# **ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS**

MONTAGU INVESTMENT MANAGEMENT LIMITED CITED

The Commission today announced the institution of administrative proceedings, pursuant to Section 15(c)(4) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, with respect to Montagu Investment Management Limited. (Montagu), an English corporation located in London, England, which is engaged in business as an investment adviser. The proceedings were instituted to determine whether Montagu failed to comply with Section 13(d) of the Exchange Act with respect to beneficial ownership filings made and required to be made by Montagu in connection with transactions in the securities of Canal-Randolph Corporation (Canal-Randolph) and Blue Ridge Real Estate Company and Big Boulder Corporation (Blue Ridge).

Simultaneously with the institution of these proceedings, Montagu submitted an Offer of Settlement which was accepted by the Commission. Under the terms of the Offer of Settlement, Montagu consented to the issuance of the Commission's Order, without admitting or denying any of the facts or findings set forth therein. The Commission's Order included findings that Montagu, through its power to vote and dispose of Blue Ridge and Canal-Randolph common stock held by various trust clients, was the beneficial owner of such securities. The Commission further found that Montagu failed to comply in material respects with Section 13(d) of the Exchange Act and the rules, regulations and schedules thereunder. Montagu was ordered to comply with and cause its trust clients to comply with the requirements of Section 13(d) of the Exchange Act and the rules, regulations and schedules thereunder, and to adopt, implement and maintain internal procedures, policies and controls which are reasonably designed to ensure such compliance. ## CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

GENERAL SECURITY ENTERPRISES, INC., OTHERS RESTRAINED; OTHER RELIEF ORDERED

The Washington Regional Office announced that on March 1 the U.S. District Court of Western Pennsylvania entered a Temporary Restraining Order with consent of defendants: (1) temporarily restraining General Security Enterprises, Inc., MBD Investors, Inc. and Mary Ann Fulton of Enon Valley, Pennsylvania, from further violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the offer, purchase and sale of securities; (2) temporarily restraining MBD Investors and Fulton from further violations of the net capital and recordkeeping requirements of the securities laws; (3) freezing the assets and property of the defendants, except for the ordinary living expenses of Fulton; and (4) ordering an accounting of all investors' funds. The Commission's complaint alleged violations of these provisions of the securities laws in the offer and sale of over \$500,000 in corporate bonds of General Security to over 28 investors. The complaint further alleges that the defendants made untrue statements of material fact and failed to state material facts including that the corporate bonds were tax-free, that they were guaranteed by the U.S. Government, that investor funds were being converted

to the personal use of the officers of the corporate defendant, and that investors funds were being used to make interest payments on previously sold corporate bonds. (SEC v. General Security Enterprises, Inc., et al., W.D. Pa., Civil Action No. 83-485). (LR-9918)
