CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

#### JUDGMENT OF CIVIL CONTEMPT ENTERED AGAINST JOHN ACORD

The Atlanta Regional Office and the Miami Branch Office announced that on August 23, following a hearing, the Honorable William M. Hoeveler, U.S. District Judge for the Southern District of Florida, entered a Judgment of Civil Contempt and Order to Pay against John Acord, also known as John Allen. The judgment ordered Acord to pay to William Nortman, Esquire, the Court appointed receiver, the sum of \$299,250 within 15 days of the entry of the judgment. The judgment also provided that Acord shall be fined \$500 per day after the 15th day until he pays the receiver the \$299,250.

MMISSION 8, 1983

The Commission alleged that Acord violated a temporary restraining order entered by Judge Hoeveler on December 22, 1982 by writing checks against, and withdrawing funds totaling \$299,250, from a corporate bank account that was frozen by that order. The Commission previously filed a civil injunctive action against Acord and three corporate defendants on December 22, 1982. On January 19, 1983, a final judgment of permanent injunction was entered against all of the defendants based on their stipulations through counsel and on that date Mr. Nortman was appointed as receiver for the corporate defendants.
