ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

PRUDENTIAL-BACHE SECURITIES, INC., OTHERS CITED

The Commission instituted administrative proceedings, under Sections 15(b) and 19(h) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, against Prudential-Bache Securities, Inc., Richard Saccullo and William Bruce Schaefer. The proceedings concern a free-riding scheme involving the common stock of various issuers and the manipulation of the common stock of Conner Homes Corporation. Simultaneously with the institution of the proceedings, the respondents submitted Offers of Settlement consenting, without admitting or denying the Commission's findings, to the Order which makes certain findings and orders various sanctions.

Under their Offers of Settlement: Bache was censured and agreed to review its credit procedure and adopt and maintain any further policies and procedures deemed appropriate to prevent unlawful extensions of credit; Saccullo was suspended from acting in a supervisory or managerial capacity with any regulated entity for 30 days; Schaefer was barred from serving as a supervisor, manager, officer, director or principal with any regulated entity, suspended from association with any regulated entity for 60 days, and prohibited for 12 months from acting as a registered representative for any account beneficially owned or controlled by Sidney Popkin. CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

SIDNEY POPKIN ENJOINED

The Commission filed a complaint for injunctive and other equitable relief in the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia against Sidney Popkin, of Jackson-ville, North Carolina. The complaint alleges violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the antifraud, manipulation, credit and beneficial ownership reporting provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Without admitting or denying the allegations in the complaint, Popkin consented to the Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction restraining and enjoining him from further violations of the aforesaid provisions.

The complaint alleges that from about January 1981 through August 1981 Popkin executed a fraudulent scheme to: amass and maintain a large portfolio of securities without meeting his obligation to pay for such securities; and artificially inflate the price of Conner Homes Corporation common stock in order to profit from the resale of such stock and to increase buying power in margin securities accounts holding such stock. INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

CRESTLINE INVESTMENT COMPANY, INC.

(DWR), the Funds' investment manager. The application requests an order: (1) exempting World Wide (and any other funds for which DWR may now or in the future serve as investment adviser or principal underwriter) from the provisions of Sections 2(a)(32), 2(a)(35), 22(c), and 22(a) of the Investment Company Act and Rule 22d-1 to permit them to assess a contingent deferred sales charge on certain redemptions of their shares, and to waive that charge for redemptions following the death or disability of a shareholder and redemptions for certain distributions from an Individual Retirement Account or other qualified retirement plan; and (2) permitting exchanges of shares between the Funds without imposition of the charge.
