CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

LEONARD BEDNAR FOUND GUILTY

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on January 17 a jury in the Eastern District of Missouri found Leonard Bednar guilty of all four counts of an Indictment which had charged him with three counts of making false declarations to a Grand Jury and one count of maintaining false books and records kept pursuant to the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Judge Nangle set sentencing for February 4, 1983. Leonard Bednar faces a maximum of twenty years imprisonment and fines of \$20,000. Bednar's conviction stems from the bankruptcy of Stix & Co. Inc., formerly a St. Louis broker-dealer, now in liquidation proceedings pursuant to the Securities Investor Protection Act. (U.S. v. Leonard Bednar, U.S.D.C., E.D. PAINE WEBBER CASHFUND, INC.

SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The New York Stock Exchange, Inc. (NYSE) has filed a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 (SR-NYSE-83-3) to replace the prohibition in NYSE Rule 314(g) against a member organization recommending its own or its affiliate's publicly held securities with a requirement that a member organization disclose its control relationship with an issuer prior to completing any transaction in the issuer's securities with or for the account of a customer. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of January 31. (Rel. 34-19462)
