CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

FORMER SIPA TRUSTEE DAVID ROBB ENJOINED

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on July 12 a complaint for a permanent injunction and other equitable relief was filed in the Federal Court at Detroit, Michigan, naming David Robb as defendant.

The complaint alleged that on September 18, 1974, Robb was appointed Trustee under the provisions of the Securities Investor Protection Act (SIPA) for the liquidation of Financial House, Inc., a broker-dealer firm in Detroit, and that Robb served as Trustee until March 29, 1983. The complaint further alleged, among other things, that from about October 1977, Robb misappropriated and converted to his own use some \$188,000 of monies or assets belonging to the estate of Financial House and the Securities Investor Protection Corporation (SIPC), and that in order to conceal the conversion, Robb did, among other things, utilize two false documents purporting to be certificates of deposit and filed false reports, all in violation of the antifraud provisions of the SIPA. The complaint also requested the Court to order an accounting by Robb and that he be required to disgorge all monies converted or otherwise accounted for, with appropriate interest.

Simultaneous with the filing of the complaint, Robb, without admitting or denying the allegations in the complaint, consented to entry of a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Order Requiring an Accounting. On July 13, U.S. District Judge Ralph M. Freeman entered the Final Judgment and Order, permanently enjoining Robb from further violations of specified sections of the SIPA, and ordering him to provide an accounting to the Court, the Commission and to SIPC within 30 days. The requested disgorgement will be held in abeyance, pending receipt of and review of the accounting. (SEC v. David Robb, E.D. Mich., S. Div., Civil Action No. CA83CV2782DT). (LR-10071)

HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

SOUTHERN COMPANY SERVICES, INC.

A supplemental order has been issued authorizing Southern Company Services, Inc., subsidiary of The Southern Company (Southern), to issue and sell unsecured notes maturing on June 1, 1991, in an amount of \$20 million. Southern will guarantee payment of the notes. Jurisdiction has been reserved over the terms and conditions of subsequent sales of unsecured notes to non-affiliated lenders. (Rel. 35-23005 - July 19)

NEW ENGLAND ELECTRIC SYSTEM

An order has been issued authorizing a proposal by New England Electric System (NEES), and its subsidiaries, New England Power Company (NEPCO) and New England Energy Incorporated (NEEI), relating to a joint venture of NEEI and Keystone Shipping Company to construct, own, and operate a collier to transport coal to NEPCO's plants. In lieu of a leveraged lease arrangement to provide permanent equity financing for the collier as previously contemplated, the companies now propose that the joint venture retain full ownership of the vessel and, in connection therewith, that: (1) NEEI invest up to \$15 million in the joint venture as its share in the equity of the collier; (2) NEES invest up to \$15 million in NEEI for the purpose set forth in (1); and (3) necessary, related amendments be made to the Joint Venture Agreement between NEEI and Keystone and to the Time Charter between NEPCO and the joint venture. NOTICE OF PROPOSEL RULE CHANGE

The New York Stock Exchange, Inc. has filed a proposed rule change under Rule 19b-4 (SR-NYSE-83-26) to designate NYSE composite index options for trading on a February-May-August-November expiration cycle. Publication of the proposal is expected to be made in the <u>Federal Register</u> during the week of July 18. (Rel. 34-19976)

ACCELERATED TEMPORARY APPROVAL

The Commission has approved, on a temporary and accelerated basis, a proposed rule change filed by the American Stock Exchange, Inc. (SR-Amex-83-16) to extend free trading of expiring index options series to 4:10 p.m. and to eliminate closing rotations in the expiring series. (Rel. 34-19977)

ACCELERATED APPROVAL

The Commission has approval, on an accelerated basis, a proposed rule change filed by the Chicago Board Options Exchange, Incorporated (SR-CBOE-83-21) to prohibit members from acting on the same day as both floor broker and market maker in options on either the Standard & Poor's 100 or 500 index.
