U.S. SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

NASD ACTION AGAINST MISTER DISCOUNT STOCKBROKERS, INC. AND WILLIAM F. MILLER AFFIRMED

The Commission has affirmed sanctions imposed by the NASD on Mister Discount Stockbrokers, Inc. of Chicago, and William F. Miller, its president. The NASD censured the firm and Miller, expelled the firm from membership, and barred Miller from association with any member as a principal or supervisor.

The NASD's action stemmed from a breakdown in the firm's back office operations. In early 1980, there was a sharp increase in the firm's volume of business, and the firm could not find adequate replacements for departing employees. In April 1980, NASD staff members discovered that the firm's back office operations were out of control. For nearly two months thereafter, the staff worked on the premises to help the firm correct its records. Finally, in June 1980, a SIPC trustee was appointed to liquidate the firm.

The Commission found, as had the NASD, that the firm and Miller improperly engaged in business while unable to determine the firm's net capital position, failed to comply with recordkeeping, net capital and customer protection provisions, did not take appropriate steps to rectify the firm's deteriorating operations, and failed to exercise proper supervision to assure the firm's compliance with regulatory requirements.

In affirming the sanctions imposed by the NASD, the Commission noted that the firm had been enjoined from violating net capital, customer protection and recordkeeping provisions, and liquidated by SIPC. It also observed that, despite Miller's background and lengthy experience in the securities business, which included employment as an NASD examiner, he permitted a total breakdown in the firm's back office operations, subjecting public investors to serious risks. EQUITABLE TAX-FREE ACCOUNT, INC.
