ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

DEL MAR, CA, BROKER-DEALER, OWNER, ASSOCIATE, SANCTIONED FOR FRAUD

Del Mar Financial Services, Inc. (Del Mar), a Del Mar, CA, broker-dealer, its owner, Kevin C. Dills; and an associate, Jai Chaudhuri, have been sanctioned after a hearing before an administrative law judge. Dills and Del Mar were ordered to pay a total of \$1,701,677.50 in fines and disgorgement and were barred from the securities industry. Chaudhuri, who holds no securities licenses, was ordered to disgorge ill-gotten gains of \$103,550 and to cease and desist from further violations. The law judge concluded that they violated antifraud and other provisions of the federal securities laws.

The law judge found that Del Mar, Dills, and Chaudhuri engaged in a scheme to promote the stock of Comparator Systems Corporation (Comparator) during 1995 in which Dills received kickbacks that he did not disclose to customers who bought the stock. In a series of convoluted steps, Chaudhuri obtained stock at discount prices, which Dills sold through Del Mar to targeted customers at market prices. Dills assured the customers that he was receiving only a nominal commission on the sales, when he was actually receiving substantial kickbacks. Chaudhuri kicked back about \$500,000 of the profits to Dills and retained about \$100,000 for himself.

Then, in May 1996, Comparator stock soar. I during four days of frenzied trading. Dills advised Del Mar customers to sell, and the flood of orders overwhelmed Del Mar's one-man trading operation on Friday, May 3, and Monday, May 6, 1996. A mismatch of customer and market maker orders and other trading errors left Del Mar liable to pay out more than \$500,000. Dills addressed this problem by lowering prices after the fact on many customer trades and giving the customers false explanations when they complained.

Del Mar's trader and clearing firm were cleared of charges of wrongdoing. (Initial Decision No. 188; File No. 3-9959)

JOAN FLEENER, JMC INTERNATIONAL INC., CAROLLA HOPKINS AND NORTHSTSTAR, INC. ORDERED TO CEASE AND DESIST FROM CAUSING VIOLATIONS OF THE ANTIFRAUD PROVISIONS OF THE SECURITIES ACT OF 1933

The Commission announced that on August 14 the Commission simultaneously instituted and settled administrative proceedings against Joan L. Fleener (Fleener) of San Bruno, California, Carolla S.R. Hopkins (Hopkins) of Yreka, California, JMC International, Inc. (JMC) and Northstar Inc. (Northstar) (collectively, Respondents), both private Nevada corporations. Fleener, age 61, is the President of JMC. Hopkins, age 50, is Vice President and Secretary of Northstar. Beginning in 1997, Fleener and Hopkins caused their respective corporations, JMC and Northstar, to each issue a revenue bond with a face value of \$250 million and took additional actions, including drafting and disseminating fraudulent private placement memoranda for the bonds, to create the false impression that the instruments were genuine debt securities. Beginning in 1999, with Respondents' and others' knowledge, two promoters used the fraudulent private placement memoranda to solicit offers to purchase the bonds. Respondents settled the administrative proceedings by consenting, without admitting or denying the Commission's findings, to the entry of the Commission's order: (1) finding that Respondents caused violations of Sections 17(a)(1) and 17(a)(3) of the Securities Act; and (2) ordering Respondents to cease and desist committing or causing any violation or any future violation of Sections 17(a)(1) and 17(a)(3) of the Securities Act. SEC SUES FOUR INDIVIDUALS AND THEIR COMPANIES FOR FRAUD IN THE OFFER OF \$500 MILLION OF CORPORATE REVENUE BONDS

The Commission announced that on August 14 the Commission filed a civil injunctive action in the United States District Court for the Northern District of Illinois against Kirk I. Koskella (Koskella), O. Jay Neeley (Neeley) and their company, ELTC Limited (ELTC Limited) (collectively, Defendants), alleging that the Defendants engaged in fraud in the offer of two worthless Corporate Revenue Bonds with an aggregate face value of \$500 Specifically, Joan L. Fleener (Fleener), age 61, of San Bruno, California, and Carolla S.R. Hopkins (Hopkins), age 50, of Yreka, California, caused their respective corporations, JMC International, Inc. (JMC) and Northstar, Inc. (Northstar), which had no assets or operating income, to each issue a worthless \$250 million face value bond. The Commission's Complaint alleges that Fleener and Hopkins also took additional actions, including drafting and disseminating fraudulent private placement memoranda for the bonds, to create the false impression that the instruments were genuine debt securities. The Complaint also alleged that, in 1999, the bonds were assigned to Koskella and Neeley. Thereafter, Koskella and Neeley, through ELTC, used the fraudulent private placement memoranda to solicit offers from various institutional investors and lenders to purchase the bonds or to provide them with a margin loan or commercial loan for the face value of the bonds. The Commission also alleged that, by these activities, Koskella, Neeley and ELTC violated Sections 17(a)(1) and 17(a)(3) of the Securities Act. In addition to an injunction, the Complaint also seeks civil penaltie against Koskella and Neeley. The

