COMMISSION ANNOUNCEMENTS

SEC ANNOUNCES FORMATION OF ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON TENDER OFFERS

SEC Chairman John Shad announced today formation of the Commission's Advisory Committee on Tender Offers. The Committee includes prominent members of the business and financial community, the legal and accounting professions and academia, who have been actively involved in major tender offers as bidders, targets, arbitrageurs, institutional investors, investment and commercial bankers, attorneys and accountants, or academicians, who have analyzed such practices.

The Committee has been requested to review tender offer practices and regulations in terms of the best interest of all shareholders (i.e., shareholders of all corporations, whether potential bidders, target companies or bystanders) and propose specific regulatory and legislative improvements for the benefit of all shareholders.

The first meeting of the Committee will be held from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on Friday, March 18th at the SEC. It will be open to the public. (Rel. 34-19528 and PR 83-8)

RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

AMENDMENTS RELATING TO INVESTMENT ADVISER REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS ADOPTED

The Commission has adopted on a final basis certain temporary amendments relating to registration requirements under the Investment Advisers Act of 1940. The amendments simplify the registration requirements for investment advisers subject to registration by deleting certain items from Form ADV, the investment adviser registration application. (Rel. AMENDMENTS TO RULES REGARDING INDEPENDENCE OF ACCOUNTANTS

The Commission announces the adoption of amendments to its rules regarding the independence of accountants. The amendments revise the definition of the term "member" as used in Rule 2-01(b) of Regulation S-X and clarify the rule's intent in certain minor respects. In addition, appropriate changes are being made in the Commission's publicized independence interpretations to conform such interpretations with the revised definition of the term "member". (FRR-10)

PROPOSED RULE TO PROVIDE REGISTERED INSURANCE COMPANY SEPARATE ACCOUNTS WITH EXEMPTIVE RELIEF

The Commission is proposing for public comment Rule 6c-8 under the Investment Company Act of 1940. The proposed rule would provide registered insurance company separate accounts with exemptive relief from various provisions of the Act with regard to variable annuity contracts participating in such accounts to the extent necessary to permit them to impose a deferred sales load upon redemption of any such contract and to deduct a full annual fee for administrative services under certain circumstances. ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

PROCEEDINGS INSTITUTED AGAINST NATIONAL BOND AND SHARE CO.

The Commission has instituted public administrative proceedings against National Bond and Share Co. (National) pursuant to Section 17A(c) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. National is a registered transfer agent located in Denver, Colorado. The order for proceedings alleges that National refused to allow staff inspection of its books and records and also violated various books and records provisions of the Exchange Act relating to transfer agents. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

STEVEN G. WEIL FOUND IN CIVIL CONTEMPT

The Commission announced that on February 22 the Honorable William J. Campbell, Senior U.S. District Judge sitting in West Palm Beach, Florida, found Steven G. Weil in civil contempt of Judge Campbell's judgment of January 6, 1983 directing Weil to disgorge and pay into the Registry of the Court \$50,000 of illegal profits. Weil refused to pay these funds and was remanded to the custody of the U.S. Marshall until such time as he complies with Judge Campbell's order.

The Commission applied for a finding of civil contempt against Weil in light of his refusal to comply with the terms of two injunctions entered against him as part of settlements of SEC v. Micro-Therapeutics, Inc., and SEC v. Weil, et al. As part of the settlement of these cases, Weil, without admitting or denying the allegations, agreed that if the cases sent to conclusion, it would be found that he would be liable for the sum of \$564,000 pursuant to the Commission's claim for disgorgement. Pursuant to the orders entered in the two cases, the question of Weil's ability to pay this amount was referred to Judge Campbell, who held a hearing wherein Weil was given the opportunity to make a showing with respect to his financial inability to pay the full \$546,000. Thereafter, Judge Campbell made findings and conclusions that Weil was able to pay \$50,000 and directed him to pay that sum into the Registry of the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Florida. Judge Campbell's judgment, entered on January 6, 1983, gave Weil 30 days to pay the \$50,000. Weil did not comply with this order and was incarcerated on February 22, 1983. (SEC v. Micro-Therapeutics, Inc. et al. 78 Div. 893 MJL, U.S.D.C. S.D.N.Y.; and SEC v. Weil, 80-6611 Civ. JCP, U.S.D.C., S.D. Fla.). (LR-9904)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

LORRAINE MARTIN DONAHUE PLEADS GUILTY

The Washington Regional Office announced that on February 7 Lorraine Martin Donahue entered a plea of guilty to a two count indictment before the Honorable John B. Hannum, U.S. District Judge for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania. Donahue had been charged with conspiracy and wire fraud relating to the fraudulent offer and sale of \$4.5 million of industrial development bonds and mortgage secured notes issued by Fidelity America Mortgage Company. (U.S. v. Lorraine Martin Donahue, U.S.D.C. E.D. Pa., Criminal Action No. 81-418). (LR-9905)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

THE SOUTHERN COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing The Southern Company (Southern) and Southern Company Services, Inc. (Services), a utility subsidiary of Southern, for Services to raise its maximum authorized borrowing amount from \$50 million to \$150 million, including up to \$100 million of additional unsecured notes to companies other than Southern, through June 30, 1984. An exception from competitive bidding has been granted. Jurisdiction has been reserved over the terms of the proposed notes not being issued to Southern. (Rel. 35-22861 - Feb. 24)
