ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

SETTLEMENT OFFERS OF JAMES J. DUANE & CO., INC. AND JAMES J. DUANE, JR. ACCEPTED

The Commission announced that in public administrative proceedings ordered pursuant to Sections 15(b) and 19(h) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 [see Rel. 34-19508, September 15, 1982] James J. Duane & Co., Inc. (Registrant), a registered broker-dealer located in New York City, and James J. Duane, Jr. (Duane), Registrant's sole shareholder, registered principal, Chairman and member of the Board of Directors and Treasurer, have submitted Offers of Settlement which the Commission has decided to accept. Registrant and Duane have consented to the issuance of an Order by the Commission making Findings and Imposing Remedial Sanctions without admitting or denying the allegations contained therein.

The Commission's Order alleged that Registrant, wilfully aided and abetted by Duane, wilfully violated the broker-dealer registration rule, net capital rule, customer protection rule, bookkeeping provisions, financial reporting rule, supplemental reporting rule, quarterly securities count rule, and fingerprinting rule, and Regulation T (credit extension provisions) by the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System, and Section 15(d) of the Securities Investor Protection Act.

The Commission censured Registrant and Duane, and ordered Registrant to comply with certain Undertakings set forth in its Offer of Settlement, by which it is required to provide written notice to the New York Regional Office should it desire to self-clear, together with a written report by a certified public accountant prior to beginning to self-clear, that the clearing procedures to be used are such as to prevent recurrence of the violations set forth in the Order for Proceedings; and to file reports by a certified public accountant, if Registrant self-clears, every six months for two years stating that Registrant has not violated Rules 15c3-1, 15c3-3, 17a-3(a)(11), 17a-5(g) and 17a-13 under the Exchange Act and Paragraph 4(c) of Regulation T by the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System, as cited in the Order for Proceedings, as of the date of such accountant's statement.
