COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

VALERIE CAPRONI, DIRECTOR OF THE COMMISSION'S PACIFIC REGIONAL OFFICE, TO LEAVE THE COMMISSION

Valerie Caproni, Director of the Securities and Exchange Commission's Pacific Regional Office, today announced that she will be leaving her position at the end of July to join the New York law firm Simpson Thacher & Bartlett.

Ms. Caproni, 45, became Regional Director of the Pacific Region in September 1998. As Regional Director, Ms. Caproni oversees Commission offices in Los Angeles and San Francisco and is responsible for the administration of the agency's enforcement and regulatory programs in California, Oregon, Washington, Idaho, Montana, Arizona, Alaska and Hawaii.

Under Ms. Caproni's leadership, the Pacific Region has filed some of the Commission's most significant enforcement actions, including those involving the Emulex internet hoax, financial fraud at McKesson HBOC, Ponzi schemes at Capital Consultants, Pinn Fund and TLC, and a kickback scheme operated by noted investment adviser Alan Bond.

SEC Acting Chairman Laura Unger said, "The ability of the SEC to enforce the securities laws and to protect investors derives from the dedicated efforts of people like Valerie Caproni. She has made a significant contribution to the work of the Commission during her tenure as Regional Director of the Pacific Regional Office. On behalf of the Commission, I thank Valerie for her fine service and wish her well in her new position."

SEC Director of Enforcement Richard Walker said, "Valerie Caproni has played a critical role in the success of the Pacific Region's enforcement and regulatory programs over the past three years. Under her leadership and guidance, the Regional Office has initiated a number of important cases that have made our markets safer for investors. I wish Valerie continued success in her return to private practice."

In announcing her plan to leave the Commission, Ms. Caproni said, "Serving the investing public by being Regional Director of the Commission's west coast operation has been a highlight of my professional life. I have been honored to be a part of the

talented and dedicated staff in the Pacific Region. I will always look back to my time with the Commission with enormous fondness and professional satisfaction." (Press Rel. 2001-57)

ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

COMMISSION DETERMINES IT LACKS JURISDICTION TO REVIEW NASD DECISION TO DENY A MEMBER FIRM AN EXEMPTION FROM THE NASD'S TAPING RULE AND DISMISSES FIRM'S APPLICATION FOR REVIEW

The Commission has concluded that it lacks jurisdiction to review an NASD determination to deny member firm Whitehall Wellington Investments, Inc., of Port Washington New York, an exemption from the requirement that Whitehall establish special supervisory procedures. The requirement at issue is embodied in the NASD's Taping Rule, NASD Conduct Rule 3010(b)(2). The Taping Rule obligates a firm with at least 20 registered persons, like Whitehall, to tape rec ... I all telephone conversations with existing and prospective customers for a two-year period, if, within the prior three years, 20% or more of the firm's registered persons have been employed by one of more firms that have been subject to "discipline," as defined in the rule, in connection with sales practices involving securities offers, purchasers, or sales.

The Commission concluded that its recent decision in <u>Joseph Dillon & Co., Inc.</u>, Exchange Act Release No. 43523 (Nov. 6, 2000), 73 SEC Docket 2256, determined the result here. In that matter, the Commission held that the NASD's denial of another member firm's request for exemption from the Taping Rule does not fall within any of the four jurisdictional bases for Commission review of a self-regulatory organizations' action that are enumerated in Section 19(d) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Accordingly, the Commission dismissed Whitehall's application for review of the NASD's ord a denying Whitehall the exemption. (Rel. 34–44367; File No. 3-10250)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

AMERICAN ELECTRIC POWER COMPANY, INC.

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing a proposal by American Electric Power Company, Inc. (AEP), a registered holding company. The supplemental order authorized AEP to use the proceeds from financings authorized by order dated April 20, 2001 (HCAR No. 27382) to invest in exempt wholesale generators (EWGs) and foreign utility companies (FUCOs). (Rel. 35-27408)

EMERA INC., ET AL.

