aye aka Kelly Spagnola (Cook), who together received more than \$10 million from Fanghella during the period in which he was misappropriating funds from the Funding Entities' investors, from placing any encumbrances on the \$5.2 million house in Laguna Niguel and from using the monies obtained from Fanghella for other than reasonable living expenses. The Commission also

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seeks a final judgment against Reliance and Cook, ordering them to disgorge all ill-gotten gains. [SEC v. PinnFund USA, Inc., et al., Civil Action No. 01 CV 0496 H, LAB, S.D. Cal.] (LR-16945)