Commission also announced that on August 14, 2001 it simultaneously instituted and settled the administrative proceedings against Fleener, Hopkins, JMC and Northstar (collectively, Respondents). Respondents settled the administrative proceedings against them by consenting, without admitting or denying the Commission's findings, to the entry of the Commission's order: (1) finding that Respondents caused Koskella, Neeley and ELTC's violations of Sections 17(a)(1) and 17(a)(3) of the Securities Act; and (2) ordering Respondents to cease and desist from committing or causing any violation or any future violation of Sections 17(a)(1) and 17(a)(3) of the Securities Act. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

NATIONWIDE MUTUAL FUNDS AND VILLANOVA MUTUAL FUND CAPITAL TRUST

An order has been issued on an application filed by Nationwide Mutual Funds and Villanova Mutual Fund Capital Trust for an exemption from Section 17(a) of the Investment Company Act. The order permits a series of Nationwide Mutual Funds, an open-end management investment company, to acquire all of the assets, net of liabilities, of another series of Nationwide Mutual Funds. Because of certain affiliations, applicants may not rely on Rule 17a-8 under the Act. (Rel. IC-25108 – August 14)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

AMERICAN ELECTRIC POWER COMPANY, INC., ET AL.

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing a release of jurisdiction over a proposal by American Electric Power Company, Inc. (AEP), a registered public utility holding company, AEP Resources (Resources) and AEP Energy Services, Inc. (AEPES), (collectively, Applicants), both wholly-owned nonutility subsidiaries of AEP, and the special purpose financing subsidiaries of Applicants (Special Purpose Subsidiaries). AEP and the Special Purpose Subsidiaries directly owned by AEP have been authorized to issue unsecured long-term borrowings and to provide guaranties of long-term indebtedness issued by any Special Purpose Subsidiary for the purpose of financing the previously authorized acquisition of certain energy assets (Energy Assets) or the equity securities of a company substantially all of whose physical properties consist of the same kinds of energy assets (Energy Asset Companies). The Special Purpose Subsidiaries of AEPES and Resources have been authorized to issue long-term borrowings and to provide guaranties of indebtedness issued by any Special Purpose Subsidiary for the purpose of financing the acquisition of En y Assets or Energy Asset Companies. The

authorization is granted through December 31, 2003 and subject to the investment limitation of \$2 billion. (Rel. 35-27432)

IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

A proposed rule change (SR-Phlx-2001-70) filed by the <u>Philadelphia Stock Exchange</u> extending the Pilot Program for Exchange Rule 98, Emergency Committee until November 30, 2001, has become effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Publication of the notice in the <u>Federal Register</u> is expected during the week of August 13. (Rel. 34-44653)

A proposed rule change filed by the <u>Chicago Board Options Exchange</u>, and Amendment No.1 thereto, adopting a new interpretation of an existing rule relating to the display of indicative spread prices (SR-CBOE-2001-41) has become effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of August 13. (Rel. 34-44683)

A proposed rule change filed by the <u>Philadelphia Stock Exchange</u>, and Amendment No.1 thereto, establishing obligations of AUTOM Order Entry Firms and Users and prohibiting entry of multiple orders via AUTOM for the account(s) of the same owner of beneficial interest for the same option within 15 seconds (SR-Phlx-2001-58) has become effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of August 13. (Rel. 34-44687)

A proposed rule change filed by the <u>Pacific Exchange</u> extending its Automated Opening Rotation pilot program for one year (SR-PCX-2001-31) has become effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of August 13. (Rel. 34-44688)

PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission approved a proposed rule change submitted by the <u>Philadelphia Stock Exchange</u> (SR-Phlx-2001-54) to eliminate the requirement that the three core members of the Equity and Options Allocation, Evaluation, and Securities Committees who conduct a public securities business be the same people for both committees. (Rel. 34-44682)

ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CI'ANGE

The Options Clearing Corporation filed a proposed rule change (SR-OCC-2001-08) that will allow OCC to set options' marking proces at the arithmetic average of the best bid and best offer across all exchanges listing the options for the purposes of calculating premium margin. Publication of the proposal is expected in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of August 13. (Rel. 34-44689)

JOINT INDUSTRY PLAN

The Commission approved an extension until September 19, 2001, to the Reporting Plan for Nasdaq/National Market securities traded on an exchange on an unlisted or listed basis, (S7-24-89), submitted by the National Association of Securities Dealers, Pacific Exchange and Boston Stock Exchange, Cincinnati Stock Exchange, and Philadelphia Stock Exchange. WITHDRAWAL GRANTED

An order has been issued granting the application of the Philadelphia Stock Exchange to withdraw certain underlying securities as option classes, effective at the opening of business on August 14, 2001. (Rel. 34-44686)