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until June 22, 2001, to request a hearing on a proposal filed by Emera Incorporated (Emera), a holding company formed under the laws of the Province of Nova Scotia Canada; Nova Scotia Power Inc. (NSPI), Emera's wholly owned electric utility subsidiary company; Bangor Hydro-Electric Company (BHE), a Maine electric public utility company and a holding company currently exempt by order under Section 3(a)(1) of the Act; and Bangor Var Co., Inc., a wholly owned subsidiary of BHE. Emera proposes to acquire the common stock of BHE and its public utility subsidiary companies (Merger). Emera has undertaken that NSPI will qualify for an exemption as a foreign utility company (FUCO) within the meaning of Section 33 of the Act. Emera will register as a holding company under the Act after completion of the Merger as will the to be formed intermediate holding companies. Emera also requests authority for financing, creation of a service company, associate company transactions, and other intrasystem authorizations. (Rel. 35-27409)

ALLEGHENY ENERGY, INC., ET AL.

An order has been issued authorizing a proposal by Allegheny Energy, Inc., a registered holding company, and its public utility subsidiary company, Allegheny Energy Supply Company, LLC (AE Supply) to sell 2% of the membership interests in AE Supply to Merrill Lynch & Co., Inc. (Merrill Lynch) as partial consideration for the purchase of Merrill Lynch's energy commodity marketing and trading unit, Global Energy Markets. (Rel. 35-27410)

WESTERN RESOURCES, INC.

An order has been issued authorizing a proposal by Western Resources, Inc. (WRI), a public utility holding company claiming an exemption under Section 3(a)(1) of the Act by Rule 2 under the Act. Westar Generating, Inc. (Westar Generating), a wholly owned subsidiary of WRI, will hold a 40% ownership interest in a generating facility that is under construction at The Empire District Electric Company State Line station (State Line) near Joplin, Missouri, in two phases. Westar Generating acquired, in the first phase of the acquisition, a 40% interest in the portion of State Line's assets under construction. The second phase, Westar Generating's acquisition of a 40% interest in the portion of the State Line assets that existed prior to the start of construction, will occur immediately prior to State Line's resumption of commercial operation. The order authorizes WRI to retain its 40% indirect interest in State Line when the plant resumes commercial operation. (Rel. 35-27411)

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The New York Stock Exchange filed a proposed rule change (SR-NYSE-2001-08) and Amendment No. 1 thereto to amend its rules to provide for the trading of Exchange-Traded Funds on an Unlisted Trading Privileges basis. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of May 28. (Rel. 34-44352)

The National Association of Securities Dealers, through its subsidiary, the Nasdaq Stock Market, Inc. (Nasdaq), filed a proposed rule change (SR-NASD-2001-35) and Amendment No. 1 thereto relating to the elimination of the interval delay between executions in the Nasdaq National Market Execution System (NNMS) and the effect of odd-lot orders on market makers' displayed quotations in the NNMS. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of June 4. (Rel. 34-44365)

The <u>Philadelphia Stock Exchange</u> filed a proposed rule change (SR-Phlx-2001-36) to revise the fine schedule for Options Floor Procedure Advices. Publication of the notice in the Federal Register is expected during the week of June 4. (Rel. 34-44366)

IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

A proposed rule change filed by the Chicago Board Options Exchange (SR-CBOE-2001-18) to exempt certain deep-in-the-money options transactions from the Exchange Marketing Fee has become effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A)(ii) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of May 28. (Rel. 34-44353)

A proposed rule change filed by the <u>Government Securities Clearing Corporation</u> to amend its fee structure to reallocate certain repurchase transaction processing fees (SR-GSCC-2001-04) has become effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of June 4. (Rel. 34-44364)

ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

The Commission granted accelerated approval to a proposed rule change submitted by the <u>Philadelphia Stock Exchange</u> (SR-Phlx-2001-56) to extend a pilot program to disengage its automatic execution system (AUTO-X) for a period of thirty seconds after the number of contracts automatically executed in a given option meets the AUTO-X minimum guarantee for that option. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of June 4. (Rel. 34-44362)

The Commission granted accelerated approval to a proposed rule change submitted by the Nasdaq Stock Market (SR-NASD-2001-32) relating to Level 1 Market Data Fees. (Rel. 34-44363)
