PROPOSED REVISION OF INDUSTRY GUIDE DISCLOSURES FOR BANK HOLDING COMPANIES

The Commission has issued a release which requests public comments on proposed amendments to the portions of the Industry Guides for Statistical Disclosures by Bank Holding Companies relating to disclosures about nonperforming loans and certain foreign loans. The proposed changes would revise the current disclosure guidelines dealing with information about nonperforming loans to focus more broadly on various risk elements in the loan portfolio and would provide for additional disaggregated disclosures about foreign loans.

TECHNICAL AMENDMENT TO RULE 0-2(a) ADOPTED

The Commission has adopted a technical amendment to Rule 0-2(a) under the Investment Company Act of 1940 that will expand the rule to provide that, when the last day for timely filing of papers required to be filed by the Act falls on a Saturday, Sunday or holiday, the time within which required papers may be filed with the Commission will be extended until the following business day. AMENDMENTS TO RULE 15c2-11 PROPOSED FOR PUBLIC COMMENT

The Commission has proposed for public comment amendments to Rule 15c2-11. The proposed amendments would: (1) rescind the foreign issuer exemption in the Rule and replace it with a requirement that brokers and dealers quoting foreign securities or American Depositary Receipts maintain certain information about the issuers of such securities, or in the case of ADRs, the issuers of the deposited foreign shares; (2) broaden the scope of the Rule to include unpriced entries; (3) exclude from the Rule's coverage any priced quotation or unpriced entry that represents an unsolicited customer order and indication of interest; and (4) prohibit the initiation of quotations for securities of reporting companies that are delinquent in meeting their filing obligations under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. The Commission also announced its intention to review the Rule's "piggy-back" provision, and to solicit comment on whether there is a continuing need for some or all of the Rule's provisions.

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

GENERAL SECURITIES ENTERPRISES, INC., OTHERS ENJOINED

The Washington Regional Office announced that on April 8 the U.S. District Court for the Western District of Pennsylvania entered a Final Judgment and Order: (1) permanently enjoining General Security Enterprises, Inc., MBD Investors, Inc. and Mary Ann Fulton of Enon Valley, Pennsylvania from further violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the offer, purchase and sale of securities; and (2) permanently enjoining MBD and Fulton from further violations of the net capital and recordkeeping requirements of the securities laws.

The defendants consented to these orders without admitting or denying the allegations of the complaint.

On March 1, 1983, a temporary restraining order was entered against the defendants prohibiting them from these same violations. The complaint alleged, among other things, that the defendants offered and sold over \$500,000 in corporate bonds to over 28 investors. The complaint further alleged that in the offers and sales of these securities, the defendants made untrue statements of material facts and omitted to state material facts, including that the corporate bonds were tax-free, that they were guaranteed by the United States Government, that the investors funds were being converted to the personal use of the individual defendants and that investor funds were being used to make interest payments on previously sold corporate bonds. CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

BLAINE HARRIS AND TERRY KENNETH BALSER INDICTED

The U.S. Attorney for the District of Utah, the Denver Regional Office and the Salt Lake Branch Office announced that on April 6 a federal grand jury in Salt Lake City, Utah, returned a nine-count indictment against Blaine Harris and Terry Kenneth Balser charging securities fraud and mail fraud in the offer and sale of Envirowest, Inc. common stock. Harris, formerly of Farmington, Utah now residing in Lexington, Kentucky, and Balser of Huntington, Utah, are charged with engaging in a scheme to defraud investors and with making false statements of material facts and omissions to state material facts relating to, among other things, the price of the stock, its registration and future trading and listing on an exchange. The indictment also alleges that Harris and Balser used certain of the proceeds from stock sales for their own personal use. The case was assigned to the Honorable Bruce S. Jenkins, District Court Judge. (U.S. v. Blaine Harris and Terry Kenneth Balser, USDC, UT, CR-83-00046). (LR-9965)
