PROPOSED RESCISSION OF RULE 202-1

U.S. SECURITIES AND
EXCHANGE COMMISSION

The Commission is proposing for comment the rescission of Rule 202-1 under the Investment Advisers Act of 1940. Rule 202-1 currently excludes from the definition of investment adviser a person who offers investment advice to an employee benefit plan sponsored by the employer of such person if such person is not otherwise engaged in the business of providing investment advice and does not hold himself out generally to the public as an investment adviser. The proposed rescission, if adopted, would permit these persons to voluntarily register as investment advisers.

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS ORDERED
AGAINST TRENTON H. PARKER, OTHERS

Public administrative proceedings have been ordered under Sections 15(b) and 19(h) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and Sections 203(e) and 203(f) of the Investment Advisers Act of 1940 against Trenton H. Parker & Associates, Inc. (Registrant), a broker-dealer, Trenton H. Parker & Associates Asset Management Corporation (Asset Management), an investment adviser, and Trenton H. Parker, the owner and president of both entities. The Order for Proceedings alleges that Associates and Parker have been permanently enjoined from future violations of the antifraud, registration and filing provisions of the securities laws; that Asset Management is in violation of the Investment Adviser's Act filing provisions; and that Parker was convicted, under a guilty plea, of mail fraud, wire fraud and income tax violations based on the same facts as those underlying the permanent injunction.

A hearing will be scheduled to determine whether the allegations are true and whether any remedial action should be ordered by the Commission. (Rel. 34-19950)

CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

JERRY S. MAERAS SENTENCED

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on June 17 Jerry S. Maeras of Madison, Illinois, was sentenced by the Honorable William Hungate, U.S. District Court Judge, to four years imprisonment and fined \$5,000 for his part in the \$16 million Stix & Co. Inc. stock fraud. Maeras had previously pled guilty to three counts of an information filed against him alleging one count of securities fraud, one count of mail fraud and a conspiracy charge to violate various federal laws.
