CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

U.S. SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION

COMPLAINT FILED AGAINST GEORGE C. BANGS AND BANGS SECURITIES, INC.

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on March 1 a complaint was filed in the U.S. District Court, Northern District of Illinois, seeking injunctive and other equitable relief against Bangs Securities, Inc. (BSI) and George C. Bangs (Bangs). The complaint alleges that BSI and Bangs, in the offer and sale of various securities, violated the antifraud provisions of the securities laws by misrepresenting material facts to investors such as the rate of return on investments. The complaint also alleges that BSI repeatedly failed to make its books and records available for inspection by Commission staff members and misrepresented its clearing arrangement.

The Commission seeks to permanently enjoin Bangs and BSI from further violations of the antifraud provisions of the securities laws and asks that a mandatory injunction be issued against BSI requiring it: (1) to provide access to the Commission for inspection of BSI's books and records; and (2) to file an amendment to its broker-dealer registration to accurately reflect BSI's clearing arrangement. (SEC v. Bangs Securities, Inc., et al., No. 83 C 1440, N.D. Ill., filed March 1, 1983). (LR-9915)

SUMMARY JUDGMENT GRANTED AGAINST BLAVIN

The Commission announced that on March 1 Judge Horace W. Gilmore of the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Michigan, Southern Division, granted summary judgment on all counts of its complaint against Larry D. Blavin, individually and doing business as Providence Investment Advisory, for violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and the registration and antifraud provisions of the Investment Advisors Act of 1940. Judge Gilmore also granted the Commission's request for disgorgement, and directed the Commission to prepare an order of permanent injunction and a plan of disgorgement for issuance by the Court.

The Commission filed its complaint on November 18, 1981, alleging that Blavin, acting as an unregistered investment adviser, engaged in a fraudulent scheme whereby he purchased large amounts of securities in certain companies, touted those securities in materially false and misleading terms through an investment advisory newsletter, and then sold the securities at a substantial profit. (SEC v. Larry D. Blavin, individually and d/b/a Providence Investment Advisory, C.A. No. 81-74281, E.D. Mich., filed March 1, 1983). (LR-9917)

The NASD has been granted an exemption, subject to certain conditions, until June 30, 1983, from making available to quotation vendors quotations and size for each market maker in an NMS Security.
