WILLIAM P. COON SENTENCED

U.S. SECURITIES AND EXCHANCE COMMISSION

The U.S. Attorney's Office for the District of Colorado and the Chicago Regional Office announced that on April 21, in the federal district court in Chicago, Illinois, William P. Coon of Winnetka, Illinois was sentenced to four years probation after pleading guilty on March 10 to one count of securities fraud and one count of mail fraud of a five-count indictment. Coon was also ordered to make restitution of about \$484,000. Coon was indicted on October 14, 1982 by a federal grand jury sitting in Denver, Colorado. He pleaded guilty on March 10, 1983 in Chicago, Illinois, pursuant to Rule 20 of the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure.

According to the indictment, Coon, as part of a scheme and artifice to defraud and for obtaining money, caused limited partnership interests to be offered and sold to investors and knowingly made certain false and fraudulent pretenses, representations and promises to investors and withheld and concealed several true and material facts. In addition, the indictment charged that Coon converted more than \$50,000 of investors funds to his own personal use and caused false quarterly reports to be mailed which led investors to believe that they were earning a high rate of return on their initial investments. WITHDRAWAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission has withdrawn, pursuant to a request for withdrawal from the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board, a proposed rule change filed by the MSRB (SR-MSRB-82-15) which would have required that certificates of \$5,000 par value denomination be delivered on all transactions of registered municipal securities issued after January 1, 1983 and settled prior to January 1, 1985, unless the parties agreed otherwise. Publication of the withdrawal is expected to be made in the Federal Register during the week of May 9. (Rel. 34-19726)

NOTICE OF EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The National Securities Clearing Corporation's proposed rule change (SR-NSCC-83-4) has become effective in accordance with Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.
