RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

PROPOSAL TO ADOPT REVISED RULE 139

The Commission requests comments on proposed amendments to Rule 139 under the Securities Act of 1933. The proposed amendments: provide guidance under Section 5 of the Securities Act respecting publication of broker-dealer research reports which contain information, opinions or recommendations regarding a registrant in the process of registering securities for public sale; and expand the class of publications that come within the protection of the Rule. The Commission also requests comment on the need for changes to Rule 137 and 138, other rules giving guidance as to permissible research reports. All comments should be sent in triplicate to George A. Fitzsimmons, Secretary, Securities and Exchange Commission, 450 Fifth St., NW, Washington, DC 20549, on or before December 14 and should refer to File No. S7-996. ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

SECTION 15(c)(4) ORDER ISSUED

On October 6 the Commission issued an Order, under Section 15(c)(4) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, and Conclusions of the Commission In the Matter of Accounting for Gains and Losses Incurred in Connection with Certain Securities Transactions of Southeastern Savings & Loan Company and Scottish Savings and Loan Association, North Carolina savings and loan organizations. Each consented to the Order, under consents and voluntary undertakings, without admitting or denying any statements or conclusions contained therein.

In its Order, the Commission concluded that the accounting treatment utilized by defendants in certain of its financial statements was not in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. Specifically, they deferred net losses on GNMA certificates and futures contracts for U.S. Treasury bond transactions rather than recognizing such losses in full in the period in which the losses from the transactions were incurred. The Commission also concluded that the textual disclosures of defendants in filings with the Commission were deficient in that they did not set forth separately and specifically the amount of the losses incurred as a result of, and the full facts and circumstances surrounding, the GNMA certificates and futures contracts transactions.

The Commission ordered Southeastern and Scottish to amend their periodic reports restating their financial statements for the applicable periods and to disclose all material facts relating to their transactions in GNMA certificates and related futures contracts. (Rel. 34-20266)

JOHN H. TURNER BARRED

The Commission instituted public administrative proceedings, under Sections 15(b) and 19(h) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, against John H. Turner of Greenville, Pennsylvania. The Commission also accepted Turner's Offer of Settlement in which he consented to findings of willful violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws without admitting or denying the allegations contained in the Order for Proceedings. The Order alleges that Turner offered and sold pooled interests in fictitious certificates of deposit using proceeds of investor funds to make principal and interest payments to other investors and converting investor funds to his own personal use. CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

GERALD E. LEE AND GEORGE G. DAVIS INDICTED

William Tendy, Acting U.S. Attorney for the Southern District of New York, and the New York Regional Office, announced that on September 15 the district court unsealed a three-count indictment charging Gerald E. Lee of Dublin, Ireland, former Chairman of the Board of Frigitemp Corporation, and George G. Davis of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, former senior vice-president of Frigitemp, with conspiracy and interstate transportation of stolen property.

The indictment alleged that Lee and Davis submitted \$183,550 worth of fictitious invoices from a shell company they controlled called Interchange Design Corporation to Frigitemp for purported "consulting services" in the construction of a Frigitemp factory in South Carolina.

At the arraignment, Davis was required to post \$5 million bail, while a warrant was issued for Lee, who failed to appear. (U.S. v. Gerald Lee and George Davis, 83 Cr. 564, S.D.N.Y.). (LR-10152)

DANIEL KING BRAINARD AND HALTON Q. BITTICK SENTENCED

The Atlanta Regional Office and U.S. Attorney for the Middle District of North Carolina announced that on September 14 Judge Richard Erwin, U.S. District Court for the Middle District of North Carolina, sentenced Daniel King Brainard to four years imprisonment. The sentence resulted from his conviction on 12 counts of mail fraud in the offer and sale of securities, namely investment contracts issued by Television Marketing Corporation, which were purportedly secured by accounts receivable of nationally known retailers. On September 8, Halton Q. Bittock was fined \$5,000 and sentenced to eight months imprisonment in the same matter, after pleading guilty to one count of filing a false statement with the Commission. Brainard was previously permanently enjoined from future violations of provisions of the securities laws, and is presently the subject of administrative proceedings pending before the Commission. THOMAS EUGENE RAY INDICTED

The Fort Worth Regional Office announced that on September 29, in Alexandria, Louisiana, Judge Nauman Scott accepted a plea of guilty from Thomas E. Ray of Stonewall, Louisiana, to one felony count each of securities and mail fraud. The remaining counts of a five-count indictment charging securities fraud, mail fraud and interstate transportation of stolen property, returned on July 21, will be dismissed at the time of sentencing, which has been set for October 19.

The indictment charged that during 1981 Ray raised at least \$500,000 from public investors through the sale of fractional undivided working interests in oil and gas leases issued by Southeastern Exploration Company, Inc., of Shreveport, Louisiana. At least \$54,000 was raised from public investors for wells that were never drilled. (U.S. v. Thomas Eugene Ray, W.D. La., CR-83-50026-01). (LR-10158)

ACQUISITIONS OF SECURITIES

Companies and individuals must report to the Commission within ten days on Schedule 13D if after the acquisition of equity securities of a public company their beneficial interest therein exceeds five percent. Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1). Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
