CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

FINAL JUDGMENT OF PERMANENT INJUNCTION BY CONSENT ENTERED AGAINST VAUGHT OIL COMPANY, OTHERS

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The New York Regional Office announced that on May 23 Final Judgments of Permanent Injunction by Consent were entered against Vaught Oil Company (VOC), Bill D. Vaught (Vaught) of Canton, Ohio, and Samuel L. Deck, doing business as Samuel L. Deck and Associates of Vienna, Virginia. The Orders, signed by the Honorable Lee P. Gagliardi, U.S. District Judge for the Southern District of New York, enjoined VOC, Vaught and Deck from further violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the offer and sale of securities in the form of fractional undivided interests in oil and gas rights in VOC programs. The Orders, to which Vaught and Deck consented, also enjoined them from violations of Section 15(a)(1) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 for failure to register as brokers or dealers. (SEC v. SIPC APPLICATION FILED IN COMMISSION INJUNCTIVE ACTION

The Washington Regional Office announced that on May 27 the Securities Investor Protection Corporation (SIPC) filed an application in the U.S. District Court for the Western District of Pennsylvania seeking a decree adjudicating that the customers of MBD Investors, Inc., a registered broker-dealer located in Enon Valley, Pennsylvania, are in need of protection under the Securities Investor Protection Act. The application was filed in the same action previously brought by the Commission against MBD and certain other defendants charging various violations of the securities laws.

The Court granted SIPC's application, upon the consent of MBD, appointed SIPC as trustee for the liquidation of the business of MBD, and appointed the Pittsburgh law firm of Baskins and Sears, P.C., as counsel for the trustee. (SEC v. General Security Enterprises, Inc., MBD Investors, Inc., et al.; SIPC v. MBD Investors, Inc., WD. Pa., Civil Action No. 83-485). (LR-10018)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

ALAN D. PLATT SENTENCED

The Arapahoe County, Colorado District Attorney and the Denver Regional Office announced that on May 13, in the Arapahoe County, Colorado District Court, Alan D. Platt was sentenced to eight years probation, two years of work release and was ordered to undertake a restitution program after pleading nolo contendere to one count of theft in excess of \$10,000 and one count of securities fraud. Platt was charged on April 25, 1982.

According to the charge, Platt raised over \$1 million from public investors in the sale of limited partnership interests in an oil drilling program and a completion program. Platt then diverted a substantial portion of these funds for his personal use. Under the terms of the sentence, Platt will be allowed to work during the day to provide a means of restoring all or part of the funds he diverted for his personal use. Platt will return to the Arapahoe County jail each night for two years. (State of Colorado v. Alan D. Platt). (LR-10019)
